TEAM CIGAR ADDS TO ECLIPSE

named the top older horse for the second consecutive year vesterday, once again led his team to a sweep of the Eclipse Awards for champion owner, trainer and jockey. Owner Allen Paulson, trainer Bill Mott and jockey Jerry Bailey, Eclipse winners in 1995, repeated in their respective divisions as well, and the team is hoping to take down a second Horse of the Year title. The only horse considered to have any chance of usurping the throne is 1996 three-year-old champion Skip Away (Skip Trial), who bested Cigar in the Jockey Club Gold Cup to end his stellar season. But trainer Sonny Hine was realistic about his colt's chances, saving, "(Skip Away) beat everybody at least once, but Cigar had the publicity--we didn't get a parade for our horse. Cigar was great for racing--even I was thrilled when he won the Cup in Dubai. If we finish second to him, which we probably will, I'll be thrilled to be that close." Skip Away, in training at Gulfstream, will make his four-yearold debut in the Donn H. February 8, and then could run in the Gulfstream Park H. March 1 or head to California for the first leg of MGM Grand Classic Crown series, the Santa Anita H. March 2. "We've had him relaxed; he's been working slow, but we'll turn the burners on Saturday," said Hine. The closest vote came in the category of male turf horse, with Canadian International winner and Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up Singspiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) beating out Fastness (Ire) (Rousillon), 22.5 points to 15 points. The three voting blocks cast their ballots as follows: Daily Racing Form--Singspiel-30 votes, Fastness-25, Pilsudski (GB) (Polish Precedent)-23; National Turf Writers Association -- Fastness-34, Singspiel-31, Diplomatic Jet (Roman Diplomat)-30; Thoroughbred Racing Associations--Singspiel and Diplomatic Jet-7 each, Mecke (Maudlin)-5. The other equine divisional winners were: two-year-old male--Boston Harbor (Capote); two-year-old filly--Storm Song (Summer Squall); three-year-old filly--Yanks Music (Air Forbes Won); older female--Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint); sprinter--Lit de Justice (El Gran Senor); female turf horse--Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan); and steeplechaser--Correggio (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Farnsworth Farms of Ocala, Florida picked up their first Eclipse as the top breeder, and Neil Poznansky was honored as top apprentice jockey. The 1996 Horse of the Year will be announced at the Eclipse Awards Dinner, Tuesday, February 4 at the Bal Harbour Beach Resort.

KEENELAND FINAL DAY RESULTS The five-year-old mare Forever Cherokee (Cherokee Colony) brought a final bid of \$170,000 from Walnut Green Bloodstock to top yesterday's final session of Keeneland's 1997 January Horses of All Ages Sale. Consigned by Charles Woodson Ham II, agent, Forever Cherokee is an earner of \$110,386 and placed in the GII Fantasy S. as a three-year-old. The final session of the auction saw 227 horses sold for \$2,306,100, an average of \$10,159. In total, 1,003 horses were sold at the four-day sale for a sum of \$24,042,300, down 20.5 percent from the 1996 sale when 994 horses were sold for \$30,256,400. The 1997 average of \$23,970 was down 21.3 percent from last year's average of \$30,439.

CATALOG SET FOR OBS CALDER SALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company has catalogued 212 juveniles, headed by a large consignment from 1996 Eclipse Award-winning breeder Farnsworth Farms, for its Selected Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, to be held at Calder Race Course in Miami Feb. 11, 1997. The year's first sale of juveniles annually produces a high percentage of major stakes-winners. With newly crowned champions Skip Away (Skip Trial) and Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint) leading the way, OBS-Calder graduates accounted for 25 graded stakes-victories in 1996. Skip Away and Jewel Princess join Cherokee Run (Runaway Groom) and Gilded Time (Timeless Moment) as the most recent Calder graduates to win Eclipse Awards. All Chatter (Phone Trick), Just a Cat (Storm Cat) and Traitor (Cryptoclearance) came out of the 1996 Calder sale to win graded stakes as two-year-olds, joining previous Calder graduates Chaposa Springs (Baldski), Forest Wildcat (Storm Cat), Isitingood (Crusader Sword), Little Miss Fast (Premiership), Marcie's Ensign (Blue Ensign) and Notagoldbrick (Fortunate Prospect) as 1996 graded stakes-winners. In all, 22 Calder graduates won 45 North American stakes races valued at \$40,000 or more in 1996.

