AVERAGE DOWN AT OBS WINTER MIXED

SALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company concluded its Winter Mixed Sale Wednesday as 173 lots sold for \$889,700, an average of \$5,143. For the three sessions of the auction, a total of 545 horses grossed \$4,254,800, an average of \$7,807. The average was down 5.1 percent from last year's two-session average of \$8,320. The overall median price was \$5,000, identical to the 1996 figure. Broodmares averaged \$9,137, down just 1 percent from a year ago, while yearlings averaged \$7,010, a decline of 5.5 percent from 1996. The median price of broodmares rose 12 percent, from \$5,200 last year to \$5,850 in 1997, while the yearling median dropped 10 percent, from \$5,000 in '96 to \$4,500 this year. "All in all, the market more than held its own compared to last year," said Tom Ventura, OBS Director of Sales. "We didn't have the Israel Cohen dispersal to inflate the open session figures and there were two open sessions this year compared to only one last year. The broodmare market remained strong and, most importantly, the percentage of buy backs was significantly lower this year than last." The highest bid at the final session of the Winter Mixed Sale came in for a yearling colt by Premiership out of stakes winner Knoll Body's Fool (El Barril (Chi)). The half-brother to multiple stakes winner Dashing Devil (Sovereignty) was consigned by Summerfield, agent for Jacarie Farm, and sold for \$45,000 to David Kegley. The top price for a broodmare Wednesday came for the four-yearold Kula Grey (Cox's Ridge), in foal to Robyn Dancer. Consigned by Fairhill Farm, Agent I, the half-sister to graded stakes winner Crystal Moment (Super Moment), a winner of \$559,292, was purchased for \$35,000 by Sandra McKinney's Bent Tree.

Glitter Woman won her first two starts by a combined 15 1/2 lengths, then stepped up to the graded stakes ranks and reeled off three straight secondplace finishes, ending her campaign finishing 2 1/2 lengths behind City Band after a rough start in the GIII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs November 30. Facing that rival once again in her three-year-old debut, the bay turned the tables in style. Fourth after a quarter in :21.43, the bay was just a head behind City Band through a half in a rapid: 44.07, then took control of the race and sparkled through the stretch, winning as she pleased under jockey Mike Smith. "I was confident going into the race because of the way she has been training the last two weeks," said winning trainer Shug McGaughey. "I had originally wanted to run her in an allowance race, but she was training so good, I decided to run here. Since she's been (in Florida), she's really turned that corner. She's a pretty good horse." The filly will likely make her next start in the GIII Davona Dale S. February 9. CU-PIDS REVENGE (Red Ransom), undefeated going into the race but facing graded foes for the first time, led for a quarter before tiring to finish fourth. "She was done after three-eighths of a mile," said her rider, Jerry Bailey. "I don't know if there is anything wrong --we'll just have to wait 'till she gets back to the barn."

KENMARE RETIRED Arrowfield Group Ltd. announced yesterday that, due to declining fertility, champion stallion Kenmare (Fr) (Kalamoun {GB}) has been retired from commercial stud duties. "It was the first time in his whole career that he has shown any fertility problems and, at 22 years of age, he was telling us that enough was enough," said Arrowfield's John Messara. "He has been a magnificent stallion for us, leaving champion sprinters, milers and classic winners alike, and we couldn't have asked any more of him." A Group 1 winner in France, Kenmare won five of his 11 lifetime starts. He began his stud career in France, where he was champion sire twice, champion sire of juveniles three times, and sired five Group 1 winners. Purchased by Arrowfield in 1988, he has since sired an additional five Group 1 winners; to date, the stallion has 43 stakes winners worldwide. He is also the broodmare sire of last year's Eclipse Award-winning sprinter, Lit de Justice.

TOPSIDER FILLY TOPS FIRST OBS OPEN

SESSION The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company conducted the first open session of its three-day 1997 Winter Mixed Sale Tuesday, selling 184 horses for a gross of \$840,700. That total was 40 percent lower than the Tuesday session in 1996, when 272 hips sold for \$1,411,000. The 1997 average of \$4,570 was down 11.9 percent from the '96 average of \$5,188. The highest bid on the day came in for Top Mood (Topsider), a four-year-old filly consigned by Bridlewood Farm; the unraced half-sister to graded stakes-placed Heaven's Wish (Halo) was sold for \$30,000 to Lou Salerno's Questroyal Stable, Inc.

DANEHILL COLT TOPS NEW ZEALAND SALE

On the first day of the National Yearling Sales at Karaka in New Zealand, held yesterday, a filly by Coolmore Stud's stallion sensation Danehill, consigned by Ascot Farm on behalf of Davilora Lodge, topped the sale at \$211,223. The filly, purchased by trainer John Morrisey, is out of the unraced Marscay mare Canny Miss, and a half-sister to the champion two-year-old Canny Lad, who won both the G1 Golden Slipper and G1 VRC Sires Produce S., and to Canny Lass, a triple Group One winner. Another Coolmore "shuttle" stallion, Royal Academy, produced the second highest-priced yearling of the day when Wrightsons Bloodstock, acting on behalf of Hong Kong interests, paid \$193,621 for his colt out of the Ahonoora mare A Star Is Born. The colt is a half-brother to the stakes winners Encores and Sir Laurence.

