SADLER'S WELLS COLT MAKES HISTORY IN

AUSTRALIA At the 1997 Magic Millions Yearling Sales on the Gold Coast in Australia Sunday, the first ever Sadler's Wells yearling to be sold "Down Under" was snapped up by trainer Graeme Rogerson for a syndicate of 10 people from Asia, Australia and New Zealand. Consigned by Coolmore Stud, the yearling colt is out of Bell Tower (GB) (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}), winner of the 1000 Guineas Trial in Ireland in 1988. The colt's price was Aus \$250,000 or U.S. \$197,130, which was U.S. \$31,541 short of the top price at the sale last year. Rogerson, who holds training licenses in both New Zealand and Australia, described his purchase as an "athlete" and said, "You don't get a chance to buy these sorts of horses in this part of the world. We thought we would have to pay a lot more money." Duncan Grimley, general manager of Coolmore Stud, New South Wales, added, "I thought his price would be about Aus \$250,000. We are happy that he has found a good trainer." Two more Sadler's Wells yearlings are scheduled to sell at public auction in Australia this year, both at the Inglis Easter Sale in April. These three yearlings by the British/Irish Champion Sire of 1990, 1992, 1993, 1994 and 1995 are expected to be the first of his offspring to be raced in Australia. During the threeday Magic Millions sale, 15 yearlings topped the Aus \$100,000 (U.S. \$78,852) mark and the average sale price was Aus \$41,105 (U.S. \$32,412), up about nine percent from 1996.

PLANS FOR MANDELLA HORSES Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}), a five-time Grade I winner in the U.S., is scheduled to make his eight-year-old debut in the GII \$150,000a San Marcos H. over the Santa Anita turf Jan. 20. "He's looked real good in the mornings," said trainer Richard Mandella. Sandpit has not raced since finishing third behind Mecke in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 25. Mandella also announced plans yesterday for another South American-bred horse in his barn, Gentlemen (Arg) (Robin des Bois). "He'll go in the San Antonio Feb. 2." Mandella said. "After that--if all goes well--he'll either run in the Santa Anita H. and Dubai World Cup or just go straight to Dubai." Gentlemen, a champion in Argentina, has won his last four starts in the U.S., including a nine-length triumph in the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Park Dec. 22. Joining Gentlemen in the GII \$300,000 San Antonio H. will be stablemate Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}), winner of the GI Hollywood Gold Cup last summer.

(March 2) if he'd good enough." Savinio, who earned \$40,000 for running second, became trainer Walter Greenman's first million-dollar horse

The talented and versatile Mecke, a Grade I winner on both turf and dirt, hadn't tried the latter surface in 10 starts since winning the GIII Widener H. over Hialeah's main track March 23, 1996. Sixth in the Gll W.L. McKnight H. at Calder in his last outing Dec. 21, Mecke was one of only four runners kept in this Mac Diarmida field when rain forced the race off the grass. Under jockey Jerry Bailey, who hadn't ridden Mecke since the two teamed up to finish fourth in the GIII Appleton H. over the Gulfstream turf in January, 1996, the bay horse added a seventh graded stakes triumph to his resume. He stalked the leaders through six furlongs in 1:18, then took command and drew clear in the stretch for the victory. "Basically, we could have taken the lead at any time," said winning trainer Manny Tortora, "I just don't know if he's better on the dirt or the grass.' When asked what's next for his multimillionaire, Tortora replied, "We're going to go in the Donn (Feb. 8). I'm going to keep him on the dirt for a while. That's where the money races are, so we might as well go in them. I may run in the Pan American (on the turf March 8) toward the end of the meet. Who knows? I might end up in Dubai. He loves to travel, you know."

Candy Stripes, second in the French 2,000 Guineas in 1985, entered stud in Argentina in 1989 and is the sire of 15 stakes-winners, including Different (Arg), named Champion Older Mare, Mare of the Year and Champion Three-Year-Old Filly in Argentina and winner of the GI Beverly Hills H. on turf and the GI Three Chimneys Spinster S. on dirt in the U.S. in 1996, Candy Stripes has been fully syndicated and will stand for a 1997 stud fee of \$15,000 live foal, due when the foal

GENERAL NEDIYM WINS AUSTRALIA'S MAGIC MILLIONS Odds-on favorite General Nedivm (Nediym {Ire}) won Saturday's six-furlong Aus \$1 million (U.S. \$788,519) Magic Millions S. on the Gold Coast in Australia, and his trainer Bill Mitchell will now aim him at the Golden Slipper, worth Aus \$2 million and run over the same distance at Rosehill in Sydney March 22. If he wins, he will become the first Magic Million winner to take the famous juvenile event, Ridden by Mick Dittman, General Nediym got home a length and a half in front of Special Dane (Danehill). The next scheduled start for General Nediym is the Aus \$100,000 Todman Slipper Trial over six furlongs at Rosehill March 8. "He'll need to win that or finish second at least to justify paying Aus \$100,000 to enter him for the Golden Slipper," said Mitchell. "But I definitely think he will go on to win a Group 1 race one day." General Nediym is the first stakes-winner from the first crop by Nedivm (Ire) (Shareef Dancer), a stakes-winner in France who also excelled as a racehorse in North America, winning the 1990 GIII Rolling Green H. at Golden Gate and placing second in the GI Sword Dancer H. at Belmont Park in 1989.
