March 2. "The work was good, but I think the turf course was a little dry and hard this morning," said his trainer, Bob Baffert. "So it wasn't quite as good as I'd hoped." Baffert added that he is more concerned about the quality of the competition and the fitness of his Big 'Cap starter than the switch from turf to dirt. "It's going to be a tough race for my horse," he admitted. "It's a tough field. I'm just worried about his conditioning. This will be only his second start of the year." GI Donn H. winner Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) is scheduled to arrive Friday, February 28. The four-year-old worked a half in :48 at Gulfstream Tuesday and will breeze once more before he ships west. Two contenders worked at Santa Anita Wednesday, with MGISW Marlin (Sword Dance {Ire}) going six furlongs in a bullet 1:11 1/5 and Just Java (Java Gold), third in the event last year, zipping fiveeighths in :59 1/5. Late nominations for the \$1 million Big 'Cap, first leg of the \$4.8 million MGM Grand Classic Crown, close today. The supplementary fee is \$25,000, with \$5,000 due today and an additional \$20,000 to be paid at the time of entry.

SILVER CHARM MAY MISS SAN RAFAEL Silver Charm (Silver Buck), winner of the San Vicente S. February 8 in his first start of the season, has developed a temperature and may be forced to miss the San Rafael S. March 2. "He had a 102.4 degree fever Wednesday," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He's normal (Thursday), but it depends on how many days I'm going to rest him as far as running in the race. He looks bright, but his white blood cell count was a little elevated. With something like this, I'm taking no chances." If the grey colt does skip the San Rafael, Baffert said he would instead be pointed for the San Felipe S. March 16.

HICKEY CASE TO ILLINOIS SUPREME COURT?

The First District Court of Appeals has dismissed the one-year suspension imposed by the Illinois Racing Board on owner/trainer Noel Hickey for six alleged medication violations at Arlington International Racecourse in July and August of 1994. But while the Board maintains the original six-month penalty handed down by the stewards after six of Hickey's horses tested positive for the bronchial dilator albuterol is still in effect and should be instituted immediately, Hickey and his attorney insist the latest ruling ends the case. The Court of Appeals found that the nine-member Board needed a majority ruling--five votes--in order to suspend a license; the six members present at Hickey's appeal hearing voted 4-2 to double the horseman's suspension, one shy of the required number. After the court's ruling was announced, IRB Executive Director Joe Sinopoli said, "The original six-month decision was unaltered by the court's decision and the Board will enforce that suspension immediately." But Art Engelland, Hickey's attorney, countered, "The Board has the right to appeal to the Illinois Supreme Court. It does not have the right to restore the stewards' original ruling. Once there is an appeal, the stewards' ruling becomes moot." Neither Hickey nor Engelland had received official notification of the Board's intention to enforce the original suspension as of Thursday evening. The Board is considering taking the case to State Supreme Court.

The six-year-old Oklahoma-bred gelding broke down after finishing ninth as the favorite in the GI Met Mile in May, 1995, but came back to the races last October and finished sixth in the Remington Park Sprint Championship H. in what would be his last start. The four-time graded stakes winner was also second to Cigar in the 1995 GI Oaklawn H. "He gave us plenty of thrills," trainer Kenny Smith told the Form, "but the one race we'll never forget was his second to Cigar in the Oaklawn H. I've never seen a horse show as much courage and determination as he did that day."

ELMENDORF BROODMARES TO STONERSIDE

Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside Farm in Paris. Kentucky has purchased the entire broodmare band from Jack Kent Cooke's Elmendorf Farm. John Adger, the McNair's racing and bloodstock manager, declined to disclose the price of the 35 mares and six sucklings, but said the deal was finalized February 14. Included in the purchase were Continental Girl (Transworld), dam of GISW and millionaire Flying Continental; Devil's Flirt (Devil's Bag), a half-sister to Classic winner Colonial Affair in foal to Pleasant Colony; and Highland Tide (Highland Blade), a half-sister to two graded stakes winners in foal to Storm Bird. The mares and their foals have been shipped to Stonerside. Approximately 10 of the former Elmendorf mares will be bred back to Strodes Creek, who finished second in the 1994 Kentucky Derby for the McNairs; in his second year at stud, the six-year-old stands at Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky.