NYRA APPOINTMENTS ANNOUNCED New York Racing Association President Terry Mevocks announced Thursday that Alec Ingle, currently the company's Chief Financial Officer, will also assume the duties of Assistant to the President. "Alec, with his vast experience at Santa Anita, as well as his financial background, will be of great assistance to me and I am happy he agreed to accept the position," said Meyocks. Ingle will delegate some of his current responsibilities, such as those duties pertaining to the accounting department and tracking various forms of income and disbursements, to John Giombarrese, NYRA's Controller, Rich Giancola, in addition to his duties as head of the Internal Audit Department, will now assume the Risk Management responsibilities. In addition, Mary Jean Coscia has been appointed Director of Purchasing, and Susan Padgett will now head the Horsemen's Relations department.

FIRST FOAL FOR MYSTERY STORM The first foal by Mystery Storm (Storm Bird) was born at Hart Farm in Morriston, Florida Jan. 6. Five-year-old Mystery Storm, who stands at Hart Farm for a 1997 fee of \$5,000 live foal, won the GIII Rebel S. and GIII Southwest S. at three and earned \$325,580. His first foal, a filly out of Runnin's Fun (Quack), is a half-sister to the multiple stakes-placed Dance A Go Go (El Raggaas). Runnin's Fun will be bred back to Maria's Mon.

ATLANTIC CITY STAKES MAY MOVE Atlantic

City Racecourse is in the process of revamping its stakes schedule. In order to maintain a competitive purse structure for its summer meet, the New Jersey track is tentatively planning to move two of its three major stakes to Monmouth Park. According to Atlantic City General Manager James Murphy, the GII Matchmaker and the GIII Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup will probably be moving to the Oceanport oval this summer. Also facing an uncertain future is the Atlantic City half of the Caesars Turf Bonus, the GI Caesars International H. run in conjunction with the GII Caesars Palace Turf Championship at Hollywood Park. "It's possible that the Caesars's race could be run at Monmouth and then one of the other two might come back to Atlantic City--we have until the end of the month to finalize the stakes schedule," Murphy said.

RACING CANCELLED AT LAUREL Yesterday's live card at Maryland's Laurel Park was called off due to the snowstorm which hit the East Coast. The track is expected to be back in action this afternoon, with first post at 12:35 p.m.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

We are becoming accustomed to the fact that stallions descending from Raise a Native through Mr. Prospector are crossing well with mares descending from Raise a Native through Majestic Prince, but Chip (f, 4, Norquestor--Big Pride, by Bet Big), who won the GIII First Lady H. at Gulfstream Park Wednesday, has a different twist on the cross. Her sire is a son of Conquistador Cielo (by Mr. Prospector), but rather than having Majestic Prince in the male line, her dam, Big Pride, is by Bet Big, who is out of a Majestic Prince mare. It's also interesting to note that Conquistador Cielo's dam is by Bold Ruler (son of Nasrullah) out of a Turn-to mare, while Chip's third dam, Pilgrim's Pride, is by a son of Turn-to out of a Nasrullah mare.

The 1996 Fasig-Tipton February Two-Year-Olds in Training sales topper Speed World (c, 3, Woodman--Gray Tab, by Zulu Tom) ran off with the G3 Keisei Hai at Nakayama Racecourse, Japan Sunday, scoring by six lengths. Speed World is the product of a very clever pedigree. First, he has Native Dancer 4x4 in positions we are coming to love--the male line of the sire and the zig-zag of the mare. Secondly, he descends in female line to Eclair (ancestress of Blushing Groom and Mill Reef) and has a second cross of Eclair through her son Khaled (in Woodman). Third, he has the sisters Businesslike and Big Event (both daughters of La Troienne). The Big Event strain comes in through The Axe II, whose son, Al Hattab, is sire of Speed World's second dam. Woodman is bred on the same Mr. Prospector/Buckpasser cross as Miswaki, a stallion who works very well with mares by The Axe II and Al Hattab, so perhaps this could be the beginning of a similar trend for Woodman.
