STRONG OPENING AT KEENENLAND

JANUARY The 5-year-old MGSW mare Igotrhythm (Dixieland Band) topped yesterday's opening session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent, Igotrhythm brought a final bid of \$710,000 from Chester Broman, owner of 270-acre Chestertown Farm in Chestertown, NY. "I didn't see too much wrong with her," Broman said of Igotrhythm. "She looks close to being perfect." The mare will go to Hedgewood Farm in Lexington, Ky to be bred and then she'll be taken to Chestertown Farm to have the foal. In all, 257 horses were sold in the first session for a total of \$9,628,800. The gross is up 65 percent from last year's aggregate of \$5,837,700 when 250 horses were sold. The open-session average of \$37,466 is up 60 percent from last year's average of \$23,351. The four-day sale continues through Thursday.

JACK KENT COOKE TO DISPERSE AT

KEENELAND Sports and business mogul Jack Kent Cooke announced yesterday that he will completely disperse his Thoroughbred racing and breeding stock at Keeneland during 1997. The Virginia resident will sell approximately 140 horses; his 500-acre Elmendorf Farm near Lexington, Kentucky is also up for sale. Cooke's two-year-olds and horses of racing age will be sold in April; his yearlings will be offered in July and September, while broodmares, weanlings and stallion shares will sell in November. Cooke, who has been involved in sports for more than 40 years, is the current owner of the Washington Redskins football team, and is building a \$200-million stadium for the team in Rajon, Maryland, a suburb of Washington, D.C. He also owns the *Los Angeles Daily News* and the Chrysler Building in New York. In racing since 1980, Cooke purchased Elmendorf in 1984, and has since raced such top homebred as 1996 MGSW Antepend and MGSW Flying Continental.

RECORD YEARLING DIES The colt whose \$1.4-million price tag set a Keeneland September yearling sale record last year was euthanized after suffering a severe case of laminitis. The Gone West--Existentialist colt was purchased by bloodstock agent Buzz Chace for Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm and was being prepared for Barretts March 2-year-olds in training sale at Bob Scanlon's Sunnyside Farm near Ocala, Florida. The colt was sent to the University of Florida veterinary center at Gainesville where he was put down January 3.

STALLION ACCESS SALE TONIGHT Stallion Access will conduct their January Sale of Selected Seasons and Shares at Newton Paddocks in Lexington tonight, with bidding set to begin at 7:30 p.m. Featured among the 91 lots are 1997 seasons in such sires as Cozzene, Broad Brush, Danzig, Kris S., Miswaki, Mt. Livermore and Rubiano. For the convenience of buyers, Stallion Access will offer bid-by-phone accommodations. Last year, 57 seasons and 11 shares sold at the January Stallion Access Sale, bringing a total of \$1,109,700.

JIM KEEFER DEAD Veteran Churchill Downs conditioner Jim Keefer died Sunday at Caritas Medical Center of a heart attack after being hospitalized earlier due to emphysema. Keefer, a native of Somerset, Texas and a veteran of the Korean War, initially trained quarter horses but switched to thoroughbreds in 1958. During his career, Keefer accumulated nine Churchill stakes wins from 1975 through 1996. His most recent Downs's stakes victory was a 21-1 upset by Global View in the fall meet's Iroquois for 2-year-olds. Facing declining health, Keefer turned his eight-horse stable over to trainer Lynn Whiting in December. Visitation will be at O.D. White Funeral Home in Louisville, Ky Jan. 7 from 3 PM to 8 PM. A memorial service will be held beginning at 8 PM on Tuesday. Contributions may be made to the American Lung Association or the American Heart Association.

HELISSIO FOR DUBAI WORLD CUP According to a report in the *Racing Post*, the 1996 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King) is to be aimed at the \$4 million Dubai World Cup in the Gulf on March 29. Helissio is expected to leave trainer Elie Lellouche's stable for the warm Dubai climate on January 14 with his stable companion, Joselito. Owner Enrique Sarasola's racing manager Bruno Ridoux said: "We obviously hope he will run well in the Dubai World Cup, but whatever happens, he will benefit from a winter in the sun. If all goes well and he runs in Dubai, he will bypass the Prix Ganay and go directly to the Coronation Cup at Epsom in June." Helissio won six of his eight starts in 1996, beaten only in the French Derby and the Japan Cup, when he dead-heated for third place behind Canadian International winner and Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up Singpiel.

