RECORD STAKES PROGRAM FOR CHURCHILL DOWNS

Headed by 23 graded events, the 1997 stakes schedule at Churchill Downs' spring and fall meets is the richest in the track's history, offering more than \$6 million in purses. A total of 27 stakes, 13 of them graded, worth \$4.375 million will be featured during the 50-day spring meet April 27-June 29. Ten of 11 added-money events set for the 30-day fall meet, October 27-November 29, are graded races; stakes purses for the meeting total \$1.7 million. The Kentucky Derby Week stakes program will gain one event as the \$100,000-added Mamzelle S., a five-furlong turf race for fillies and mares, joins the seven-furlong La Troienne S. for three-year-old fillies on Thursday, May 1. An additional 11 stakes, worth \$2.6 million, will be run during Derby Week, which will be highlighted by the \$1 million GI Kentucky Derby and the \$200,000-added GI Early Times Turf Classic May 3, and the \$500,000-added GI Kentucky Oaks May 2. Twelve of the Derby Week events will be televised nationally by ABC, ESPN or ESPN2.

The sale, the primary fundraiser for the VTA, offers more than 120 No Guarantee seasons, including those to such stallions as Allen's Prospect, Dove Hunt, Lord Carson, Peteski, Sea Hero, Unaccounted For and Wolf Power (SAf). "There is a season available for every pocketbook and every mare owner," said VTA Chairman Patrick Lawley-Wakelin. EASTERN ECHO HEADS HOME Nine-year-old stallion **Eastern Echo** (Damascus), hospitalized since New Year's Eve with equine encephalitis, was discharged from Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital yesterday and returned home to Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky. TRIPLE CROWN EARLY NOMINATIONS CLOSE

TODAY Early nominations for the 1997 Triple Crown close at midnight tonight. To make the deadline, mailed entries must be postmarked no later than January 18, and should be addressed to: Triple Crown Productions, 700 Central Ave., Louisville, Kentucky, 40208. The early nomination, \$600 payable by personal check or Visa credit card, can also be made at racing offices at North American racetracks, or by telephone or fax to the three host tracks of the Triple Crown, Churchill Downs, Pimlico and Belmont Park. The final deadline for the Kentucky Derby, the Preakness and the Belmont Stakes, and the \$5 million Visa Triple Crown bonus available to any horse who sweeps all three, is March 29, when the nomination fee will be \$6,000. TOBA "OWNER OF THE MONTH" TO GARY

BISZANTZ Gary Biszantz, whose **Running Flame (Fr)** (Assert {Ire}), won the Hollywood Turf Cup December 15, has been named the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" for December. Running Flame was one of four winners for Biszantz in December, who also sent out the filly **Kristopher Street** (Kris S.) to win a stakes at Golden Gate. His stable enjoyed great success throughout 1996, with 225 starts, 51 wins, and earnings of \$2.5 million. Running Flame, purchased for \$250,000, earned \$300,000 for his Turf Cup victory. Biszantz will be featured on ESPN's *Racehorse Digest*. TOBA's "Owner of the Month" Award is sponsored by Gainsborough Farm.

BREAKTHROUGH IN AUSTRALIAN JOCKEY

DISPUTE Jockeys in Victoria, Australia, won a pay raise from the Victoria Racing Club Friday and a dispute which led to the jockeys' strike action on January 4 is now over—but only in Victoria, home of Australia's two greatest races, the Melbourne Cup and the Cox Plate. Jockeys and racing officials have struck a three-year deal which will increase the basic riding fee from the present \$55 to \$65 February 1, then to \$70 in 1998 and \$75 in 1999. Jockeys had in fact asked for \$100, but it now seems that all parties are content with the new deal. Victoria Racing Club Chief Executive Brian Beattie said that the extra money would be found by the racing industry, which will come as a relief to racehorse owners, who might have been expected to foot the bill. Sadly, no agreements have been reached in other states, but despite this failure to reach a deal, the jockeys have pledged not to take further strike action in the foreseeable future in New South Wales.

Local News: Gulfstream Park

Gulfstream Park will unveil a life-sized bronze statue of **Cigar** (Palace Music), created by artist Cindy Wolf, during a live telecast on ESPN February 2. The sculpture will be the centerpiece of Gulfstream's "Garden of Champions," which features 83 bronze plaques dedicated to the champions who have raced at the track since 1944. Wolf, an internationally acclaimed artist, has worked on the piece for up to 19 hours a day since she was commissioned for the job last August 1. Cast in 53 sections in a foundry in Utah, the components were shipped to Wolf's hometown of Versailles, Kentucky for assembly, then sent to an auto paint finishing facility in Lexington, where the patina is now being applied. The statue is scheduled to be vanned to Florida January 27. "The whole project has been incredibly demanding but very satisfying," said Wolf. "It was my first impression of Cigar as I took those measurements in his stall that stayed with me throughout the creation of the statue. He drew himself up and let his presence be known to me. It is the feeling he imparted then that has enabled me to instill life and motion in the statue."

Local News: South Africa

Henry Cecil's new stable jockey for 1997, Kieran Fallon, has been banned for two weeks in South Africa after admitting causing a race accident which has put another jockey in intensive care. Fallon pleaded guilty to causing interference in the Peninsula H. at Milnerton in South Africa on Tuesday; Fallon's mount, Special Prince, cut off jockey Conrad Wilkinson and Two O'Clock Jump, who then clipped Special Prince's heels and fell. Wilkinson, thrown from Two O'Clock Jump, was admitted to the Milnerton Medi-Clinic in a serious condition. Hospital sources have stated that 28-year-old Wilkinson is suffering from severe concussion, with swelling to the left side of his brain. He is in the intensive care unit on a ventilator and is under heavy sedation.

Fair Grounds President and General Manager Bryan Krantz has announced the track's second purse increase of the 1996-97 season. Effective Monday, January 20, all overnight purses will receive a five-percent raise, from \$355 to \$1,500 per race. Santa Anita has replaced its old lead pads and replaced them with the latest in new weight technology, the "Best Pads." Made of vulcanized rubber and shock-absorbing foam, the Best Pads are designed to provide more even distribution of the weight without shifting; they are also contoured to the shape of the horse and so are more comfortable for horse and rider. The pad was first used at Keeneland; it was developed by Dr. Phil Shrimpton, a Kentucky veterinarian.

Falkenham (GB) (Polar Falcon), three-for-four in England but off the board in two U.S. starts including a fifth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will miss Saturday's Golden Gate Derby with a bruised foot.
