**WORLD RECORD FOR ISITINGOOD** Bettering the great Dr. Fager's world-record mark for the mile by one-fifth of a second, **Isitingood** (Crusader Sword) blazed through the distance in 1:32.05 at Santa Anita yesterday. The previous record of 1:32 1/5 was set August 24, 1968. Making his first start since winning the GIII Clark H. at Churchill Downs November 29 and stepping onto the turf for only the second time in his career, Isitingood went right to the front in the \$71,000 The Bart S., set fractions of :23.18, :45.86, 1:08.71 and 1:20.41, then held off **Via Lombardia (Ire)** (Shardari {Ire}) to win by three-quarters of a length. "I told (co-owner) Mike Pegram, this horse has never trained so well in his life," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He's getting better and better--I don't know if it's age or what. He worked a mile in 1:38 4/5 on the turf and I told Mike I thought we might have a turf star. I don't know much about turf horses, you know--to break the world record, who would have known?" The six-year-old could return to the main track for his next start, trying his luck in the GI \$1,000,000 Santa Anita H. March 2.

**STELLAR HAREM FOR CIGAR** The 1995 and 1996 "Horse of the Year" **Cigar** (Palace Music), who stands his first season at Ashford Stud this year, will cover a matchless book of mares, including six millionaires, 19 Group/Grade I winners, and the dams of 23 Group/Grade I winners. The millionaires are fellow "Horse of the Year" **All Along (Fr)** (Targowice), Eclipse winners **Eliza** (Mt. Livermore) and **Estrapade** (\*Vaguely Noble), and **Lottsa Talc** (Talc), **Sangue (Ire)** (Lyphard) and **Very Subtle** (Hoist The Silver). Allen Paulson, who raced the superstar, is sending 25 mares, notably Eliza, Estrapade and European champ **Committed** (Hagley). Dams of champions **Blushing John** (Blushing Groom {Fr}--La Griffe, by Prince John), **Groovy** (Norcliffe--Tinnitus, by Restless Wind), Eliza (out of Daring Bidder, by Bold Bidder), **Phone Chatter** (Phone Trick--Passing My Way, by Pass The Glass), **Prairie Bayou** (Little Missouri--Whiffling, by Wavering Monarch) and **Skip Away** (Skip Trial--Ingot Way, by Diplomat Way) will also visit Cigar in his first year at stud. Last year's top three-year-old filly **Yanks Music** (Air Forbes Won) joined the list when she was retired Monday. "We fully expected breeders to support Cigar with top class mares," said Ashford Manager Barry Simon, "but we are truly delighted with the sheer depth of quality racemares, producers and families to be found in his book."

**WORLD CUP NOMINATIONS TOTAL 115** There were 21 names added to the list of nominees to this year's Dubai World Cup when the second entry stage closed Wednesday, bringing the list to 115 for this year's running of the \$4 million event. Taking advantage of the second stage, and ready to make the trip to the United Arab Emirates should invitations be extended, are GI Canadian International and G1 Japan Cup winner **Singspiel (Ire)** (In The Wings {GB}), GI Arlington Million winner **Mecke** (Maudlin) and GI Secretariat S. and GI Crown Royal Hollywood Derby winner **Marlin** (Sword Dance {Ire}). A total of 40 horses from North America have thrown their bridles into the ring; also nominated at the latest deadline were **Ave's Flag** (Personal Flag), **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), **Just Java** (Java Gold), **Northern Afleet** (Afleet) and **Poliglote (GB)** (Sadler's Wells). There are also 29 entries from the UAE, 14 from Great Britain, nine from Japan, six from Ireland, five from France, two each from Australia, Brazil, New Zealand and South Africa, and one apiece from Germany, Greece, Hong Kong and Sweden. The selection of runners and reserves for the 1997 Dubai World Cup, to be run March 29, will be made by an international panel of senior handicappers and racing secretaries under the chairmanship of Geoffrey Gibbs, chairman of the International Classifications Committee. The Selection Committee meets today, and the field of 14 invitees and reserves will be announced Wednesday, February 12 at the Dubai Hilton.

**JEWEL PRINCESS WORKS TOWARD RETURN** Last year's champion older mare **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint), the likely favorite for the GI Santa Maria H. when she makes her 1997 debut February 16, worked seven furlongs over the Santa Anita main track yesterday. Out just prior to the day's first race, the five-year-old, with jockey Corey Nakatani in the irons, eased through a half in :51.19 and three-quarters in 1:15.03 before finishing up in 1:26.68; she galloped out the mile in 1:38 4/5. "She finished real strong, which is what we wanted to do," said assistant Craig Dollase, the son of trainer Wally Dollase. "That should set her up for the Santa Maria--we just wanted to get this last tightener in her. We're looking forward to next week."

**WICAPI NAMED HBPA "CLAIMER OF THE YEAR"**

Executive Director Scott Savin has announced that the National Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association award for "Claimer of the Year" will be given to **Wicapi** (Waquoit), who is owned by Acclaimed Stable and trained by Joseph Calascibetta. The now five-year-old was claimed at Gulfstream for \$20,000 in January, 1996, but climbed from the claiming ranks to win five races for his new connections, taking the Flying Pigeon H. and Thanksgiving Day H. at Calder and finishing third in the Gill Tropical Park H.; the dark bay set a new track record of 2:05 for a mile and a quarter at Calder winning an allowance race in June. He has earned \$116,734 since being claimed. "This horse personifies the ideal of Claimer of the Year and serves as encouragement to owners and trainers to participate in the claiming process," said Savin. Wicapi will be honored at the National HBPA's summer convention, to be held in Las Vegas in July.

