### ARLINGTON STAKES SCHEDULE CUT

This year's stakes program at Arlington International Racecourse has been cut back by more than \$1.65 million so that overnight purses can be increased for the track's 1997 meeting. Arlington has submitted to the Illinois Racing Board a stakes schedule for its 119-day season, which begins May 11, that offers 13 fewer stakes than during the 134-day season in 1996. The majority of the stakes money will be available for overnight races due to the fact that, understandably, Arlington will not run a second edition of the \$1 million Citation Challenge, a special event created for superstar Cigar last year. Also withdrawn were three Grade III events, the Sea O'Erin H., Laurance Armour H. and Swoon's Son H. The International Festival of Racing, usually held on two days, will instead feature three Grade I races, the Arlington Million, Beverly D. and Secretariat S., on Sunday, August 24. Purses for the three legs of the Mid-America Triple, the Secretariat, Arlington Classic and American Derby, have been reduced a total of \$275,000. Twenty-four added-money events, 17 of them graded, and \$4.35 million in purses will be offered on this year's stakes schedule.

### MAHOGANY HALL TO STAND AT DARBY DAN

Woodlynn Farm's Mahogany Hall (Woodman), winner of the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga this past August over champion Serena's Song and Canadian Horses of the Year Peaks and Valleys and Mt. Sassafra, has been retired from racing and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Darby Dan Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. A winner of six of 20 starts for earnings of \$694,913, Mahogany Hall also placed in the GI Suburban H., GI Gulfstream Park H., GI Brooklyn H., GI Blue Grass S. and GI Saratoga Cup. In his final career start Oct. 26 at Woodbine, he finished 10th in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Six-year-old Mahogany Hall will stand for a 1997 stud fee of \$5,000, live foal, payable Oct. 1 of year bred, and is currently in the process of being syndicated.

### SOUTH AFRICAN COLT PREPARES TO MAKE HISTORY

Owners Laurie and Jean Jaffee hope that their four-year-old colt **London News (SAf)** (Bush Telegraph {SAf}) will become the first South African horse to campaign outside the country in 50 years by competing in the Dubai World Cup this March. The joint 1995/96 Horse of the Year, trained by Alec Laird, is in the lineup for today's G1 Queen's Plate over a mile at Kenilworth in South Africa. His main rival is another four-year-old, **Ashtontown (SAf)** (Bush Telegraph {SAf}), who comes from the stable of champion trainer David Ferraris. These two will face 15 opponents in the Queen's Plate, but they are expected to dominate the finish of the race. Early betting has made the pair 2-1 joint favorites, with the next horse in the betting, **Harmony Forever (SAf)** (Foveros {GB}), at 6-1. The Queen's Plate is given additional international flavor with the presence on London News' back of international jockey sensation Frankie Dettori, who has taken South Africa by storm since arriving there last week.

**PINCAY NOTCHES NUMBER 8,500** Hall of Fame jockey Laffit Pincay Jr., just turned 50, reached another career milestone at Santa Anita Thursday when he steered his 8,500th winner under the wire. Second only to Bill Shoemaker as the country's all-time leading rider, Pincay guided Tacomolly (Relaunch) to victory in the day's seventh race; he is now 333 victories behind Shoemaker's record of 8,833. "It feels great," said the veteran reinsman. "I'm getting closer." Pincay will have his quest for the record delayed shortly; he begins serving a five-day suspension January 8.

### GODOLPHIN ENTERS 37 FOR 1998 EPSOM

**DERBY** According to yesterday's *Racing Post*, the powerful Godolphin stable has, for the first time, entered yearlings for the Epsom Derby, nominating 37 for the 1998 edition of the race. Included in the number are six by Sadler's Wells, and a yearling by Caerleon out of Epsom and Irish Oaks winner Unite (Ire). Hamdan al Maktoum owns the most entries for the 1998 classic with 45, followed by the Aga Khan with 39. A total of 548 yearlings were nominated at this early stage, six fewer than for the 1997 renewal and the lowest number since 1991.

### TOTAL HANDLE INCREASES AT HAWTHORNE

Hawthorne Race Course concluded its 1996 Thoroughbred season Tuesday with gains in total handle and a slight drop in on-track figures. Live and full-card wagering showed a daily average handle of \$3,575,861 for the 66-day meet, up 3.87 percent from a year ago. Total money wagered on-track dipped by just 1 percent from \$509,715 in 1995 to \$504,477 in 1996. Out-of-state wagering on Hawthorne's signal rose 21.7 percent to \$1,394,726; the increase can be attributed partly to the presence of additional simulcast outlets. Horsemen enjoyed a 10-percent purse increase during the final 10 days of the meeting. Mark Guidry won the jockey's crown for the third consecutive year with 104 wins. Defending champion Richard Hazelton took the trainer's title with 31 victories. The Chicago-area racing circuit moves next to Sportsman's Park, which opens Feb. 14.
