LUKAS RUNNERS RETURN TO WORKTAB D.

Wayne Lukas, the nation's leading money-earning trainer in 1996 with more than \$15.9 million in purses, sent three of his stable's stars through drills over Santa Anita's muddy training track Monday. Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Boston Harbor (Capote), fresh off a vacation at Lukas's Westerly Training Center, was sent through a half-mile breeze in :52 4/5. It was his first official work since capturing the \$1 million race at Woodbine Oct. 26. Belmont S. winner Editor's Note (Forty Niner), who is likely to make his four-year-old debut in the GI \$500,000 Strub S. Feb. 2, breezed a half-mile in :50 2/5. The Overbrook Farm runner had not been to the track since finishing 12th in the Oct. 26 Breeders' Cup Classic. Sharp Cat (Storm Cat), impressive winner of the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 14, covered a halfmile in :49 3/5 in preparation for the \$100,000a Santa Ysabel S. at 1 1/16-miles Jan. 11. Tuesday, Lukas sent Just a Cat (Storm Cat) through a fivefurlong stroll over the Santa Anita training track in 1:04 2/5. The just-turned three-year-old was purchased privately for nearly \$2 million by Michael Tabor after posting a neck victory over Jules in Aqueduct's GII Cowdin S. Breeders' Cup day, Oct. 26.

SWINBURN PREPARING FOR CHARITY WALK

Three-time Epsom Derby winning jockey Walter Swinburn is currently preparing for a walk across Ireland in aid of a children's charity. The 35-year-old rider, so seriously injured in a fall at Hong Kong's Sha Tin race-course last February that doctors feared for his life, will begin his trek at the Silver Springs Hotel in County Cork next Monday. The walk, which will end in Dublin, is expected to take 14 days. Swinburn said, "I am so grateful to be alive that I want to do something to show it." The Newmarket-based jockey, whose Derby victories came aboard Shergar (1981), Shahrastani (1986) and Lammtarra (1995), added that his personal wish for the New Year is "to remain injury free so that I can ride out the turf season without interruption."

In his last two outings, the chestnut horse won a Suffolk Downs allowance Nov. 3 and the Governors Cup H. at Remington Park Nov. 23. Back on the East Coast here and moving up in class, Cimarron Secret rose to the challenge, rallying from last to first in the eight-horse field for his first graded stakes triumph. "He ships around real well," said winning trainer James Hartley. "We took him from Boston to Oklahoma and here to Gulfstream. I use my own rig (van). He's used to it. He gets a little worked up on a big van with a lot of horses. He's run here before and I brought him over to work a couple of weeks ago, and he did real well. I wasn't concerned about him handling the track, but I didn't know if he'd be up to the company. We'll look at the good races at Gulfstream. The Donn? That would be nice." 6-5 favorite JAMIES FIRST PUNCH (Fit to Fight) made a bid to challenge the leaders three wide on the far turn but then gave way to be fifth.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

AVE'S FLAG (Personal Flag--Ave Maria {Ger}, by Experte {Ger})

One would think that a son of Personal Ensign's full-brother Personal Flag and a German-bred mare would be an absolute outcross. However, Saturday's GIII Gallant Fox H. winner, Ave's Flag, proves that isn't necessarily the case. To start with, War Admiral appears on the "zig-zag" of both the sire and dam of Personal Flag, and of Ave Maria. The source in the pedigree of Ave Maria is Iron Liege, the broodmare sire of her sire, Experte. Winner of the Kentucky Derby for Calumet Farm, Iron Liege was later taken to stand in France by Marcel Boussac, and it was there he sired Esclave (Fr), dam of Experte and another top German runner, Esclavo (Fr). Iron Liege is particularly interesting in the context of this pedigree as he is a half-brother to Iron Reward, dam of Kentucky Derby winner Swaps, who appears here as sire of the second dam of Private Account (sire of Personal Flag). The connections don't end there, either. Personal Flag's grandam, Dorine, is inbred to 3x3 to Fair Trial and his three-parts sister, Riot, and her sire, Aristophanes, is rather closely related to Fair Trial's son, Petition, the grandsire of Experte. Ave's Flag has strains from all over the globe--North America, South America, Germany, France and England--close up in his pedigree, but ironically, the key to his ability might be the common threads, not the diversity of their sources.
