AKSARBEN TO CLOSE AKsarben in Omaha, Nebraska will be closing after the Douglas County Board, which purchased the racetrack in May, 1992, voted Tuesday by a 6-1 margin to sell the northern 140 acres of the track and its surrounding area to First Data Resources, according to the *Daily Racing Form*. First Data, a company which processes one-third of the country's credit card transactions, plans to join with the University of Nebraska to begin construction in May or June on a campus that will provide room for the new information science and engineering programs to be offered by the university. The plan calls for the removal of the barns and racetrack this spring in order to make room for a high-tech office park and educational campus. It is likely that Don Everett, a Lincoln, Nebraska owner and restaurateur who offered \$30 million to buy AKsarben and leave room for the proposed campus, will file a lawsuit challenging the legality of the transaction. AKsarben did not host a live meet in 1996, largely due to a projected operating deficit of \$1.6 million. A critical blow to the effort to resuscitate the meet for 1997 occurred in the November election, when an amendment that would have legalized off-track betting was defeated by nearly 100,000 votes. Many nationally recognized horses have competed at AKsarben over the years, including Horse of the Year Black Tie Affair (Ire), Timeless Native, Gate Dancer, Dispersal, Irish Swap and Who Doctor Who, who won 21 stakes over the Omaha oval. The 1997 Nebraska racing season is slated to begin Feb. 14, when Fonner Park begins a 39-day run through May 4. State Fair Park at Lincoln (May 17-July 13) and Columbus (July 19-Sept. 1) will split the dates that traditionally had been assigned to AKsarben.

Favored Rainbow Blues lived up to the crowd's expectations here, settling in mid-pack through six furlongs, angling outside nearing the stretch, splitting rivals in midstretch and rallying late for a 3/4-length triumph. The newly-turned four-year-old, a year younger than any of his San Gabriel rivals, had shown good form previously on two continents. In his native Ireland, he won the listed Blenheim S. at two and finished second in the G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas and G3 Tetrarch S. at The Curragh in 1996. The bay colt commenced his U.S. campaign last September and promptly won the GII Del Mar Invitational Derby before going on to finish third in the GII Volante H. and second in the GI Hollywood Derby. "We got a good trip," said winning jockey Gary Stevens, who was paired with Rainbow Blues for the first time. "(Trainer) Charlie (Whittingham) told me he was a push button-type horse and that he loved to chase horses. That was him to a tee. We got a great trip, got out at the head of the stretch. He put in a heck of a stretch run. Horses started coming at him from the outside and gave us a little bit of a scare, but he dug down and found another gear." Immediately following the race, Stevens left for the heliport at Arcadia Methodist Hospital, where he was scheduled to take a helicopter to Los Angeles Airport. From the airport, the jockey was to catch a 5:15 p.m. flight to Saudi Arabia, where he will ride in Friday's \$1.4 million Crown Prince Cup at Riyadh Equestrian Club for Prince Ahmed Salman's Thoroughbred Corp.

Reach the Top, winner of the GIII Selima S. over Laurel's main track Nov. 3, had been victorious in her only prior turf start--a maiden special weight at Belmont Oct. 3. Eighth in the GII Demoiselle on the dirt in her most recent outing Nov. 30, the bay filly returned to the grass here and flourished, rallying from eighth to win by a neck under jockey Jose Santos. "She had won her only start on turf," said winning trainer Mary Eppler. "She's a sister to Grab the Green, who won the Black Helen a few years back (1992). But this filly can run on dirt, too. It turned out that she had a little shin problem when she ran so poorly in the Demoiselle. We'll nominate her to all the good turf stakes at Gulfstream, and if they come off, she can go on the main track." Even-money favorite ASCUTNEY (Lord At War {Arg}), winner of the GIII Miesque S. over the Hollywood turf Nov. 29, prompted the pace for six furlongs then stopped badly, fading to be 12th and last.

Local News, Suffolk Downs:

Herbie Hinojosa, at age 60, has taken out his jockey's license after about three years on the sidelines. Hinojosa, who has ridden 3,320 winners, was the pilot aboard Massachusetts H. winner Crimson Satan in 1961. "I worked a few this week," said Hinojosa New Year's Day. "I'm trying to get the soreness out. I tell you, it's tough." After training a small string of horses at Charles Town Races in West Virginia recently, Hinojosa said he decided to move back to Boston, where he has family. "I've got lots of friends here and that helps," he said. "There aren't too many young jockeys here that I don't know. I've worked with young riders before. The main thing I would try to show them is how to rate a horse and stay out of trouble. You can do so much when you keep a race in front of you and see what develops."

