MILE REPLACES WOODBINE MILLION The Woodbine Mile will replace the GI Woodbine Million on the 1997 Ontario Jockey Club Thoroughbred stakes schedule. The new race, a one-turn event run over the E.P. Taylor turf course, for three-year-olds and older, will carry a \$500,000-guaranteed purse and will be run Saturday, September 20. The Woodbine Million was won last year by Eclipse Champion 3-Year-Old Skip Away. Woodbine's other Grade One race, the Canadian International S., a mile and a half on the grass, will continue to offer a \$1 million-guaranteed purse. The International, won last year by North American Turf Champion Singpiel, has been scheduled for Sunday, October 19. "The Woodbine Mile gives us an exciting new race on grass and reinforces our resolve to become the premiere turf racing track in North America," said John Whitson, the Ontario Jockey Club's Vice President of Racing. The Woodbine Million, formerly called the Molson Export Million, and the International, formerly the Rothmans Ltd. International, lost corporate sponsorship at the end of 1995. "It's regrettable that the Woodbine Million couldn't be continued," Whitson said. "But the long term viability of the race was in question. We were notified by the T.O.B.A.'s (Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association) Graded Stakes Committee that the Million's Grade One status was in jeopardy. So rather than have the race downgraded, we decided to drop it completely and maintain the \$1 million purse on the Canadian International, a race which is not threatened by a downgrade in status and enjoys the support of leading horsemen from around the world." The OJC also announced that Canada's Triple Crown of Racing will be spread over a seven-week period. The Queen's Plate will be run Sunday, June 29, the Prince of Wales S. on July 27 and the Breeders' S. on August 17.

NO SLOTS FOR NEW YORK A proposed constitutional amendment that would have allowed slot machines at all New York State racetracks but Aqueduct and Belmont and casinos in certain parts of the state, was overwhelmingly rejected in the New York State Senate yesterday. The lawmakers voted against the bill by a 41-19 margin. Had it been approved, the bill, which would not have allowed casino gaming in New York City or Nassau County, Long Island, areas that include Aqueduct and Belmont, would have been sent to the voters this November. Prior to the vote, Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno said that if the amendment were defeated, he would not bring it up again this year or next year. Because such a bill must be passed by two separately elected houses, the casino issue is now dead in the state of New York until at least the year 2001. The defeat of the casino bill was good news for the New York Racing Association, which had nothing to gain and everything to lose had it passed. Having been left out of the casino bill, NYRA could only have been hurt by the greatly increased competition for the gambling dollar. Several state harness tracks were counting on the legalization of slot machines to stay alive. Management at Yonkers Raceway has gone on record saying it will be forced to close down without slot machines.

CHAPOSA SPRINGS RETIRED *Chaposa Springs* (Baldski), originally scheduled to make her final race-track appearance in this Saturday's Shirley Jones H., has been retired, according to a report in the *Daily Racing Form*. Trainer Marty Wolfson told the *Form*, "After tossing and turning for weeks on what is the right direction for Chaposa Springs, I've decided there's only one answer--that there is nothing else for her to prove and only selfishness on my part would ask her to run Saturday." The 5-year-old Chaposa Springs earned 14 victories in 23 starts, with five seconds and earnings of \$762,115. She was victorious in six graded stakes, including the GI Test S. and the GI Ballerina. The mare will be bred to Seeking the Gold.

BOSTON HARBOR TO SANTA CATALINA Champion Juvenile Colt *Boston Harbor* (Capote) will likely make his 3-year-old debut in Sunday's Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita, trainer D. Wayne Lukas told the *Daily Racing Form* Tuesday. The \$100,000 Santa Catalina will be run over a mile and a sixteenth. SANDPIT TO TRY DIRT IN BIG 'CAP Turf specialist **Sandpit (Brz)** (Baynoun {Ire}) will take to the dirt March 2 in the \$1 million Santa Anita H., trainer Richard Mandella told the *Daily Racing Form* Tuesday. Mandella said the eight-year-old's owner, Sergio Menezes of Sierra Thoroughbreds, has wanted to try Sandpit on dirt for the past two years; the 1993 Brazilian Champion Three-Year-Old has raced on the main track only once before, winning a race in South America. Since joining Mandella's barn in 1994, Sandpit has won nine of 18 starts on the grass for earnings of \$2,486,973. His North American triumphs have included victories in the GI Caesars International H. twice, GI Hollywood Turf H., GI Oak Tree Invitational S. and GI San Luis Rey S. In his most recent outing Jan. 20 at Santa Anita, he returned from a five-month layoff to win the GII San Marcos H. under regular jockey Corey Nakatani, who will be aboard once again in the Big 'Cap.

