DUBAI SHORT LIST RELEASED Following a meeting of the Dubai World Cup Committee, the list of 115 nominees to the March 29 \$4 million race has been cut to 24 possible entrants. The chairman of the committee, Michael Osborne said, "The Dubai World Cup Committee has been delighted by both the quality and number of entries for the Dubai World Cup in 1997, with so many representing champions from different continents. We anticipate that the 1997 Dubai World Cup will match the impact and excitement of 1996's inaugural event and establish yet again the world's champion middle distance crown on sand." The horses remaining eligible are, **Annus Mirabilis (Fr)** (Warning {GB}), **Bijou d'Inde (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), **Carling (Fr)** (Garde Royale {Ire}), **Doriemus (NZ)** (Norman Pentaquad), **Editor's Note** (Forty Niner), **Even Top (Ire)** (Topanoora {Ire}), **Flemensfirth** (Alleged), **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois), **Gothenberg (Ire)** (Polish Patriot), **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King), **Hokuto Vega (Jpn)** (Nagurski), **Juggler (Aus)** (Jugah), **Key of Luck** (Chief's Crown), **Luso (GB)** (Salse), **Marlin** (Sword Dance {Ire}), **Mecke** (Maudlin), **Needle Gun (Ire)** (Sure Blade), **Singspiel (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}), **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}), **Sorbie Tower (Ire)**, (Soviet Lad), **Tamayaz** (Gone West), **Tamhid** (Gulch) and **Victory Speech** (Deputy Minister).

ALLIED FORCES SOLD TO GODOLPHIN **Allied Forces** (Miswaki), a winner of four stakes in the U.S. last year, including the GII Pegasus Breeders' Cup H., GII Jamaica H. and GIII Lamplighter H., has been sold to Godolphin and will compete this year in England. The four-year-old was previously owned by Ahmed Al-Tayer and trained by Kiaran McLaughlin. "They made a business decision to sell him, which hurts me, but that's the way it goes," McLaughlin said. "This is a business." Allied Forces previously raced in England as a two-year-old, winning the listed Child & Co. Superlative S. and finishing second to champion **Alhaarth (Ire)** (Unfuwain) in the G3 Lanson Champagne Vintage S. McLaughlin also reported that his handicap horse **Key of Luck** (Chief's Crown) is nearing a return to the races and may start March 9 in Dubai. The trainer is hopeful he can have the six-year-old ready for the March 29 Dubai World Cup. Last year, Key of Luck won the Dubai Duty Free Reserves Race on the Dubai World Cup undercard by 20 lengths before travelling to the U.S. and finishing second in the GI Pimlico Special.

RACE WAGERING DECLINES IN KENTUCKY

For the first time in 11 years, the total number of dollars wagered on horse racing in Kentucky declined last year, according to an article by Kirsten Haukebo in yesterday's *Louisville Courier-Journal*. The \$658.4 million that was bet last year, on both live racing and simulcasting on out-of-state races, was \$14.1 million less than was bet in 1995--a drop of 2.1 percent. Turfway Park suffered the worst decline, losing \$20 million in handle, including \$11 million on its live racing. "We've got to realize that all of a sudden our numbers are going to start falling," Jerry Carroll, chairman of the Florence, Kentucky track told the *Courier-Journal*. "The competition is much more severe than anything we've ever had." Turfway Park faces competition from two nearby Ohio riverboat casinos. The state's year-end total handle also suffered from the closure of Dueling Grounds in Franklin, Kentucky. Despite the overall drop, Keeneland Racecourse in Lexington recorded a two percent rise in betting on live races last year.

RECORD-BREAKING TRF STALLION SEASON

AUCTION The sale topper at this year's record-breaking annual auction of stallion seasons for the benefit of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (TRF) February 1 was a season to Gulch, standing at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, and purchased by Respite Farm in Maryland for \$53,000. "I was very happy to bid more than the stallion's farm price for such a worth cause," said Michael Cavey, owner and operator of Respite Farm. "The evening's equine beneficiaries deserve our support and also I believe it's a good value." A season to Marquetry also sold for more than the farm price, going to high telephone bidder Dudley Horner of Hidden Cabin Farm in Versailles, Kentucky for \$11,700. The sale drew an enthusiastic crowd of more than 300 to TRF directors Herb and Ellen Moelis' Candyland Farm in Middletown, Delaware, to bid on 165 stallions, equine art and other items. Now in its seventh year, the event surpassed all previous sales, with proceeds of approximately \$400,000.

VISA THREE-YEAR-OLD CHAMPIONSHIP

EXPANDED The Thoroughbred Racing Associations, Triple Crown Productions and Visa USA, jointly announced yesterday the creation of competitions for champion trainer and jockey in conjunction with the 1997 Visa Three-Year-Old Championship Series. The trainers and jockeys of horses earning points in the series, will accrue the same number of points in their own accounts. The champion trainer and jockey will each receive a commemorative trophy and the three-year-old champion will have his name added to the Visa trophy kept on permanent display at the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs. The series, comprised of 44 stakes events at 21 TRA tracks, began this year with the GIII Spectacular Bid S. at Gulfstream and will conclude with the GI Travers S. at Saratoga. After four races, **Confide** (Phone Trick) leads the horse division with 10 points. Trainer Ben Perkins, Sr. and jockey Mike Smith also lead their divisions with 10 points each.

Topocilla set a new stakes record, bettering the mark of 2:14 2/5 set by P.J. Floral in 1995. "I told Brian (jockey, Peck), don't let Ampulla be on top of you at the three-eighths pole," explained trainer Herbert Miller. "She has a better kick than us. I told him to turn her loose, get the jump on her. And that's what happened." The mare will now be pointed towards the GII Orchid H. March 16 at Gulfstream.
