HONOUR AND GLORY RETIRED Honour And Glory (Relaunch), who set a stakes record winning last year's GI Met Mile in the time of 1:32 4/5, has been retired and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky. "He hasn't sparkled in his recent work," explained owner Michael Tabor, "so I have decided to retire him. My decision also took into account the fact that Honour And Glory brings new bloodlines to Ashford, where he will complement the other stallions extremely well. And, as D. Wayne Lukas said after the Met, the race is held in such esteem in the industry that a stallion prospect can't have better credentials than winning it." The fourth-rated colt on the Experimental Free Handicap at two after winning the GII Breeders' Futurity and finishing fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the bay went on to take four stakes at three, starting the season with victories in the San Miguel and GII San Rafael before getting moved up to second in the GI Santa Anita Derby. Honour and Glory missed the Belmont Park track record in the Met Mile by only one-fifth of a second; he also won the GII King's Bishop before finishing second in both the GI Vosburgh and GII Boojum H. and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. A \$410,000 Barretts two-year-old, he won six of his 17 career starts for earnings of \$1,202,942. "He was one hell of a colt," said his trainer, D. Wayne Lukas. "He possessed exceptional speed and a degree of stamina, a combination that has been the hallmark of so many top stallions." Honour and Glory will stand for a fee of \$20,000, live foal.

THREE-HORSE SPILL AT GULFSTREAM The first race at Gulfstream Park yesterday was marred by a spill that sent two jockeys to the hospital. The accident occurred when **My Sugar Magnolia** (Opening Verse) drifted out in the first quarter of the six-furlong maiden special weight test, forcing first-time starter **Elliptic Arc** (Brown Arc) onto the heels of **Deb's Honor** (Affirmed); Elliptic Arc and jockey Robbie Davis went down, and, unable to avoid the stricken horse, **Lady Of Blue** (Danzig Connection) and jockey Earlie Fires also fell. Caught in the incident, **Dawn's Black Tie** (Black Tie Affair {lre}) lost her rider, Shane Sellers. Davis, complaining of pain in his groin, and Fires, suffering from back pain, were taken to Memorial Hospital in Hollywood. Sellers sustained only minor cuts and bruises and rode the rest of the card. My Sugar Magnolia, who finished second in the race, was disqualified and placed last.

Talented but inconsistent, Victory Speech had failed as the favorite in his last two starts, finishing sixth in both the GI Malibu and GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup January 11. Sent off at generous odds this time, the dark bay turned in one of his top efforts, sitting off the pace of the longest shot on the board, The Barking Shark, for a mile, taking over the lead on the final bend and driving to the wire for the win. "We made a few adjustments," explained trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "I went back and studied my training charts for him before the Swaps, Dwyer and Laz Barrera (all won by Victory Speech); I duplicated a lot of things I had done with him prior to those races, and it worked again." The colt could go next in the GI Santa Anita H. March 2. Last year's Belmont S. winner EDITOR'S NOTE (Forty Niner) was sent off the 5-2 choice; on the pace for six furlongs, he weakened in the drive. "I guess this horse got loose on the training track yesterday, jumped a fence and ran back to the barn," said jockey Gary Stevens. "I didn't like the way he was traveling at any point in the race. He didn't feel good at all. I don't know what's wrong with him or if there's even anything wrong with him. I just didn't like what I felt."

Gentlemen set a track record for a mile and an eighth winning the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood in front-running fashion last time out December 22. Sprinting to the lead right out of the gate once again, the Argentine champ had three lengths on the field at the top of the stretch and just held on to best Breeders' Cup Classic hero Alphabet Soup, who was making his first start since that Grade I score. "He's a damn good horse," said winning trainer Richard Mandella. "When Alphabet Soup got to his flank, he just dug in and it got the job done." As for what's next, Mandella said the Santa Anita H. March 2 is a possibility before the latest South American sensation heads to the Middle East for the Dubai World Cup March 29. "To be eligible for the (MGM Grand) \$3 million bonus, you need to make all three races (Big 'Cap, Hollywood Gold Cup, Pacific Classic). He's pretty big and fresh, so we're going to give it some serious thought." The runner-up was game in his first start of '97. "He runs his white tail off every time he goes out there," said his rider, Chris McCarron.

Third in four straight tries against allowance foes, Frisk Me Now was not expected to be a competitor facing graded stakes company for the first time and was the rank outsider at 105-1. The Florida-bred sat behind fractions of :21.81 and :44.58 set by Confide and Crown Ambassador, ranged up to challenge as they headed down the stretch and edged past the 7-5 favorite to shock the crowd with a \$213.80 mutuel. Said winning jockey Eddie King, "I told (trainer Bob Durso), of all the colts he has, this might be the sleeper. He proved it. He's a nice colt and even after today, he has his better races in front of him." Added Durso, "This horse has improved so much. Eddie has been getting on him in the mornings, and he said he seems like he keeps getting better and better." As for the future, the trainer said, "My plan was to run him in the Lord Avie (Feb. 17) on the grass, depending on how he ran today. Now I'll have to think about the Fountain Of Youth (Feb. 22)."

Hello had never started on the main track after beginning his career in Italy. A Group 1 winner in Europe, the bay had been out just once since arriving in the U.S., winning the GIII Generous S. November 30. Trying the dirt in his first start in two months, he was rated near the back of the pack early but moved up steadily to take over as they straightened for the wire and hold Bagshot safe in the final drive. "He really showed me he could handle the dirt two days ago when he blew out a half-mile," said trainer Ron McAnally. "This horse has really surprised me. He's not very big, but he sure is gutty." The 4-5 favorite, last year's champion BOSTON HARBOR (Capote) pressed the pace early, put a head in front after six furlongs, but tired and finished fourth in his first start since taking the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile October 26. "We took a roll of the dice on conditioning here going this far," admitted trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "The pace was up there and we were into it. He's certainly not tight enough to do that. I still feel comfortable in what we tried to do--I think we'll get more out of this than if we sprinted him." The champ will likely make his next start in the San Rafael S. March 2.

FASIG-TIPTON MARYLAND WINTER MIXED

SALE SOARS The nine-year-old broodmare **Masake** (Master Willie {GB}), a graded-stakes winner of \$203,776 in foal to freshman sire **Belongtome**, brought a bid of \$130,000 to top the 1997 Fasig-Tipton Winter Mixed Sale, held yesterday at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Timonium, Maryland. Consigned by Chanceland Farm, agent for the Estate of Austin G.E. Taylor, the mare was purchased by Gerry O'Meara, agent. The second highest price at the auction was the \$82,000 paid for five-year-old **Oh Summer** (Oh Say), a multiple stakes-placed winner of \$161,574. Consigned by Litz Bloodstock Sales, agent for the Estate of Carlyle J. Lancaster, the racing prospect was bought by Brereton C. Jones, agent. A total of 201 horses sold for \$2,262,000, up an amazing 250 percent from last year when 135 hips grossed \$646,700. The 1997 average of \$11,254 was up 135 percent from last year's figure of \$4,790.
