OJC TO SELL FORT ERIE The Ontario Jockey Club's Board of Trustees has decided it is no longer financially viable to continue operating Fort Erie Race-track and so is putting the Thoroughbred track up for sale. An economic worry since 1988, the facility has suffered a decline in both business and horse population. David Willmot, president and CEO of The OJC, pointed to increased competition for gambling revenues from nearby Casino Niagara as the final factor which prompted the decision to sell, but added, "The Trustees are committed to selling Fort Erie as a going concern. It will be a condition of purchase that the buyer continues to operate Fort Erie as a racetrack." Bids for the track can be submitted until April 30; Fort Erie is scheduled to open for its centennial season May 3.

THE VID RETIRED According to a report in the *Daily Racing Form*, seven-time graded stakes winner **The Vid** (World Appeal) has been retired and will stand stud at Silverleaf Farm in Ocala, Florida. The seven-year-old Florida-bred, who captured 14 of his 40 career starts while earning \$952,426, won his last four races, including the GII Canadian Turf H. and GIII Appleton H. last year. He was off from January to July, 1996, after suffering a fractured sesamoid, returned to take a Calder allowance race July 20, then was again sidelined, this time for good. A stud fee has not yet been announced.

AUSTRALIAN SALE SHOWS GAINS William Inglis & Son's 1997 Premier Yearling Sale, held Thursday and Friday at Oaklands in Australia, concluded with a 12 percent rise in average. A total of 306 yearlings sold for a gross of \$6,589,655, an average of \$21,535. The high bid during the auction's second session came in for a colt by Naturalism (NZ) out of Coco Raffles (Aus); the grey was purchased by J. Hoare for \$78,852. "I was pleased to see a healthy increase in both average and turnover as well as an improved clearance rate," said Managing Director Reg Inglis. "There is little doubt the huge financial commitment Victorian breeders have invested in the Thoroughbred industry is beginning to show results. We will be working extremely hard to provide an even better catalogue for next year's sale and encouraging Victorian breeders to sell their entire draft in Melbourne."

Rainbow Blues (Ire) (Bluebird), runner-up in last year's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, has been on the board in all four starts since shipping to the U.S. The four-year-old captured the GII Del Mar Invitational Derby in his Stateside debut last September, then finished third in the GII Volante H. and second in the GI Hollywood Derby before returning to the winner's circle after the GII San Gabriel H. January 1. The Santa Anita Companies has reported a rise in income for the year which ended December 31, 1996. Excluding non-recurring items, combined income for 1996 was \$7,920,000 or \$.69 per share, as compared to \$7,047,000 or \$.63 per share in 1995. After taking into account several non-recurring charges and credits during the year, The Santa Anita Companies reported combined net income for 1996 of \$540,000 or \$.05 per share, compared to a combined net loss of \$27,505,000 or \$2.45 per share in 1995.

WHO'S HOT

Who's hot? Deputy Minister--that's who. During January and February, Deputy Minister tallied six unrestricted stakes winners--Always a Classic, Byars, Graceful Minister, Open Forum, Stately Star and Victory Speech (Grade I). To put that number in perspective, Deputy Minister was North America's third-leading sire (tied with Afleet and Dixieland Band) in 1996 with 12 stakes winners. He is already half-way to that total for 1997, and has now sired 48 stakes winners from his first 10 crops to race, including five champions. Just 18 years old, the stallion has elevated himself to the top level of the North American stallion ranks.

Deputy Minister also seems on his way to becoming a significant sire of sires. His first son at stud to draw attention was Silver Deputy, who sired five stakes winners from just 21 first-crop foals while standing at Windfields Farm in Ontario. That success precipitated his move to Kentucky, where he now stands at Brookdale Farm in Lexington.

Deputy Minister's next sire success was Salt Lake, North America's leading freshman sire of 1996.

The demand for Deputy Minister's sons standing in Kentucky (seven in all) for 1997 has been strong, particularly for Dehere (\$35,000), French Deputy (\$15,000) and, of course, Salt Lake (\$10,000). Silver Deputy (\$10,000), Mr Purple (\$10,000), The Prime Minister (\$5,000) and Dehere's full brother Defrere (\$5,000) have also been well received.

It is a rare occurrence when even a good sire produces a son who outperforms him at stud. But it does happen from time to time. Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning), Damascus (Sword Dancer), Sharpen Up (GB) (Atan), Blushing Groom (Fr) (Red God), Caro (Ire) (Fortino {Fr}) and Naskra (Nasram) are a few examples. Many stallions that fit this profile go on to excel as sires of sires. While Vice Regent was a fine stallion, his son, Deputy Minister, is turning out to be a cut above his old man.
