MECKE RETIRED Mecke (Maudlin) has been retired from racing after his connections discovered the five-year-old was sufferering from a deterioration of his right front cannon bone, trainer Manny Tortora announced yesterday. The GI winner on turf and dirt finished third in the February 8 Donn H. behind Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) and Skip Away (Skip Trial) in his last start and was being pointed to the March 29 Dubai World Cup. Tortora said that he had noticed a filling in the leg and elected to pass this weekend's Gulfstream Park Handicap, hoping it was simply an inflammation and would subside. "Our veterinarian took X-rays (Wednesday), sent them to Kentucky and they confirmed this was a deteriorated joint," said Tortora. "It's the kind of thing horses don't come back from. We think it became serious in the Donn Handicap." Mecke will be sent to Farnsworth Farms in Ocala, Florida where he will stand an abbreviated 1997 season. No stud fee has vet been determined. Tortora said that owner James Lewis Jr. will entertain offers for the horse when this year's breeding season is over. Purchased as a twoyear-old at the OBS March sale for \$40,000, Mecke won 12 of 40 starts, including GI victories in the Arlington Million, Super Derby and Early Times Turf Classic, amassing earnings of \$2,460,280, fifth on the all-time list of Florida-bred earners.

TROPICOOL TRIUMPHANT IN DUBAI Tropicool (Carr de Naskra) went wire-to-wire to win Thursday night's Round Two of the Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum Challenge at Nad al Sheba Racecourse in Dubai. The New York-bred four-year-old colt set a new track record in winning the 1 1/8-mile event, and is expected to contest the \$4 million Dubai World Cup March 29. Finishing second in Thursday's challenge was the Canadian-bred five-year-old Tamayaz (Gone West). Tropicool, a \$42,000 Keeneland November weanling, was also offered for sale at the 1995 Fasig-Tipton Florida Calder Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale by the consignment of Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent for Bailey-Ellenberg Select. The bay colt earned \$214,600 racing in the U.S. at age two, winning the GII Remsen S. and finishing second in the \$100,000 Sleepv Hollow S. at Belmont. Winner of the Hialeah Juvenile S. at two, the Florida-bred is coming off a seventh-place finish in the GII Danka Hutcheson S. Feb. 3. "His sire, With Approval, was a good turf horse," Zito said. "He gets some good grass horses. So the owners (Rosuer Stables Inc.) feel we might as well try him on the turf. We'll see what happens." Trainer Dave Donk has altered the training schedule for De Casperis (Bucksplasher) heading into the Palm Beach. "I was going to work him today (Thursday), but he'll just gallop into the race," Donk said. "It's 13 days in between races, so I'm trying to be a little conservative with him." De Casperis, third in the Lord Avie S. over Gulfstream's main track Feb. 17, is undefeated in two previous starts on the grass.

AUSTRALIAN STAR SAINTLY SIDELINED Australian's champion racehorse Saintly (Aus) (Sky Chase {NZ}) has sustained a serious tendon injury, leaving his racing future in question. Trainer Bart Cummings, who also bred the horse, believes the damage is bad enough to keep the four-year-old gelding off the racetrack for the next 12 months, and perhaps permanently. Saintly, hero of both the GI Cox Plate and the GI Melbourne Cup this season, injured his right front tendon at Flemington in Melbourne Wednesday while being prepared for his much-anticipated showdown with Australian Horse Of The Year Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) in the G1 \$992,063 Australian Cup March 10, "Saintly will be out for 12 months," said Cummings. "I am not confident that he will come back to work. All we can do is let nature repair and re-scan the tendon in a year's time. It's bad luck, but I will carry on as normal and give him plenty of tender loving care." The winner of 10 of 23 lifetime starts and \$3,057,750 in purses was due to start in Saturday's G2 St George S, at Caulfield, and had been the early 4-5 favorite for the Australian Cup.

LOCHSONG PRODUCES FILLY Lochsong (GB) (Song {GB}), the champion European sprinter of 1994, has produced her first foal. The enormously popular mare, nicknamed "The Queen Of Speed" during a racing career which saw her win back-to-back renewals of Longchamp's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, delivered a chestnut filly by top sprinter Cadeaux Genereux (GB), sire of the multiple G1-winning juvenile of last year Bahamian Bounty (GB), at owner Jeff Smith's Littleton Stud in Hampshire, England late Tuesday night.

DATE CHANGE FOR KENTUCKY CUP The date for the 1997 Kentucky Cup has been moved up one week to Saturday, September 13, in order to enable the races to be featured in a one-hour program on ESPN's "Racing to the Breeders' Cup" series. The show will air from 5-6 p.m. (EST). Kentucky Cup day was originally scheduled for Sept. 20.

LAVIRCO TO STUD Lavirco (Ger) (Konigsstuhl {Ger}), winner of last year's German Derby and German highweight at 11 to 14 furlongs, has been retired to stud, according to yesterday's Racing Post. Lavirco was preparing for a 1997 campaign which was to culminate in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, but suffered a recurrence of an old injury in his right hind fetlock, according to the paper. The colt will begin stud duties next year at owner Walter Jacobs's Gestut Fahrhof in Germany. The MG1SW was victorious in six of eight career starts, earning \$968,093.