TRF AUCTION SET FOR JANUARY 27 Telephone bidding for the seventh annual stallion seasons auction to benefit the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation will begin Monday, January 27 and culminate in a live auction Saturday, February 1. Bidders will be offered more than 150 seasons to stallions such as French Deputy, Gilded Time, Gulch, Housebuster, Kingmambo, Marquetry, Mt. Livermore, Runaway Groom and Wild Again in Kentucky, and Allen's Prospect, Carnivalay, Deerhound, Norquestor and Two Punch in Maryland. Our roster of 150 stallions will appeal to breeders looking to premier national and international markets as well as those seeking seasons to good local stallions. NOTES ON STALLIONS...by Bill Oppenheim

Good morning, and best wishes to all for a healthy and prosperous 1997...lt's slightly the lull before the storm both in racing and waiting to get those early mares covered, so it seems like a good time to sound off a bit on some stallions, some of whom you may actually still be able to get to if you wanted.

Let's start with that most interesting and chancy of groups (always), last year's freshman sires. This appears to have been a pretty solid group, but last vear's #4, A.P. Indv (Seattle Slew), looks absolutely the real deal. This doesn't come as news to anybody who knows he's had four stakes winners, plus Pulpit. For my money it's a Seattle Slew-Alydar-Fappiano kind of start that we saw in the '80s, and though he didn't lead the freshman sire list like they did, he looks about 1-10 to lead it at the end of '97...his most promising start coincides with a serious resurgence of Capote (Seattle Slew), runaway leading juvenile sire of '96 and 5th on the General Sire List. Finally, Seattle Slew looks as though he's got not one but two top class sire sons. Outside the top 10 on the freshman sire list, I'm quite impressed with the late-season run by Pine Bluff (Danzig) (15th). Horses like Blushing Groom used a second-ten freshman sire finish as a springboard to greater things, and I think there's a lot to like about Pine Bluff's nine winners, one stakes winner (plus one stakes-placed in '97). He's a Danzig who stayed, and if he works he could be an important figure. I always thought his looked more like three-year-olds anyway. He might be a bargain at \$15,000 right now. Among many others I liked the look of: #11 Rubiano (Fappiano), no stars but a lot of solid winners, pretty early and in the right places; #18 St Jovite (Pleasant Colony)--he was a great three-year-old and considering how well his two-year-olds did, if just one or two of them deliver on that promise he'll be serious news; #27 Dixie Brass (Dixieland Band), who I always thought was a good horse. No matter how much weight you get, you don't win the Met Mile at three unless you're serious news. He had a seriously good two-year-old in England in Putra. I also like Dixie Brass' 1/2-brother Odyle (Alleged). Alleged deserves one good sire son (on the flat), and this horse had plenty dirt form to stand behind him.

Stallions with first three-year-olds in '96: The Fappiano year, #2 Unbridled is a classic case of a stallion out of a Le Fabuleux mare--many who don't run but when they do, they can be awfully good. He's an extreme case at the moment, but at least he's had a new stakes winner this year which will help begin to fill in that huge gap between G1 winners and non-runners. His brother, #7 Cahill Road, looks a lot more consistent, but lacks the stars. This is a make-or-break year for him; he has plenty of useful winners, but needs some 'Saturday' horses. #6 Quiet American was having a very quiet old year until Hidden Lake popped up with a graded win at Santa Anita, Never mind-this was a top class miler and. believe me, he didn't start out with the best mares on the planet, I'd bet on him at \$20,000, big-time.

Stallions with first four-year-olds in '96: #1 Carson City (Mr. Prospector) and #2 Red Ransom (Roberto) are runaway leaders here, both very good sires in the making, definitely Top 30 caliber, maybe Top 15. #3 With Approval (Caro {Ire} and #4 Beau Genius (Bold Ruckus) might both be pretty good buys right now at \$7500 and \$10,000, respectively.

And how about just a taste of the unproven? Two whose first foals arrive '97: **Distant View** (Mr. Prospector) at \$10,000--he was a top class miler, has a pedigree, and has had serious support from Prince Khaled Abdullah; and **Go For Gin** (Cormorant), at \$15,000. I've not been a big fan of his up til now, but I just think that \$15,000 is beginning to look quite reasonable. My main reservation has been that I thought his best form was on off tracks, but his level of class doesn't need any apologies, and with the stallion market skyrocketing, a good-looking horse like him, with a versatile pedigree and serious racing class--well, he merits a second look.

But my Number 1, Godllovethishorse, "Value Sire Selection of 1997" (I'm not allowed to speculate on '97 freshman sires in case we are asked to prognosticate late) is first-year sire Fastness (Ire) (Rousillon), at Gainesway for \$7,500. I think this was a very serious racehorse, and I think if I was in the breeding business myself (which is down to lack of capital, not lack of conviction, as you can see), I might send every mare I had to Fastness for that money. Well, OK, I wouldn't, but I like him a lot...'Bye for now ...Bill Oppenheim is a journalist and consultant specializing in pedigrees, sires and the auction market.
