STORM SONG PREPS FOR '97 DEBUT Last year's champion two-year-old filly Storm Song (Summer Squall), winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in her final start of the campaign, worked five furlongs in 1:00 at Gulfstream yesterday morning and will make her seasonal bow in the GIII Davona Dale S. February 9. "She went the first quarter in :25, and the last three-eighths in :35. She did it beautifully; I'm very happy with her," said trainer Nick Zito.

PROGRESS IN NEVADA NEGOTIATIONS The California Horse Racing Board, in an attempt to resolve the dispute which has prevented the state's racing from being simulcast to Nevada race books, has authorized California horsemen and racing associations to negotiate the best deals possible and to resume simulcasting at their discretion. Last month, in an effort to bring equity to the state's simulcast program, the CHRB prohibited simulcasts to Nevada unless the Northern California racetracks received a minimum of 3.7 percent of the simulcast handle, and the Southern California tracks received a minimum of 4.2 percent of the handle for the signals. But in a 6-1 vote at the monthly meeting Friday, the Board modified its stance after learning that members of the Nevada Pari-Mutuel Association had also revised their positions in order to get negotiations moving again. The CHRB wants to "step back and allow the business people to work things out," said Commissioner Stefan Manolakas, and offered to allow tracks to turn the signal back on during the negotiations. However, representatives of the Thoroughbred Owners of California, whose approval is required for any simulcasting to Nevada, said they will not permit simulcasting until an agreement is reached. Parties involved are expected to meet late next week to try to reach such an agreement, which would then have to be approved by the CHRB.

KENTUCKY JAZZ TO BRIDLEWOOD Bridlewood Farm General Manager George G. Isaacs announced Friday that Kentucky Jazz (Dixieland Band) will join the stallion roster at Bridlewood in Ocala, Florida, for 1997. The 10-year-old, a half-brother to champion sprinter Groovy, had stood the 1996 season at Robinson Farm in Ft. Worth, Texas. Sire of stakes winner Texas Jazz, his first foals are four-year-olds this year. Kentucky Jazz will stand for a 1997 fee of \$2,500, live foal. News cont. p2

HOLLENDORFER SADDLES FIVE WINNERS AT BAY MEADOWS Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer celebrated opening day at Bay Meadows 1997 winter/spring meet by equaling the Northern California record for most wins on a single card, sending out five winners at the track Thursday. The conditioner missed his sixth win on the card by just a head. His five winners were Sir Fir (Knights Choice) (6.20) in the second race, Funny Tale (*Habitony) (\$3.60) in the third, Balla Balla (Bolger) (\$5.80) in the fourth, Mrs Thatcher (The Prime Minister) (\$3.60) in the sixth and Day Jewels (Slew o'Gold) (\$5.60) in the seventh; his Soviet Square (Moscow Ballet) missed out in a photo in the fifth race. It is the second time Hollendorfer has accomplished the feat. saddling five winners for the first time at Golden Gate Fields May 1, 1996. "You have to get lucky," he said. "You have to get horses in that can handle the track. Everybody told me I had a chance for a huge day. I didn't know. If I did, I could have made a lot of money."
