"CAT" RAZOR SHARP IN LAS VIRGENES Proving herself the best three-year-old filly on the West Coast, if not in the country, Sharp Cat (Storm Cat) toyed with the field in vesterday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita. Hard held off the early pace of Queen Of Money (Corporate Report), who was herself riding a two-race winning streak, the 1-5 favorite took jockey Corey Nakatani to the lead on the far turn; she left her rivals in the dust despite lugging in, then ducking out under Nakatani's left-handed whip, causing her rider to momentarily lose his right iron. "I guess you could say you can almost fall off of her and still win," quipped Nakatani. "She is just unbelievable. When I lost my balance in the stretch, she was going to the inside. I was trying to keep her attention--I didn't want to hit her, but she kept going in and I didn't want her to go too far. Then, all of a sudden, she just ducked." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas was more than pleased with the performance. "I thought the whole thing was a solid, solid effort on her part," he remarked. "She's been getting better. She put on 150 pounds over the winter and I think it's all in the right places." As for the future, Lukas said, "We're dealing with a high-profile and excitable owner here (Ahmed bin Salman) that enjoys the game-they're the best kind, the sky's the limit. They took a hell of a swing at the fence when they bought her and it's turning out. We're certainly going to run her back in the Oaks (GI Santa Anita Oaks, March 9) and then we'll go from there."

TURFWAY SHUT DOWN AGAIN Live racing at Turfway Park had to be canceled both Friday night and Saturday afternoon due to unsafe track conditions. Heavy snowfall combined with fluctuating temperatures have caused the track to freeze at night and then thaw during the day. Jockeys refused to ride Friday evening after the horses were on the track for the first race; officials called off Saturday's program. "Our first priority has been and always will be the safety of our horses and jockeys," said Turfway spokesman Damon Thayer. "We apologize to our fans who came to the races (Friday) only to have them canceled. It was a major inconvenience for them, which we regret, but unfortunately the situation was out of our control." Turfway's Race Book remained open for simulcasting; live action is expected to resume this afternoon. The Florence, Kentucky track has now lost 10 days to cancellations this year.

Looking for her third straight after taking the GI Hollywood Starlet to end her juvenile campaign and the Santa Ysabel to start 1997, Sharp Cat was 1-5 and did not let her backers down. The top class filly allowed QUEEN OF MONEY (Corporate Report) to set the pace through three-quarters in 1:09 4/5, then took command and asserted herself as the best in the west with yet another powerful score despite running somewhat erratically through the stretch. "In all fairness to (jockey Corey Nakatani), she's not easy to ride," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas of the stretch drive which saw Sharp Cat first lug in, then duck out sharply when Nakatani tried to correct her with a left-handed stick. "She can have a mind of her own--she's a Storm Cat and they are temperamental. You have to kind of finesse them. You just don't force them to do anything. They resent you trying to." Nakatani was nearly unseated when his mount ducked, but regained his right iron and the pair went on to an easy score. Said jockey Alex Solis on runner-up High Heeled Hope, "We might have beaten (Sharp Cat) if Corey had fallen off, but I'm not so sure of that." Added her trainer, Randy Bradshaw, "From here, you look to ship and stay away from (Sharp Cat). Then we might be all right." Trainer Bob Baffert, who saddled fourth-place finisher Queen of Money, agreed. "We'll probably just head out of here and get the hell away from her," he said of the winner.

The Fort-Worth Star Telegram reports that Trinity Meadows, the beleaguered track in Willow Park, Texas, has been posted for foreclosure. Investors Larry Lawley and his son Curtis have twice saved the track from being sold at public auction, putting up some \$1.5 million in December and an additional \$500,000 later in the month. The Lawleys have scheduled the sale of the facility for March 4 in an effort to "bring this project to a head, to give everybody involved a time line," Larry Lawley told the Star Telegram. When Trinity Meadows closed last August 6, it was believed to be \$1.7 million in debt, but that number may be up to \$700,000 higher. The Lawleys have been committed to keeping the track open; they have until April 1 to present a plan that will do so to the Texas Racing Commission.
