MUD ROUTE FORCED TO MISS DERBY The sore left shin that forced California speedster Mud Route (Strawberry Road {Aus}) out of this Sunday's GII San Rafael S., will also force him to miss the Kentucky Derby, according to a report in Daily Racing Form. Trainer Ron McAnally became aware of the injury after Mud Route's seven-furlong work at Santa Anita Sunday morning. McAnally estimated the three-year-old would miss 40 days of training. "This horse is really something special," he told the Form. "The way he does things is unbelievable. It's really a shame."

VIDEO LOTTERY TERMINALS TO NEW YORK

RACETRACKS? New York racetracks would get slot machine-style video gambling games under a proposed state law that sponsors said Tuesday is aimed solely at helping the horse racing industry, according to the Daily Racing Form. Off-track betting parlors and other locations where gambling is legal would not be eligible for the new video machines, said Assemblyman David Townsend, whose district includes both Vernon Downs racetrack and the Native Americanowned Turning Stone Casino. "Clearly, our state racetrack industry needs our assistance, and it needs it now," Townsend told the Form, citing dropoffs in business at Vernon Downs, Yonkers Raceway and Saratoga Racecourse. Under the plan, all tracks would be eligible for the machines, which would be operated by the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. The state Constitution forbids slot machines, but sponsors believe the video machines would be legal because winners would collect a credit slip rather than cash. The slips could be exchanged for money. Sponsors said 80 to 90 percent of the money bet would be paid out in prizes, with tracks retaining two to 12 percent. The state would levy an eight percent tax.

IRS STILL AFTER DEVIL HIS DUE The Internal Revenue Service will get another chance to contest the ownership of MGISW Devil His Due, according to a report by Dave Grening on Thoroughbred Times on-line. A three-judge panel of the Second Circuit Court of Appeals in Manhattan has vacated a previous decision in favor of Edith LiButti, owner of Devil His Due, and remanded the case back to U.S. District Court Judge Thomas McAvoy. The judge is expected to hear the case in about 90 days. Devil His Due, an earner of \$3,920,405 during his racing career and now standing at Margaux Farm in Midway, Kentucky, was seized by the IRS in August of 1994 as part of a \$4.39-million tax lien accessed against Lion Crest Stable owner Edith LiButti, as nominee for her father, Robert, a convicted tax evader. The IRS filed suit against Lion Crest Stable and lost when McAvoy ruled that Edith LiButti was the sole owner of the horse.

Acting in response to an attempt by the Illinois Racing Board to restore the original 1994 suspension handed to Noel Hickey by Arlington stewards, the Illinois District Court of Appeals has vacated last week's order and is scheduled to issue a new opinion on the owner/trainer's status March 5. The stewards originally suspended Hickey for 180 days after six of his horses tested positive for the prohibited medication albuterol. But when Hickey exercised his right of appeal, the Racing Board voted 4-2 to increase the penalty to one year. Hickey took the Board to court and Feb. 19 the one-year suspension was reversed by the First District Court of Appeals because the nine-member Board "Failed to achieve the required majority" of five votes in a case involving a license suspension. However, Joe Sinopoli, executive director of the Racing Board, is arguing that "The original six-month suspension was unaltered by the court's decision." Meanwhile, a stay order is in effect, allowing Hickey to continue training pending the March 5 decision.