VINERY EXPANSION PLANNED Mr. and Mrs. Ben P. Walden, Jr.'s Vinery has announced plans to break ground March 1, 1997 on a new breeding complex at the Midway, Kentucky farm. The state-of-the-art facility will be ready for the 1998 breeding season and will include two breeding sheds, a complete veterinary lab, and sophisticated video equipment. A new entrance will be built with two-way direct access from Weisenberger Mill Road to the loading docks.

With Shane Sellers up, the colt went :25.3, :49.3, 1:14 and 1:53.4 in preparation for his next condition, non-winners of one. Brothers has been non-committal on Pulpit's next start, but Gulfstream Park Racing Secretary Bob Umphrey said he was writing a race for Friday that would go two turns and would fit Pulpit. "If I get Pulpit and four others, the race will go," said Umphrey.

At Hialeah, GIII Nashua S. victor **Jules** (Forty Niner) worked four furlongs for trainer Alan Goldberg Monday in :47.

GI Futurity S. winner **Traitor** (Cryptoclearance) worked four furlongs in :49 at Hialeah Monday.

The first foal by GI Haskell Invitational H. winner **Kissin Kris** (Kris S.) was born Jan. 7, 1997 at Franks Farms (Southland Division) in Ocala, Florida, where the seven-year-old stallion stands. The foal, a dark bay colt, is out of the Hagley mare Marid. Kissin Kris, who also won the GIII Palm Beach S. at three and placed in the GI Belmont S., GI Travers S., GI Breeders' Cup Classic and GI Suburban H., is owned by John Franks and stands for a 1997 fee of \$5,000 live foal.

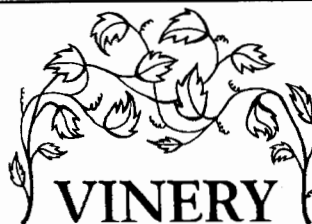

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

QUEEN OF MONEY (f, 3, Corporate Report--Chandelier, by Majestic Light) Although he was very well-received when he retired to stud and when his first offspring reached the sales ring, Travers S. winner Corporate Report was a little slow getting off the mark. So for the 1997 breeding season, he was moved from Overbrook Farm in Kentucky, to Pin Oak Lane Farm in Pennsylvania.

As usual, the move seems to have done the trick, and at the weekend Corporate Report was represented by his first stakes winner when Queen of Money took the GIII Santa Ynez S. by five lengths.

When a stallion comes up with a winner which is significantly better than anything which he has previously sired, we often find that there is an interesting pattern behind it, and Queen of Money is no exception. Corporate Report is by Private Account out of Ten Cents a Kiss, a daughter of the Graustark stallion, Key to the Mint. Queen of Money's dam, Chandelier, is by Majestic Light out of Gala Evening by Try My Best (a brother to El Gran Senor). The first thing we can note is that the dams of both Private Account and Try My Best are bred along very similar lines. Private Account's dam is by Buckpasser, and is a great-granddaughter of Striking, a three-parts sister to Buckpasser's dam, Busanda (both are by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne). Try My Best's granddam is by Mr. Busher, a brother to Striking, so the combination of Private Account and Try My Best really intensifies La Troienne's influence through a set of close genetic relatives.

