MECKE AIMS FOR DUBAI CUP James Lewis, Jr.'s five-year-old Mecke (Maudlin), has been nominated to the March 29 Dubai World Cup. Trainer Manny Tortora said, "I don't think he will have any trouble getting into the race. If he goes, Jerry Bailey will get the mount." Mecke worked four furlongs in :48 on January 28 at Calder in preparation for his next start in the February 8 GI Donn H. A multimillionare, Mecke has earned grade one wins on both turf and dirt. He was victorious in last year's GI Arlington Million and GI Early Times Turf Classic. In his lone start this year, the bay won the the GIII MacDiarmida H.

SKIP AWAY WORKS TOWARD DONN The 1996 3-Year-Old Champion Skip Away (Skip Trial) worked Wednesday morning from the gate with jockey Rick Wilson up. The now 4-year-old worked five furlongs in :58 3/5, and went out three-quarters in 1:11 2/5, in preparation for the February 8 GI Donn H. Skip Away hasn't run since defeating Cigar in the GI Jockey Club S. last October 5. To date, the grey colt has won seven races from 18 starts for earnings of \$2,787,360.

CHAPMAN HANGS UP HIS TACK Jockey Tom Chapman has announced his retirement from race riding. "I'm done," said Chapman. "I don't miss riding. The only thing I really miss is the people." During his 19-year career, Chapman rode 20,505 races, collecting 2,584 wins, 2,547 seconds and 2,613 thirds. His mounts earned \$36,681,346 in purse money. He was the leading apprentice rider at all major Southern California tracks in 1977-78 and captured the 1984 Hollywood Oaks aboard Moment to Buy. The 1984 Jack Robinson Memorial Award recipient, Chapman won the riding championship at Golden Gate Fields in 1989 when he rode 114 winners. Chapman is enjoying his new career as a professional artist, which, he's finding, is a lot less taxing on the body. "For the first time in 19 years, I feel healthy." During his career, Chapman suffered his share of serious injuries-including a fractured skull and three fractured vertebrae.

Two of our eight contributors—trainer John Kimmel and bloodstock consultant Alan Porter—correctly predicted that Salt Lake would lead the pack in terms of 1996 progeny earnings. "The farm gave me a bribe," joked Porter, who added, "Salt Lake was not only the top freshman sire last year, but he finished fifth overall as a sire of two-year-olds, which is a great start for a horse whose first-year stud fee was only \$5,000." Kimmel said he chose Salt Lake to head the list because of the "appearance of his crop on both the yearling and two-year-old market, their physical confirmation, the way they moved on the racetrack. His first crop also did very well on cardiac assessments."

A son of Deputy Minister–Take Lady Anne (Queen City Lad), Salt Lake sired two 1996 stakes-winners in his first crop–GI Moet Champagne S. winner Ordway and High Heeled Hope, victorious in the Maker's Mark S. and Indian Summer S. High Heeled Hope made her three-year-old debut Sunday, finishing third as the 7-5 favorite in the GIII Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita. Eight-year-old Salt Lake stands at Walmac Int'l in Lexington, Kentucky for a 1997 stud fee of \$7,500 live foal.