**SHUTTLE PLANS ON HOLD FOR DANEWIN**

According to a story the *Daily Racing Form*, Australian champion **Danewin (Aus)** (Danehill), scheduled to ship to England's National Stud after completing his first season in the breeding shed at Australia's Emirates Park Stud last year, will be staying home in '97 after having problems with fertility in his first year. The five-time Group 1 winner, top three-year-old in his native country in 1994-95, would have been the first Australian-based shuttle stallion. The *Form* reported that Shaun Darcy, general manager at Emirates Park Stud, attributed the fertility problem to immaturity and the fact that the champion traveled all over the world during his racing career. "We decided it was in Danewin's best interests to give him a year off," Darcy told the *Australian AP*. "We will walk him into his next season nice and slowly. He was a very tired horse, he had been to Japan and Dubai in the last 12 months. It was a big concern--only 50 percent of his mares were in foal. But once we dropped back from two or three mares a day to one mare a day we got 100 percent fertility and confirmed our suspicion--that he was tired." It was also reported that Dr. Angus MacKinnon, a veterinarian and leading fertility specialists, has tested the stallion and is confident the problem will be resolved when the Australian breeding season begins again in August.

Three-year-old sensation **Pulpit** (A.P. Indy), who opened eyes with his 7 1/2-length romp against maidens at Gulfstream January 11, will make the second start of his career in the sixth race at that track tomorrow. He faces nine rivals in the mile-and-a-sixteenth allowance after winning at seven furlongs in his debut.

Jockey Shane Sellers, involved in a spill at Gulfstream last Sunday and due to ride **Pulpit** and Eclipse winner **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) in the GI Donn H. tomorrow, was thrown again during the 11th race at Gulfstream yesterday afternoon. Riding Mz. Mazuma, Sellers was making a move on the far outside on the final turn when the two were bumped by Cuthershort and went down. Sellers was examined by the paramedics and was walking to the ambulance under his own power when he collapsed. Checked out in the first-aid room by Dr. Jack O'Keefe, the attending physician, he did not appear seriously injured and the doctor sent him home without a trip to the hospital.

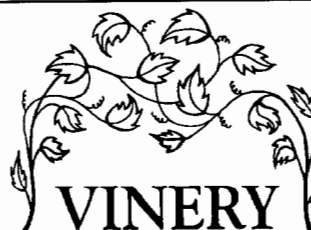

## 1997 FRESHMAN SIRE PREVIEW

The *Thoroughbred Daily News* asked a panel of experts in the bloodstock industry to predict which first-crop sires will top the charts in 1997. Before we tell you what their predictions are, let's recap how some of our panelists did in our freshman sire preview for 1996.

Last year, Salt Lake led all first-crop sires in money won and was tied for second in number of winners. His success was predicted by both John Kimmel and Alan Porter, who listed him as their first choice in 1996, and by Jack Werk, who chose him second.

A.P. Indy was the sire of four two-year-old stakes-winners in 1996, which tied him for first place in that category with Deposit Ticket. A.P. Indy was the #1 choice by panelist Bill Oppenheim last year, the #2 pick by James Delahooke and the #3 choice for Jack Werk.

We'd like to congratulate the panelists above on their successful freshman sire predictions in 1996. Will they repeat those successes in 1997? Only time will tell. Here are their picks:

### MICHAEL S. BROWN, Publisher, Racing Update

1. **Mountain Cat**—Keeps the ball rolling for the sire of the 1990s—Storm Cat.
2. **Gilded Time**—Perhaps the young savior of the Damascus line.
3. **Future Storm**—See #1 above.

**BEST VALUE...Future Storm**—\$5,000 fee; \$40,000 yearling average.

### JAMES DELAHOKE, Bloodstock Agent

1. **Fly So Free**—Great first crop. Can he overcome the mares?
2. **Gilded Time**—They look quick, and there's lots of 'em.
3. **Kingmambo**—Why not?

### SID FERNANDO, Bloodstock Editor, Daily Racing Form

1. **Gilded Time**—Top-class juvenile with the looks.
2. **Mountain Cat**—Precocious 2-year-old has been well supported.

*Comments...I haven't used Kingmambo here. He might well be the best of these, but a lot of his crop will be in Japan and Europe, which will hurt his standing in the North American list. Interesting that three of my picks are Damascus-line!*

### ALAN PORTER, Alan Porter Pedigree Research

1. **Gilded Time**—Truly brilliant speed (1:07 4/5 for 6f at 2), which he carried at least 1 1/16 miles. Sure to have lots of runners, and his yearlings sold extremely well.
2. **Fly So Free**—Champion Two-Year-Old and a very durable and versatile horse. Again his first crop was really well liked at the sales.
3. **Belong to Me**—Fast and well-bred horse who will have plenty of runners in lucrative and restricted NY-bred competition.

**BEST VALUE...Line In The Sand**—The brother to champion two-year-old (and classic winner) Ravinella has a big crop which is eligible for some rich Florida-bred stakes. As a son of Mr. Prospector out of a stakes-winning Northern Dancer mare, he also has a pedigree which allows for "upward mobility."