At 12-1 odds, You'renotlistening was sent off the second longest shot in this seven-horse field, and with good reason. The chestnut mare, second in a six-furlong Aqueduct allowance in her last outing Dec. 20, had not visited the winner's circle in 10 starts since taking a \$50,000 claimer at Belmont June 7, and had never before competed against stakes company. She was undaunted by the assignment, however, and rallied from the back of the pack along the rail to win under jockey Richard Migliore. "What a pleasant surprise," said winning trainer Gasper Moschera. "I figured this race would be tough for my filly, especially with LOTTSA TALC (Talc) in the field. She was very sound coming into this race and she really kicked in late down the stretch. She ran a real good race." Millionairess Lottsia Talc, sent off the 8-5 favorite, was never a factor, finishing sixth.

AUSTRALIAN STAKES RESULT:

Twenty-to-one outsider **Time Frame (Aus)** (Sovereign Slipper) caused a shock in today's G2 Perth Cup, beating another outsider, **Regimental Tattoo** (Warring Nations), by a length with the 7/2 favorite **Beau Heed (Aus)** (Serheed) a length and a half away in third. The eight-year-old gave jockey Dennis Gundry the perfect send-off to Singapore, where he will ride for former Western Australian trainer Trevor Andrews. "I didn't think he could win, but he's the toughest and the most honest horse in the race," said Gundry, who nearly missed the ride after injuring a foot in the previous race when his mount crushed him against the side of the starting stalls. Time Frame has now won nine races for trainer Angela Smith.

NEW ZEALAND STAKES RESULTS:

AUCKLAND CUP-G1, \$244,755, Ellerslie, New Zealand, 1-1, 2mT

Australian-trained stayer **Yobro (Aus)** (Gypsy Kingdom {Aus}) caused a 20/1 shock when he won Wednesday's Auckland Cup. A six-year-old gelding trained in Sydney by Kirk Roberts, Yobro, who won the G3 Kingston Town S. over two miles in Sydney last September, now has the Melbourne Cup as his ultimate goal this year. Ridden by jockey Grant Cooksley, Yobro won by a long neck from **Interval (NZ)** (Paris Opera {Aus}), with the favorite **Regal Chief (NZ)** (All Glory {NZ}) third, a length-and-a-quarter further back. Roberts said he would not be tempted to run the gelding again in the G1 Wellington Cup in New Zealand Jan. 25 and will now rest him. "It's really the wrong time of the year for him," he said. "This horse seems to peak in the summer time and we'll probably have a crack at the Melbourne Cup now."

RAILWAY H.-G1, \$139,860, Ellerslie, New Zealand, 1-1, 6fT

A late change of flight plans enabled New Zealand jockey Lisa Cropp to arrive in her native country just in time to partner the Graham Richardson-trained **Kailey (NZ)** (Festal {Aus}) to win the G1 Railway H. Wednesday. Cropp had originally planned on arriving a day later, but she decided to travel back home a day early from Singapore, where she has been riding. It was a lucky move. Cropp rode on the Singapore-Malaysia circuit for most of last year and rode 74 winners, just missing out on the jockeys' championship. This was a perfect wedding present for her, as she has returned to New Zealand to marry Mark Thompson, son of Sydney trainer Vic Thompson, Jan. 12. Kailey, who was giving her trainer his very first Group 1 success, will now be aimed at the G1 \$106,187 Telegraph H. over six furlongs at Trentham in Wellington Jan. 18.

Local News, Ireland:

Following the initiative of its sponsor, The Aga Khan, the G1 National S. in Ireland Sept. 21 will be raised in distance from seven furlongs to a mile. The change was recently approved by the European Pattern Race Committee, which, at the same time, reduced the distance of the G3 Futurity S., run in Ireland at the end of August, from one mile to seven furlongs. Europe's richest juvenile race at 200,000 Irish pounds, the National S. is run at The Curragh. Other changes to the Irish Pattern were the promotion of the listed MacDonagh Boland S. to Group 3 status, and the demotion of the G3 Curragh S. to listed.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

HIDDEN LAKE (f, 4, Quiet American--Friendly Circle, by Round Table)

Although she has previously shown some very smart form, including when Grade I-placed, Hidden Lake had never won a black-type event until taking the GII La Brea S. at Santa Anita Sunday. Hidden Lake's sire, Quiet American, is an intensely bred horse, his pedigree showing Dr. Fager 3x2 and Cequillo 4x3, the pair coming via the three-parts brother and sister Killaloe and Demure. With regard to that pattern, there are a couple of pedigree points to note. First, Cequillo is a daughter of Princequillo and Hidden Lake is out of a mare by Round Table, a son of Princequillo. Secondly, Dr. Fager is inbred 3x4 to Bull Dog, and Hidden Lake's second dam is by Reneged, who is inbred 3x3 to Bull Dog's brother, Sir Gallahad III. When we meet a sire or dam with close inbreeding, it so often seems that they work well with a mating which picks up strains immediately behind that close inbreeding.
