OAKLAWN OPENING DELAYED Opening day of the 1997 meet at Oaklawn Park has been pushed back due to a blast of Arctic air which hit the area last week. Originally slated to open today, the Hot Springs oval will now start its season Friday, January 24. "The track, along with the rest of Arkansas, has been frozen all week," said Eric Jackson, Oaklawn's general manager. "Although the track did improve some Wednesday and Thursday, we determined it will not be ready in time for racing on Friday. We met (Thursday) with horsemen, racing officials, track officials and stewards and they were totally unanimous. The horses and track are unready for racing." The stakes scheduled for this weekend, the Dixieland, Dixie Belle and Crabapple, will be run during the new opening weekend, January 24-25.

NEW PRESIDENT FOR TRA Hal Handel, vice president and general manager for racing at the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, is expected to be named the new president of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations at its annual meeting February 3. Handel, who oversees racing at Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands, is currently vice president of the TRA; he will succeed Cliff Goodrich, president and chief operating officer of the Los Angeles Turf Club, which conducts racing at Santa Anita. Goodrich was elected to his two-year term January 27, 1995.

ELECTRIC SOCIETY RETIRED Multiple graded-stakes winner **Electric Society (Ire)** (Law Society), winner of the GII Diana H., GII New York H. and GIII The Very One H., has been retired sound and will be bred to Storm Cat. "We decided that she had nothing more to gain in competing in the early season races," said Andy Smith, racing manager for the six-year-old mare's owner, Gary Tanaka. "She has an excellent pedigree with a first-class race record and deserves a shot at such a good stallion as Storm Cat." Winner of six races and \$443,582, Electric Society, also a stakes winner in France, made her last start December 28, finishing third in the GII La Prevoyante H. at Calder.

DONCASTER TO SPONSOR JUVENILE EVENT

According to a report in yesterday's *Racing Post*, Doncaster Bloodstock Sales will introduce a premier two-year-old event for graduates of its St. Leger Yearling Sales in 1998. The six-furlong contest will be named the Doncaster St. Leger Yearling S.; scheduled for opening day of the Pertemps St. Leger meet, it will offer nearly \$340,000 in purse money, and possibly through a profitable bonus system, and will be second only to the \$500,000 Tattersalls Houghton Sales S. as the richest two-year-old race in Britain. Doncaster chief executive and clerk of the course John Sanderson told the *Racing Post*, "To have a race with this high value on the opening day of the 1998 Pertemps St. Leger meeting...will provide a tremendous boost not only for our race meeting but the St. Leger Yearling Sales as well in a year when the prognosis for central support for prize money is gloomy, to say the least."

RICHARD HAZELTON NAMED UTTA TRAINER OF THE MONTH

Richard Hazelton, who has won more than 4,000 races during more than 40 years as a trainer, has been honored as the United Thoroughbred Trainers of America, Inc. "Trainer of the Month" for December. Hazelton is known as "King Richard" for his fans on the Chicago circuit, where he has earned 20 Sportsman's Park training titles, including the last 17 straight. The 66-year-old horsemen won three major stakes during December, saddling Bonita Meadow to take the Illinois Oaks and Yo Tambien S., and Lenny Last to win the Sun Power S., all at Hawthorne.

DECEMBER COBRA/TDN "SUBSCRIBER OF MONTH" TO D.J. STABLE

D.J. Stable, which just completed a year in which they picked up their 900th lifetime victory with a 36-percent winning figure, has been named the Cobra Golf/*Thoroughbred Daily News* "Subscriber of the Month" for December. Leading owners at the '96 Meadowlands meet, the stable won eight of 22 starts in December alone, completing the month with an 87-percent in-the-money mark. Two-year-old filly Larkwhistle (Silver Deputy), out of D.J. Stable broodmare Find Happiness, also earned a 1996 Sovereign Award during the month. Owned by Leonard and Lois Green and their son, Jon, D. J. Stable has been leading owner at five tracks, and has bred and/or owned over 30 stakes winners. "In a year full of accomplishments, being recognized by our peers as one of the top owners in the country tops the list," said Jon Green. "It's also always nice for owners to be recognized as meaningful contributors in the industry, and we would like to thank Cobra Golf and the TDN for doing so." The Greens will receive a set of King Cobra oversize irons and woods, the nation's leading oversize clubs.

Local News: Monmouth Park

Bob Cicero, who helped introduce the film patrol to Thoroughbred racing, will retire Friday, January 24 after more than 50 years at New Jersey's Monmouth Park. Cicero, 84, first worked at Monmouth as a photographer in 1944, when the track was being rebuilt. "I took the first progress shots (of the construction)," he said. "Everything was just a mound of dirt, and I'd be standing there with Phil Iselin and Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons. Mr. Iselin would point this way and say 'here's the clubhouse' and point the other way to the grandstand." Cicero helped make the film patrol a reality, working with NBC General Manager David Sarnoff and RCA lab experts; he oversaw the introduction of closed-circuit TV at the track in the mid-sixties and helped usher in the simulcast era in the early '90s.

Back in action after eight months on the shelf, the homebred miss stepped onto the turf for the first time as second choice; she shadowed Pure Red through easy fractions over the rain-soaked course, then grabbed the lead late in the stretch and edged clear despite the fact that jockey Gary Stevens dropped his whip nearing the finish.