DON CLIPPINGER AND TOM KEYSER EARN MEDIA ECLIPSE AWARDS Don Clippinger, managing editor of the *Thoroughbred Times*, and Tom Keyser, horse racing writer for the *Baltimore Sun*, have been honored with the 1996 Eclipse Awards for outstanding writing. Clippinger earned the Eclipse for Outstanding Achievement in Magazine Writing for his story "Focusing on the Big Picture: How TV Relates to Racing," which appeared in the March/April issue of the *Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred*. Honorable mentions in the category went to *Thoroughbred Daily News* contributor John Lee for two stories, "Running for the Roses" and "Cigar!," published in *Cigar Aficionado*; and John P. Sparkman for his *Thoroughbred Times* story "Courage in the Desert." Keyser took the award for Outstanding Achievement in Newspaper Writing for his overall excellence in the coverage of Thoroughbred racing during the year; judges reviewed three samples of Keyser's work, stories on horse intelligence, racing at Saratoga and Cigar's farewell appearance at Churchill Downs. Honorable mentions for newspaper writing went to Cindy Mullaney for her *Daily Racing Form* entry "Rose Hamburger's Love of Racing," Gary West for "Remembering a Lone Star Legend" and Tracy Gantz for the five-part series "Racing in the West."

AKSARBEN OAKS MOVES TO REMINGTON

PARK The Gill AKSArben Oaks, last run at the Nebraska track in 1995, will move to Remington Park in 1997, and the North American Graded Stakes Committee announced yesterday that the event will retain its graded status for this year's edition. It will be the first graded Thoroughbred stakes to be run at the Oklahoma track. "We are going to do everything we can to make sure we keep this grade and hopefully earn other graded races in the future," said Remington's Director of Racing and Racing Secretary Mike Anifantis. Due to the cancellation of live racing at AKSArben, executives at both AKSArben and Remington made a formal request to have the race moved while keeping its Gill designation. The 1997 AKSArben Oaks will be run Saturday, July 26, with a purse of \$100,000 for three-year-old fillies going a mile and a sixteenth.

AUSTRALIAN STRIKE CONTINUES With no compromise in site, the jockeys' strike in Australia looks set to continue indefinitely. While the jockeys are insisting on \$52-dollar riding fee increase, racing authorities have fined many of the senior riders for not taking the mounts for which they were booked last Saturday. In New South Wales, the Australian Jockey Club fined riders \$396 for each ride they refused to take at Randwick in Sydney. John Marshall, on the committee of the New South Wales Jockeys Association, said: "We've been trying to get this issue heard for 12 months and have been put off each time, so we decided to take this drastic action." The AJC's Executive Officer Tony King said: "I am disappointed that the jockeys have taken the action that they have. I still hope that common sense will prevail and that we can settle this matter without further industrial disruption." The Gold Coast Club in Queensland was forced to abandon the first day of the prestigious Magic Millions Carnival when not enough riders were available.

Local News: Sam Houston

Total handle at Sam Houston Race Park, which ended its 1996 fall season December 15, showed gains for the third consecutive year. A total of \$49,055,991 was wagered during the fall meet at the Houston track; the daily average of \$1,114,908 was up 45 percent from the 1995 fall meeting. The most significant rise came in handle on Sam Houston's races by simulcast outlets around the country; about 100 outlets received the Sam Houston signal, and the handle from those sources accounted for a daily average of \$953,733, up from \$571,367 in 1995. But on-track handle on the live card was down 15 percent, from \$190,376 in 1995 to \$161,174 in 1996. The daily average attendance, 3,281, was nearly identical to the 1995 figure of 3,289. Steve Bourque led all jockeys with 51 wins, while Doris Hebert led the trainer standings with 26 victories. Hebert also led all owners, picking up 15 wins with his colorbearers. Sam Houston's 1997 season opens January 9.