This, however, is only part of the story. As we mentioned, Corporate Report is out of a mare by Key to the Mint, and Key to the Mint's granddam, Blue Banner, is by War Admiral out of a Blue Larkspur mare, which means she is three-quarters related to Busanda (here twice through her son Buckpasser). Key to the Mint makes another important contribution through his sire, Graustark, who is a son of Ribot and Flower Bowl. This connects closely to Queen of Money's broodmare sire, Majestic Light, who is by Majestic Prince (dam, Your Hostess, a three-parts sister to Flower Bowl) and out of a Ribot mare.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Florida-based Mr. Prospector son, Gold Alert has the knack of coming up with smart fillies such 1995's Coaching Club American Oaks heroine, Golden Bri, the very speedy U Can Do It and the Spinster S. runner-up, Let's Be Alert. Interestingly enough, Golden Bri and U Can Do It are both closely inbred to Raise a Native, while Lets Be Alert is inbred to Raise a Native's sire, Native Dancer. The weekend saw a new member join this club when **Mil Kilates (f, 4, Gold Alert--Flying Honors, by Silver Hawk)** won the Gill Affectionately H. at Aqueduct. Mil Kilates has a rather remarkable pedigree. Gold Alert is by Mr. Prospector, a son of Raise a Native, out of Croquis, by Arts and Letters. Quick Honors, the granddam of Mil Kilates, is by To The Quick, a son of Raise a Native, out of Nalees Honor Award, by Arts and Letters. Since Quick Honors's granddam is by Nashua, who appears in Gold Alert as the broodmare sire of Mr. Prospector, Gold Alert and Mil Kilates are five-eighths related.

The GI Santa Monica H. victory of **Toga Toga Toga (m, 5, Saratoga Six--Northern Neck, by Northern Baby)** marked a new variation on a successful theme. Toga Toga Toga's broodmare sire, Northern Baby, has been represented by nine previous stakes winners out of his daughters and five of those are by sons of Mr. Prospector (by Raise a Native). Toga Toga Toga is by Saragota Six, whose sire Alydar, is a Raise a Native son bred on very similar lines to Mr. Prospector. On a reverse cross, Northern Baby sired Deposit Ticket out of a Mr. Prospector mare, and in turn, Deposit Ticket already has a stakes winner out of a mare by Alydar. It might be worth noting that Northern Baby's pedigree supplies a daughter of Native Dancer and a daughter of Nasrullah, while Mr. Prospector and Alydar both have sons of those horses.

We are beginning to notice Prince John and Halo turning up together in pedigrees, the most recent example being Devil's Cup, winner of the GII Canadian Turf H. this weekend. **Devil's Cup (c, 4, Devil's Bag--Fun Forever, by Never Bend)** is by a son of Halo, and his second dam, Fairway Fun is by Prince John. The link between the pair? Halo's maternal grandsire, Cosmic Bomb, is half-brother to Not Afraid, the dam of Prince John. A more extended version of the cross occurs in Devil's Cup's close relative, the brilliantly speedy Californian horse, Abaginone. He is by Devil's Bag, and his third dam is a sister to the dam of Devil's Cup.

Initially a disappointment, Seattle Slew's son Fast Play has rallied well, and now looks extremely good value at his 1997 fee of \$3,500 live foal. In 1996, Fast Play's representatives included Lucayan Prince (the highest weighted three-year-old sprint colt on the recently released International Classifications), Play Both Ends and Play Waki For Me. He was represented by another stakes winner last Saturday when **Tahoe City (c, 4, Fast Play--Sun Luck, by Conquistador Cielo)** won the Sunnyvale H. at Bay Meadows. Tahoe City is out of a mare by a son of Mr. Prospector, so reversing the cross which supplied Fast Play's half brother Seeking the Gold. He also has Busanda and Blue-Eyed Momo (very close relatives to the La Troienne family) 4x4 in his pedigree.

Devil's Bag's son Kerosene only had 21 foals in his first three crops, but he is certainly making the most of his opportunities and at the weekend, **Power Flame (c, 3, Kerosene--Eocene, by Topsider)** became his first stakes winner when capturing the Dixieland S. at Oaklawn Park. Power Flame has a double of Almahmoud (through Devil's Bag's sire, Halo, and through Northern Dancer) as does Kerosene's 1996 stakes winner, Up Dip. With his sons Diablo and Twilight Agenda both siring stakes winners in their freshman crops last year, it might pay to keep an eye on Devil's Bag as a sire of sires.
