**GOLD FEVER RETIRED TO LANE'S END** Grade I winner **Gold Fever** (Forty Niner) suffered a fractured right front sesamoid during training at Gulfstream Friday morning and will be retired to stud. "He was working a slow three-quarters in 1:14 when the exercise rider felt something and pulled him up near the eighth pole," said trainer Shug McGaughey. The four-year-old will stand at Lane's End Farm in Versailles this season. On the board in 12 of 18 career starts, the Cynthia Phipps colorbearer ended his career with three straight wins, including the GI NYRA Mile at Aqueduct November 30. He also captured the GIII Discovery H. and GIII Riva Ridge S. at three, and the Perpetuate S. at two. His earnings stand at \$480,712. Gold Fever will be syndicated, and a 1997 stud fee has not yet been set.

### GRADE I WINNER FOR PROSPECTORS

**GAMBLE Prospectors Gamble** (Crafty Prospector), who sired 60 winners including 12 two-year-olds in 1996, was represented by his first Grade I winner on New Year's Day, 1997, when the three-year-old filly **Marablue Beauty** went wire-to-wire in the G1 seven-furlong Clasico Ano Nuevo in Puerto Rico; she is now undefeated in five starts. The 12-year-old Prospectors Gamble will stand the 1997 season for a fee of \$6,000, live foal at Pin Oak Stud in Versailles.

**RACING CANCELED AT TURFWAY** Live racing for Friday night, January 10, was called off at Turfway Park due to the cold temperatures and severe wind chill expected in the area. The Racebook at the Florence, Kentucky track remained open for simulcast wagering, and live action should resume today, with first post at 1:00 p.m.

### CORNHUSKER HANDICAP TO PRAIRIE

**MEADOWS** The GIII Cornhusker H., last run in 1995 at AKsarben Racecourse, will move to Iowa's Prairie Meadows racetrack for 1997. The North American Graded Stakes Committee yesterday approved the move, which will allow the race to retain its graded status. The 1997 Cornhusker, for three-year-olds and up at nine furlongs, will be run June 28 for a purse of \$200,000.

**News cont.****JOCKEY FINES WAIVED IN AUSTRALIAN**

**DISPUTE** A major step forward was taken towards settling the Australian jockeys' strike Friday when the Australian Jockey Club in New South Wales decided to quash the fines which had been imposed on those riders who refused to take their booked mounts at race meetings at Randwick and Kembla Grange last weekend. A meeting between New South Wales Racing Minister Richard Face and several leading jockeys paved the way for a moratorium in the riders' pay rise dispute, with the Minister stating that it had only been possible to progress in the talks after the AJC had quashed the fines imposed on the riders. Face told reporters that, as part of the moratorium deal, jockeys would receive an interim pay (exactly how much was not revealed) and there would be a work value study into jockeys' fees. When the AJC committee met the jockeys to consider their appeals against the fines, the jockeys pleaded guilty, but in mitigating circumstances. The AJC accepted their appeals, and will only reprimand the offenders. "The jockeys acted from a genuine belief that nothing was being done to address their concerns," said an AJC spokesman. "In setting aside these fines, however, the committee does so in the expectation that the events of last Saturday will not be repeated." Peace has broken out for the time being and no further strike action is expected in the near future, but the jockeys have yet to reach agreement with the Principal Clubs, and the senior jockeys show no signs of backing down on their demands.
