YANKS MUSIC RETIRED According to the Daily Racing Form, last year's champion three-year-old filly Yanks Music (Air Forbes Won), still bothered by a sore right front ankle which caused her to be scratched from last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. has been retired and will be bred to Cigar. The Kentucky-bred filly was also forced to miss the GI Top Flight H. last November because of the ankle injury; a winner in her last three starts, she made her final racetrack appearance in the Beldame October 6, taking it by three-quarters of a length over Serena's Song. "She was doing absolutely hands-down going into (the Top Flight)," trainer Leo O'Brien told the Form, "but she twisted the ankle again. She had improved 15 pounds from before the Breeders' Cup, but the ankle was obviously trying to tell us something. You give it a little rest and you think it's better, but it really isn't." Yanks Music goes to the breeding shed with a record of seven wins and two seconds from nine starts, including victories in the GI Mother Goose, GI Alabama, GI Ruffian H. and GI Beldame; her earnings total \$787,600.

The Board of Directors of Breeders' Cup Ltd. has elected three new members. At its most recent meeting, Ernest L. Samuel has owned the recipients of four Canadian "Horse of the Year" titles: Dauphin Fabuleux, Imperial Choice, Ruling Angel and Dance Smartly, as well as Eclipse Award winners Dance Smartly and Sky Classic, Biszantz, former chairman of Cobra Golf, campaigned graded stakes winners Admise, Cobra King, Running Flame and Savinio last year. #### Saturday, Gulfstream Park DONN H.-GI, \$300,000, 3vo/up, 9f

Canadian Horse of the Year **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore), fourth at 101-1 in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, makes his first start since running third in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup November 16. The five-year-old worked five furlongs in :59 1/5, galloping out six furlongs in 1:12 at Gulfstream yesterday. Also prepping for the race Monday, GIII Broward H. winner **Crafty Friend** (Crafty Prospector) went a half in :50 2/5 at Payson Park, while stablemate **Ghostly Moves** (Silver Ghost), third in the Broward, went a half in :49 4/5 at Gulfstream.

Last year's three-year-old champ **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) makes his 1997 debut in the Donn. His sire was second in the 1987 edition of the race, finishing a nose behind Little Bold John, who paid \$113.80.

Jockey Jerry Bailey teams up with **Mecke** (Maudlin) for the third time Saturday; the pair are two-for-two together after winning the 1995 GI Super Derby and the GIII Mac Diarmida in the five-year-old's latest outing. A two-time Grade I winner on the grass, Mecke has raced on dirt in both starts under Bailey. If all goes well in the Donn, trainer Manny Tortora plans to send his stable star in the GI Gulfstream Park H. March 1 and then on to the Dubai World Cup March 29, if he gets an invitation.

Also expected for the Donn are **Cimarron Secret** (Tejano), winner of the GIII Tropical Park H. last out; **Diligence** (Miswaki), runner-up in the Broward; and **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), fifth in the Breeders' Cup Classic in his most recent start.

### TRIPLE CROWN NOMINATIONS

**RELEASED** A total of 375 three-year-olds have been nominated to this year's Triple Crown. Last vear's champion two-vear-old Boston Harbor (Capote) heads the list, one of 23 nominees from trainer D. Wayne Lukas. The winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last year made his 1997 debut Sunday, finishing fourth in the Santa Catalina S. The Santa Catalina winner, Hello (Ire) (Lycius), is also on the list. A Group 1 winner in Italy, he is two-for-two since shipping in from Europe, also capturing the GIII Generous S. on the turf. There are 14 European-bred nominees to this year's Triple Crown; only two colts bred in Europe have ever won the Kentucky Derby--Omar Khayyam ('17) and Tomy Lee ('59) both won for England. Other notable names on this year's roster include **Cash Deposit** (Deposit Ticket), the top two-year-old in Canada last year, who made his seasonal bow Saturday, taking the Lecomte S. at the Fair Grounds; Breeders' Cup Juvenile runner-up Acceptable (Capote), second in the GIII Holy Bull S. to start this campaign; GI Moet Champagne winner Ordway (Salt Lake), a disappointing eighth in Sunday's GII Danka Hutcheson at Gulfstream; Pulpit (A.P. Indv), who got people talking with his awesome maiden score at Gulfstream in January; Gll Del Mar Futurity winner Silver Charm (Silver Buck), who will make his first start of the year in the GIII San Vicente S, at Santa Anita Saturday; GI Hopeful hero Smoke Glacken (Two Punch), five-forseven lifetime and first in the Black Gold H. at Fair Grounds in his 1997 opener; GI Hollywood Futurity victor Swiss Yodeler (Eastern Echo), seventh after pressing the pace in the Santa Catalina Sunday; and Traitor (Cryptoclearance), winner of the GI Futurity and second in the Moet Champagne at two. There are just seven fillies nominated, headed by champion and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine Storm Song (Summer Squall), and GI Hollywood Starlet and GI Matron winner Sharp Cat (Storm Cat), who took the Santa Ysabel S. in her three-year-old bow. For those looking for a Derby hunch bet, owners Robert and Beverly Lewis have nominated Twin Spires (Storm Cat). The \$700,000 Keeneland September yearling has started five times with a win and a second. Any horse who can sweep all three races in the Triple Crown--the Kentucky Derby May 3, Preakness May 17 and Belmont Stakes June 7, will win the \$5,000,000 Visa Triple Crown bonus. The final deadline for the Triple Crown is March 29; the fee is \$6,000.

#### Local News: France

Last year's decision by the French racing authorities to close Evry racecourse has brought about a significant change in the amount of use for the tracks which are the centre of two training centres, Chantilly and Maisons-Laffitte. In 1997, the picturesque Chantilly track will stage 22 days of racing, compared to only eight in 1996, while Maisons-Laffitte has been allocated 31, compared to only 13 last year. Maisons-Laffitte opens the Paris flat racing season on February 26. Evry's most valuable race, the mile-and-a-half G2 Grand Prix d'Evry, has been moved to Maisons-Laffitte and will be run June 7 under the title of 'Grand Prix de Maisons-Laffitte'. Chantilly opens on April 21; among the events which the track will stage for the first time will be the G2 Prix Hocquart, to be run May 3.

**Even Top (Ire)** (Topanoora {GB}), runner-up in last year's 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, is due to fly to the Gulf on Thursday to begin his acclimatization for the Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba on March 29. However, final first-choice nominees for the event, to be run over a mile and a guarter on the sand, will not be known until after the second entry stage on Wednesday. But Even Top's trainer Mark Tompkins has been given sufficient official encouragement about his colt's chances of making the field to arrange both flights and a build-up plan. "The horse has been in good healthy exercise for a while now and is in good form," he said. "I have been in touch with jockey Richard Hills, who is riding for Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum in Dubai, and he will be riding Even Top in his lead-up work. He may be available to ride the horse in the race itself. But if Sheikh Hamdan needs him, I have offered the mount to Richard Quinn."

Already in Dubai is the 2000 Guineas third and Eclipse Stakes runner-up **Bijou D'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), whose trainer Mark Johnston said: "Our jockey Jason Weaver worked him over the track last week and was very pleased with him. He virtually has a summer coat. If he can run up to his Eclipse form, when Halling beat him only a neck, he must have a serious chance."
