## GULFSTREAM DENIED FULL-CARD

SIMULCASTING Gulfstream Park will be unable to offer patrons full-card simulcasting during its upcoming meet, which begins January 3, 1996, after the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering failed to grant the track permission to do so. Gulfstream first petitioned the Division to approve full-card simulcasting August 11, but the request was denied without a hearing. Gulfstream then petitioned the First District Court and the court ruled the Division must show cause why Gulfstream should not be granted a hearing. The Division's response to the court asked that no action be taken on Gulfstream's request for a hearing until the Division conducts a "fact finding" hearing January 17 that could result in the promulgation of rules regarding full-card simulcasting. If the court goes along with the Division's request, then it is likely that the additional administrative proceedings will prevent Gulfstream from the opportunity of instituting full-card simulcasting. During the experiment with full-card simulcasting at Calder, purses, revenue to the state, wagering and track profit all increased. According to Gulfstream President and Chief Executive Officer Douglas Donn, "Gulfstream will continue to aggressively pursue every legal means of seeking full-card simulcasting." Should Gulfstream's efforts in attempting to obtain simulcasting fail, the track will simulcast the two races per day that are currently permitted by the Division.

## NEW YORK OTB MAY DROP GULFSTREAM

SIMULCASTS Unwilling to meet the price Gulfstream Park was seeking for the right to simulcast its 1996 meet, the six off-track betting districts in New York are set to drop the popular simulcasts from South Florida. "I don't give it any shot. We won't be taking Gulfstream," said New York City OTB President Allie Sherman. OTB was willing to pay only two percent of total handle for the product and rejected Gulfstream's counter offer of either 2.25 percent for two years or two percent in 1996 and 2.5 percent in 1997. "Based on the competitive rates of other jurisdictions, based on the amount of money they would be making and based on the quality of the product we offer, it's an extremely favorable deal," said Gulfstream President and CEO Doug Donn. According to Sherman, OTB will offer racing from Tampa Bay Downs and Suffolk Downs in the place of Gulfstream. New York OTB customers wagered \$1.5 million a day on Gulfstream last year, making OTB Gulfstream's single biggest simulcast customer.

Monday, Santa Anita:

SAN GABRIEL H.-GII, \$125,000a, 4yo/up, 1 1/8mT Virginia Carnival (Carnivalay), victimized by a nightmarish trip in the GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 26, will attempt to rebound in Monday's San Gabriel. The three-year-old, winner of the GIII Bay Meadows Derby Oct. 14, has changed owners and trainers three times this year and is currently owned by John Franks and conditioned by Jack Van Berg. Romarin (Braz) (Itajara {Braz}), the 119-pound highweight, drilled a half-mile in a bullet: 46 2/5 over Hollywood's fast main track vesterday. The five-year-old is winless in four starts since taking the GII Early Times Turf Classic S. at Churchill Downs May 6. Also working for the San Gabriel Thursday was GII American H. winner Silver Wizard (Silver Hawk), who breezed six furlongs in 1:13 4/5 at Hollywood; GIII All American H. winner Bluegrass Prince (Ire) (Bluebird), who went a half-mile in :49 4/5 (dogs up) over Santa Anita's turf course; and GII Bay Meadows H. winner Caesour (Nureyev), who breezed five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 over Santa Anita's main track. Also probable for the GII event are Caherdaniel (Tank's Prospect), Inner City (Ire) (Bob Back) and Saltgrass (Woodman). Anchor (Polish Navy) is considered possible for the race.


