### ALPHABET SOUP INJURED, OUT OF BIG 'CAP

**Alphabet Soup** (Cozzene), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic last October, will miss the \$1 million GI Santa Anita H. after suffering an ankle injury, trainer David Hofmans announced Thursday afternoon. "He wrenched his left front ankle," Hofmans said. "With an injury like this we have to be cautious, so we've decided not to run in the Big 'Cap." Hofmans believes the injury may have occurred during the running of the February 2 San Antonio H., where Alphabet Soup closed strongly to finish second to **Gentlemen (Arg)** (Robin des Bois). "(Jockey) Chris (McCarron) said that at the half-mile pole, he ducked in and felt something," Hofmans explained. "But then he seemed all right. He was fine for the next couple of days after the race, but when we took him back to the track, his ankle filled up. We X-rayed it and the scans showed that everything checked out, but the ankle is definitely wrenched." The San Antonio was Alphabet Soup's only start so far this year and brought his record to 10 wins, three seconds and six thirds from 24 starts for earnings of \$2,990,270. Hofmans indicated that the grey will miss at least the next three weeks of training.

### PULPIT TO START IN FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

**Pulpit** (A.P. Indy), who may be racing's fastest rising star, will make his next start in the February 22 GI Fountain of Youth at Gulfstream, trainer Frank Brothers confirmed yesterday. The race will come just two weeks after Pulpit collected his second career victory, easily winning a February 8 allowance race by 6 3/4 lengths. "With everything else in life, you've got to make decisions," Brothers said. "There are pros and cons with all our options. We weighed all our options and decided this was the way to go." Brothers agreed that it will be a huge step up in class for Pulpit, who has had just two lifetime starts. "This is probably one of the toughest decisions I've made in a while," he said. "It's a huge step up for a young horse who has no experience and has had two strolls in the park. Now he's going in with the wolves. I think he's a pretty good colt and now it's time to see how he handles adversity." Though the Fountain of Youth is expected to attract many of the top three-year-olds on the East Coast, Pulpit will likely be the favorite. Also on the list of 11 late nominations to the Fountain of Youth are, **Hello (Ire)** (Lycius), **Mud Route** (Strawberry Road {Aus}) and **Wrightwood** (Seattle Slew).

**AMERICANS ACCEPT DUBAI CHALLENGE** Two runners currently based in Florida will accept the challenge to take on the best in the world in the Dubai World Cup March 29. **Formal Gold** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), winner of the GI Donn H. last out, and **Mecke** (Maudlin), third in that event, will fly out of Miami in mid-March. Formal Gold will first ship to California for the GI Santa Anita H. March 2, returning to his base at Hialeah before shipping to the Middle East. As for Mecke, trainer Manny Tortora said, "I'm going to send him in the Gulfstream Park H. (GI, March 1) and then send him to Dubai March 16. His owner, James Lewis, and myself will fly over a couple of days later." Formal Gold will share the plane with Mecke.

**BIG 3 WAGER ANNOUNCED** Officials at Aqueduct, Oaklawn and Keeneland agreed yesterday to package three of the nations premier three-year-old races and form a national wager called the Big 3 Pick 3, encompassing the GI Wood Memorial, GI Arkansas Derby and GI Toyota Blue Grass S. The Wood, shown live on ABC-TV, kicks off the innovative wager, to be followed by the Arkansas Derby and Toyota Blue Grass S. live on ESPN. Post times are 4:37, 5:20, and 5:45 (EDT) on April 12. "The opportunity to present three quality stakes which share a common three-year-old theme adds to the overall excitement of a great day of racing," said Bill Nader, Aqueduct Director of Simulcasting. "A national, commingled pool heightens the pari-mutuel appeal." Aqueduct will serve as the simulcast and wagering hub with a \$1 minimum bet for the Big 3 Pick 3. New York wagering rules will govern the bet.

**FIRST FOAL FOR POSSIBLY PERFECT** Champion Turf mare **Possibly Perfect** (Northern Baby)'s first foal was born Tuesday, February 11. The colt is by Gone West. Possibly Perfect was voted the Champion Turf Mare of 1995 after winning that year's GI Beverly D., GI Ramona H. and GI Gamely H. In addition, the seven-year-old mare won the 1993 GI Yellow Ribbon Invitational and 1994 GI Santa Barbara H. and GI Santa Ana H. Possibly Perfect, who raced 18 times for 11 wins, two seconds and four thirds for earnings of \$1,377,273, will be bred back to Gone West.

Hialeah Park President John J. Brunetti, Jr. has announced a reduction in the track's pari-mutuel takeout for the upcoming race meeting beginning March 17. Takeout on win, place and show wagering drops two percent, from 23 last year to 21, and all daily double and perfecta pools drop three percent from 28 to 25. Takeout on bet threes and trifectas will increase from 28 percent to 30 percent this year. "We are responding to requests from our many simulcast outlets and our on-track patrons by reducing the takeout," Brunetti said. "Competition in the marketplace in this expanding era of simulcasting requires competitive pricing in all aspects of racetrack operations." The Hialeah Park meet will run through May 22.

Dual champion jockey Frankie Dettori and **Kammtarra** (Zilzal) won Round One of the Sheikh Maktoum Al Maktoum Challenge over a mile at Dubai's Nad Al Sheba racecourse Thursday. Dettori had been expected to partner Hammerstein, but, when the colt had to be withdrawn, he switched over to Kammtarra and the combination scored by 4 1/2 lengths. Kammtarra, half-brother to the 1995 Epsom Derby and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Lammtarra, drew clear to beat **Kassbaan** (Alydar) with **Wathik** (Ogygian) back in third. Mark Johnston's **Gothenberg (Ire)** (Polish Patriot) finished fourth.

Connections of the 1996 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King) will ask the organizers of the \$4 million Dubai World Cup for extra time in which to make their decision on whether the four-year-old colt will run in the mile-and-a-quarter event on March 29. Owner Enrique Sarasola's racing manager Bruno Ridoux said, "We wish Helissio could train in a quieter place. His participation on ground which will not suit him is an audacious bet and he cannot make the jump without an ideal preparation."

Coolmore Stud is undertaking its first-ever sponsorship in Dubai Sunday, February 16. Already sponsors of Group 1 races in Ireland and Australia, Coolmore is contributing \$50,000 towards the prize money of two races on Sunday's card at Dubai's Nad Al Sheba Racecourse and will also present specially commissioned trophies to the winning owners, trainers and jockeys of the two events.
