**STUD FEE SET FOR UNBRIDLED'S SONG** Unbridled's Song (Unbridled), retired after suffering a fractured right front cannon bone while preparing for the GI Donn H., will stand his first season at stud at Taylor Made Farm in Nicholasville, Kentucky for a fee of \$30,000, live foal. The announcement that the four-year-old, winner of five races and \$1,311,800, was headed for the breeding shed came only a week ago, but already demand for bookings to the star colt exceed the number set for his first year. "The phone has been ringing off the hook--it hasn't stopped ringing since we announced his retirement," said Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made Farm. "We have had a flood of pedigrees to review, and have currently approved 40 mares."

**STORM SONG RETURNS SUNDAY** Last year's champion two-year-old filly **Storm Song** (Summer Squall) makes her three-year-old debut in Sunday's GIII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Park. Winner of the GI Frizette and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in her last two starts at two, the Dogwood Stable runner, trained by Nick Zito, is the 8-5 morning-line favorite for the mile-and-seventy-yard contest. Among her seven rivals in the race are **Glitter Woman** (Glitterman), 9 1/2-length winner of the GII Forward Gal S. January 22. That filly, trained by Shug McGaughey, will blow out for the race today.

**HALL OF FAME TRAINER TROTSEK DEAD** Trainer Harry Trotsek, who saddled nearly 100 stakes winners during a career that spanned seven decades, died Wednesday at Doctors Hospital in Coral Gables, Florida after a brief illness. He was 83. After taking out his trainer's license when he was just 21 years old, Trotsek conditioned four champions, including 1954 Preakness winner Hasty Road and 1965 Horse of the Year Moccasin. Moccasin, the champion two-year-old filly of that year, is still the only two-year-old filly ever to be named Horse of the Year; only two juvenile colts--Native Dancer and Secretariat--have been so honored. The native of Illinois also developed champions Oil Capital and Stan; he was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1984.

Last year's three-year-old champ **Skip Away** (Skip Trial) will be making his four-year-old debut here off a series of bullet works at Gulfstream. The gray last raced Oct. 5 at Belmont, defeating the great Cigar by a head in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. His main challenges in the Donn are expected to come from **Mecke** (Maudlin), winner of the GIII Mac Diarmida H. over Gulfstream's sloppy main track Jan. 12, and **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), away from the races since his fifth-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Woodbine Oct. 26. Others to watch in this strong field include 1996 Canadian Horse of the Year **Mt. Sassafras** (Mt. Livermore), who missed by only 3/4-length when fourth in last year's Breeders' Cup Classic, and **Crafty Friend** (Crafty Prospector), first or second in his last six starts, including a victory in the GIII Broward H. at Gulfstream January 11.

**Donthelumbertrader** (John Casey), a former claimer who missed beating Grade I winner Awad by only a nose last out January 24, shattered the course record for "about one mile" at Gulfstream yesterday. Sent off at 7-5 in the day's ninth race, a \$50,000 allowance test, the four-year-old led from gate to wire to win by 3 1/2 lengths in the time of 1:34, three-fifths faster than the old mark set by Doublethebettwice just 27 days ago. The course continued to play fast in the next race as multiple graded-stakes winner **Green Means Go** (Green Dancer), the 3-5 chalk in the 10th race, eked out a nose decision in the course record-equaling time of 1:47 1/5 for "about a mile and an eighth" in another \$50,000 allowance.

**Florida Report cont.****Local News: Calder Race Course**

Calder Race Course has reached a two-year agreement, with a one-year extension, with the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association which calls for the horsemen and the track to split all revenues from on-track and off-track handle 50-50.

The track, however, is not in accord with the Palm Beach Kennel Club and is suing that company over the breakage from the summer Calder and fall Tropical Park meetings. Calder claims it is owed \$30,000. Wilber Brewton, council for Calder, filed suit in Leon County Thursday, and said, "We don't think the last legislative session gave them the right to keep the breakage for themselves. They've withheld the money from us, and we feel this is the only way we can retrieve it."
