UNBRIDLED'S SONG TRIUMPHS IN '97

BOW Making his four-year-old debut as the 4-5 choice in the seven-furlong Olympic H. at Gulfstream vesterday, Unbridled's Song (Unbridled) returned to the winner's circle for the first time since April with a 3 1/4-length victory under jockey Mike Smith. Rated just off the flank of 7-5 second choice Appealing Skier (Baldski) for a half, the grey took command as they straightened into the stretch and drew away at will. "You can never be totally confident going into a race, but I was extremely happy with the way he was training," said Nick Zito, who took over as the colt's conditioner after his ninth-place finish in the Arlington Citation Challenge July 13. Unbridled's Song ran just once for Zito last year, finishing second in an Agueduct allowance November 30. "It doesn't matter what kind of race you're in, a lot of times the horse needs a race," said Zito. "I think it's safe to say that's what happened in this horse's case. With a horse like this, you have to watch every little thing. When we got to Florida, we watched every detail and it paid off. He responded. We all know what a great horse he is. The main thing is keeping him mentally right." Unbridled's Song makes his next start against 1996 champion three-year-old Skip Away (Skip Trial) in the GI Donn H. February 8. (Olympic H. chart, p.2)

MORE COLD-WEATHER CANCELLATIONS

Racing was called off after the first race at Suffolk Downs Sunday afternoon due to the freezing temperature and sub-zero wind chill. Winner of the GII Dahlia H. in her most recent start December 15 at Hollywood, Sixieme Sens was looking for her fifth victory since flying over from France at the end of her 1995 campaign. Picking up just one pound off her Dahlia win, the dark bay was the 3-1 second choice but made her run from fifth to edge favored Alpride (Ire) under jockey Corey Nakatani. "The last time she ran at Hollywood Park, she handled a really soft surface, then won on firm going today," said Nakatani. "She's a nice mare, tries hard and she beat a group of competitive horses in this race. Hopefully, she can replace Wandesta." Nakatani was the regular rider of last year's Eclipse-winning turf mare. Trainer Bobby Frankel also compared the mare to former charge Wandesta. "She's improving--she looked good today," he said. "I thought she won fairly easily. Corey never really got after her--he just got her out and she sort of ran like Wandesta did in the Matriarch." As for the future, Frankel said, "We'll pretty much run her through the program here." Runner-up Alpride finished willingly to just miss. "I thought I had a great shot when I turned for home," said her jockey, Chris McCarron. "She kicked on and gave me one more little spurt when (Sixieme Sens) got to my saddle towel. I thought she was going to hold her off, but the last eighth of a mile was a little

too fast for old Alpride."

Desert Mirage (Skywalker), making his first start in two years and 3 1/2 months, was 7-5 facing restricted maiden claimers for a \$32,000 tag in the second race at Santa Anita yesterday. Fit despite the long absence, the bay dueled on the lead from the start and drew away late to score a belated maiden win by 2 1/2 lengths. Now five and unraced at three and four, the Cal-bred started exclusively in stakes at two, finishing second in the restricted Barretts Juvenile as the 7-5 favorite. He was also runner-up by a neck in the GIII Balboa S. to subsequent juvenile champion Timber Country (Woodman), winner of the GI Moet Champagne, GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and GI Preakness; and second by a neck in the GII Norfolk S.

A trio of candidates for the GII San Antonio H. February 2 breezed Sunday morning, with GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene), who took the race in 1996, going seven furlongs in 1:29 4/5 at Hollywood; Argentine champ **Gentlemen** (**Arg**) (Robin des Bois), four-for-five in the U.S., drilling a mile in 1:38 2/5 over the same track; and **Kingdom Found** (The Bart) working a half-mile in :47 3/5 at Santa Anita.
