\$1 MILLION HASKELL TOPS MONMOUTH STAKES SCHEDULE Amer-

ica's richest invitational race, the Buick Haskell, will carry a \$1 million purse as the highlight of the 1997 Monmouth Park stakes schedule. The schedule also adds a pair of prestigious Atlantic City events to its calender. The GI Buick Haskell, which has produced three-year-old champions for the past three years--Holy Bull, Serena's Song and Skip Away--has been increased from \$750,000 and has been scheduled for Sunday. August 3. The GIII \$100,000 Matchmaker H. and the GIII \$75,000 Jersey Shore Breeders' Cup H., both formerly run at Atlantic City, are set for June 14 and June 28, respectively. The 1997 Monmouth Park stakes schedule totals \$2,875,000 in purses for 16 stakes, an increase of \$200,000 over the 1996 stakes program. "We're offering more top flight events to go along with our popular overnight stakes program," said Robert Kulina, Monmouth's Vice President of Racing. "There are stakes opportunities in virtually every racing division during the 1997 season." Kulina also expects daily purses for the meet to begin at \$245,000, an all-time high for the Jersey shore track. The 1997 Monmouth meet is scheduled to run from May 24 to September 1. The stable area will open April 21.

SINGSPIEL OFF TO DUBAI Eclipse Award winner Singspiel (Ire) (In the Wings (GB)), winner of last year's GI Canadian International and Japan Cup, jetted out from London's Heathrow Airport yesterday on the first leg of another international mission. Sheikh Mohammed's five-year-old, trained by Michael Stoute, is to spearhead Europe's challenge in the Dubai World Cup on March 29. Anthony Stroud, the Sheikh's racing manager, said yesterday, "The horse flew out this morning and will be staying in a quarantine barn for his preparation. Michael (Stoute) is due in Dubai on Sunday." There is a second entry stage for the 10-furlong event next Wednesday, and only after that will a team of handicappers sit down to decide on the final list of first choice nominees. Even Top (Ire) (Topanoora {Ire}) and Bijou d'Inde (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who finished second and third respectively in last year's 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, seem certain to make the line up. Sheikh Mohammed's Flemensfirth (Alleged), may also make the trip. However Stroud added, "No decision has yet been reached about his participation."

BOSTON HARBOR PREPS FOR RETURN Last year's champion two-year-old colt Boston Harbor (Capote), getting ready for his first start since a gutsy win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile October 26, worked three-eighths in :36 3/5 over the fast training track at Santa Anita Thursday morning. A winner of six of his seven starts, the Eclipse winner makes his three-yearold bow in the \$100,000-added Santa Catalina S. going a mile and a sixteenth Sunday. "He's probably not tight enough to go a mile and a sixteenth against horses that have run recently," admitted trainer D. Wayne Lukas vesterday morning, "But I felt the seven-eighths race (San Vicente) would rev him up a little more than I want to. Our long-term goal is for him to run two turns, so I didn't think the seven-eighths would do anything for him. The bottom line is I think I've got him tight enough where I'm not going to hurt him. He may get a little tired, but it's not going to be a knockout race for him. He doesn't have to win, but he'll keep everybody honest."

MASSCAP PURSE RAISED The purse for the 1997 Massachusetts H. could be as much as \$620,000 due to the lucrative bonus system in place for the winners of graded stakes. The minimum purse for the race has been raised from \$250,000 to \$300,000; the incentive program would give any winner of three Grade I stakes who takes the 1997 edition a total of \$500,000--\$100,000 more than Cigar earned for his victory in the race last year. Winners of two Grade I's would take home \$400,000, winners of one Grade I would get \$350,000 and winners of more than one Grade II race would receive \$300,000 for a MassCap win this year. There are additional bonuses based on wins in other graded races, and non-restricted \$500,000 stakes without graded status (such as the Dubai World Cup) are considered Grade I equivalents. The MassCap was awarded a Grade III ranking for this year's running; it was last run as a graded race when it held Grade II status in 1989, but lost its grading because it was not run from 1990-94.
