JEWEL PRINCESS REIGNS IN RETURN

Making her first start since capturing the older filly crown with her win in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff last October 26, Eclipse Award winner Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint) was sent off the even-money choice in the GI Santa Maria H. at Santa Anita vesterday and rallied like a champion to win by a widening five lengths. The win gave Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corp, which owns Jewel Princess in partnership with Richard and Martha Stephen, it's second Grade I win of the weekend, following Sharp Cat's score in the GI Las Virgenes Saturday. Said jockey Corey Nakatani, who rode both fillies, of Jewel Princess, "She worked really good the other day and I knew she would be ready for this. Sometimes you don't want to let the cat out of the bag and let people know that she really is ready...so we tried to be as guiet as possible. She's such a tremendous mare." Trainer Wally Dollase was also confident going into the race. "I thought I had her pretty darn good," he said. "I hate before a race to say I've never seen her better, but after the race I can say I've never seen her in better condition than she is right now. There's a lot of people to thank--the chiropractor who works on her, the veterinarian that does a terrific job, and my children, who love her to death. She's responding--she's a happy horse." Dollase added that his champ would likely make her next start in the GI Santa Margarita H. March 9.

EASY BREEZE FOR SKIP AWAY Last year's champion three-year-old Skip Away (Skip Trial), runner-up in the GI Donn H. in his four-year-old bow, worked six furlongs in an easy 1:15 2/5 in the slop at Gulfstream yesterday morning. "We went a slow three-quarters around the dogs with him," said trainer Sonny Hine. "He was crying out to breeze. He tried to run off (Saturday); he's so full of himself. He's doing everything great. So far, so good." The colt will make his next start in the GI Gulfstream Park H. March 1.

FLYING CHEVRON TO GLENCREST GISW Flying Chevron (Carson City), winner of five of his 12 career starts and \$383,610, has been retired and will stand the 1997 breeding season at Glencrest Farm in Midway, Kentucky. The five-year-old had a stellar season at three, capturing the mile-and-a-sixteenth GII Pegasus H. over three-year-olds and the GI NYRA Mile over a top field of older horses; the Kentucky-bred was also second, beaten just a head by Lite The Fuse, in last year's GI Carter H. at seven furlongs. Flying Chevron will stand as the property of a syndicate for the fee of \$7,500, live foal.

BIG 'CAP DEVELOPMENTS GISW Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}), an allowance winner at Santa Anita January 26, worked a mile in a bullet 1:36 4/5 Sunday at Hollywood as he gets ready for the GI Santa Anita H. March 2...trainer D. Wayne Lukas looks for improvement from last year's GI Belmont S. winner Editor's Note (Forty Niner), who ran ninth in the GI Strub February 2, his first start since the Breeders' Cup. "We're getting him a little tighter this time," said Lukas. "He should benefit from his last race, even though I'm throwing it out. He had his tongue over the bit and did some things that compromised him, but he's doing good now." Lukas will skip the Big 'Cap with Strub winner Victory Speech (Deputy Minister), and instead send the four-year-old to face Skip Away in the GI Gulfstream Park H. March 1....GSW Chequer (Mr. Prospector), who will be making his first start since running seventh in the GI NYRA Mile last November in the Big 'Cap, worked a bullet seven furlongs in 1:26 3/5 at Hollywood... Zanferrier (Lyphard), fourth in the Strub, worked five furlongs in 1:01 3/5 yesterday morning at Santa Anita.

MOUAWAD CAPTURES AUSTRALIAN GUINEAS

Mouawad (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}, by *Sir Tristram), the three-year-old full-brother to 1995/96 Australian Horse Of The Year Octagonal, captured Saturday's G1 Cadbury Australian Guineas over a mile at Flemington in Melbourne. Starting the 10-9 favourite after four wins from his five previous lifetime starts, Mouawad, an \$315,400 yearling purchase, led all the way to score by an easy two lengths from the previously unbeaten O'Reilly (NZ) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), bringing his lifetime earnings to \$264,987. Winning trainer Clarrie Conners said: "I didn't want Mouawad to lead, but I told his jockey Grant Cooksley to go forward and see what happens. He looked for a moment like he was finished when they got to him, but he found another gear. He's a beautiful horse to train and relaxes really well. He's a great horse, probably the best I've trained." Considering Conners trained former Horse Of The Year Research (Aus) and the two juvenile champions Tierce (Aus) and Burst (Aus), that is praise indeed. "The first day I let this horse go, I knew he was good," he said. Conners and Mouawad's part-owner and manager Rob McAnulty are reluctant to take on the Bart Cummings-trained Saintly (Aus) in the G1 Australian Cup at Flemington on March 10 and instead look set to send Mouawad for the G1 \$788,520 Doncaster H. over a mile on March 29, in which the colt has only 112 pounds to carry. "In the longer term, we will aim him for the Cox Plate, which his full-brother Octagonal won in 1995," said McAnulty.

JUGGLER SET FOR DUBAI WORLD CUP Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}, by *Sir Tristram) made his first start since last November when tackling the G2 Apollo S. over seven furlongs at Warwick Farm in Sydney Saturday, but he was beaten by three-quarters of a length by the Gai Waterhouse-trained 4-6 favourite Juggler (Aus) (Jugah, by Northern Dancer), who will start in the G1 Australian Cup March 10 before going to Dubai for the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 29. But first Waterhouse plans to run Juggler in next Saturday's G1 Chipping Norton S. over a mile at Warwick Farm. "The horse is not fully fit yet, but he'll be fully fit by next week--and for Dubai," said the trainer.
