**ORDWAY TO GOTHAM** Ordway (Salt Lake) has left Gulfstream Park for the cooler climes of Belmont Park and will be pointed toward the March 29 Gotham S., trainer Dave Donk told *Daily Racing Form*. Last year's GI Champagne S. winner will spend 10 days at the Middleburg (Va.) Training Center and arrive at Belmont a week from Sunday, according to the *Form*. "I just felt I needed to get him back into the cooler weather as soon as possible," Donk told the *Form*. "A lot of horses just don't do well in the heat and humidity of Florida. Since the Wood was always one of our objectives, we decided it made sense to use the Gotham to get him there. That way he can train over his home course the entire time." Ordway finished eighth in the Hutcheson in his only Florida start and his only race this year.

**BRITISH JOCKEYS ESCAPE PUNISHMENT** After a two-day Jockey Club Disciplinary Committee meeting held Wednesday and Thursday, 20 of the 21 jockeys who failed to ride in the second race at Haydock Park in England October 16 were exonerated and none were handed any punishment. The authorities found that "there was no collective decision to refuse to ride." They also found that the Haydock Park stewards' decision to race was a proper one and that the course was safe for racing. Jockey Club procedure rules state that the jockeys should be informed of such a decision from the stewards before it is announced on the public address system, but this did not happen on this occasion. Only former champion jockey Frankie Dettori was found guilty of a breach of the rules, having communicated to the stewards that he was not prepared to ride again that day due to fears about his own safety. It was decided that his reasons were not "acceptable" under the current rules of racing. However, he escaped punishment from the authorities due to "the unique circumstances."

**Pulpit** (A.P. Indy) wired the field in his first two starts, but whether he'll open up daylight early on today's group remains anyone's guess. "He's a fast horse," said trainer Frank Brothers. "He's going to be in the race early no matter where you put him." The colt will have company on the front end in his stakes debut. **Confide** (Phone Trick) set the pace before falling three-quarters of a length short in the GII Danka Hutcheson S. last out, while **Arthur L.** (Ocala Slew) went wire-to-wire in the GIII Holy Bull S. in his three-year-old bow. More than anything, Brothers hopes to come away from the race with some answers. "I'd hate to walk away thinking he burned himself out in a fast pace or something, because he is a young horse and that could happen," said Brothers. "Whether I'm right or wrong, I'd like to walk away saying he deserves to be with these horses and go on to the next level."

Several of Australia's best juveniles will be in this first G1 two-year-old race of the season, including **Schubert (Aust)** (Salieri), the present favourite for next month's \$1,587,301 Golden Slipper at Rosehill in Sydney. The colt established his credentials with an impressive debut win in the Listed Talindert S. over five furlongs at Sandown in Melbourne Feb. 1. Taking on Schubert is **Millward (NZ)** (Defensive Play), who has won his last two starts, the G2 Silver Slipper S. and the recent G2 Blue Diamond Prelude over five and a half furlongs at Caulfield Feb. 8. Also in the field is **Rose Of Danehill (Aust)** (Danehill), who impressed many in the G2 Blue Diamond Prelude for fillies over five and a half furlongs at Caulfield the same day in a faster time than Millward.

Australia's hope for the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 29, the Gai Waterhouse-trained gelding **Juggler (Aust)** (Jugah), faces only four opponents here, but that opposition includes the 1995/96 Horse Of The Year **Octagonal (NZ)** (Zabeel) and the multiple G1 winner earlier this season, **Filante (NZ)** (Star Way {GB}). **TURFWAY TO BE WORLD CUP HUB** For the second straight year, Turfway Park will act as simulcast hub for the Dubai World Cup March 29, with all wagers bet through the Florence, Kentucky track. American racetracks still will sign contracts with Arlington Park, the race's American representative, to take wagers but Arlington is closed at that time of year and is not permitted to act as hub. The World Cup will be televised as part of ESPN's Jim Beam telecast that same day on a tape-delayed basis during the 6 - 7 p.m. Eastern show. Wagering will also be available on the Dubai Duty Free, with post time scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Eastern. Post time for the World Cup is set for 11:15 a.m.

**McPEEK RESTS CASE WITHOUT DEFENSE**

Trainer Ken McPeek has rested his case before a court of administrative law without presenting a defense, according to *Daily Racing Form*. McPeek was suspended 30 days by the Meadowlands stewards when a horse he trained, Mean Doris Jean, fractured a cannon bone in a race at the Meadowlands Sept. 17, 1993. New Jersey Racing Commissioner Frank Zanzuccki later extended that suspension to one year. "Our position is that the state has failed to sustain its burden of proof, and the case should be dismissed on the merits," McPeek's attorney, Dennis Drazin, told the *Form*.

**FOUR NEW MEMBERS TO NTA BOARD**

The National Thoroughbred Association announced the addition of four prominent Thoroughbred owners and businessmen to the NTA Policy Board. The new members are: Stuart Janney III, Robert Lewis, Stanley Gumberg and Paul Oreffice. Gaines, one of the founders of the NTA. "These four very highly qualified individuals certainly meet our requirements and bring a broad range of experience and background to the NTA board."

**BREEDERS' CUP FOAL NOMINATIONS UP** Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited have announced the greatest increase in foal nominations to the Breeders' Cup program in nine years and an increase in stallion revenues with the influx of 174 new stallions to the program, led by Cigar. A total of 11,959 foals by Breeders' Cup nominated stallions were registered to the Breeders' Cup last year, representing a 13.4% increase over 1995 and marking the highest number of foals nominated since 1987, when 12,183 foals were registered. Total revenue generated by the 1996 foal crop was \$5,979,500. The bulk of the increase came through the nomination of 907 foals by European Breeders Fund stallions, nominated through the new Breeders' Cup cross-registration agreement with the EBF put into place last year.
