FERTILITY PROBLEMS FOR CIGAR None

of the nine mares covered by Cigar (Palace Music) who have undergone ultra-sound scans are in foal, it was announced vesterday by Ashford Stud, where the seven-year-old stallion stands. The farm, the American division of Coolmore Stud, issued a written statement which read, "Ashford Stud has announced that the results of the pregnancy tests on the first mares Cigar has covered have not been encouraging. Not long retired from racing, Cigar has only just started to cover mares and this is not an unusual problem with first-year stallions. Fertility specialists have been called in to investigate the problem and the insurance companies have been notified. The matter will be reviewed in 10 days time." Dr. Barry Simon, manager of the Versailles, Ky. farm added, "The first nine mares scanned are not in foal but we have to give the horse a chance as they are not machines." Allen Paulson, who campaigned the 1995 and '96 Horse of the Year before selling a majority interest in the stallion to Coolmore, said he was "in shock" at the news. "It's hard to imagine he wouldn't be fertile," said Paulson. "We were counting on his babies." Paulson stopped short of saying the door might be open for the champion to race again should he prove to have a permanent fertility problem. "I guess we'll see what happens. I wouldn't even want to comment on that. I'd have to think about it. I don't know." Cigar, who retired with record earnings of \$9,999,815 after a third-place finish in the October 26 Breeders' Cup Classic, stands for a 1997 stud fee of \$75,000.

RIVER DOWNS FLOODED River Downs in Cincinnati, Ohio has closed its doors to simulcasting after floodwater on the Ohio River swept over the property, leaving track offices under seven feet of water and the racebook under at least two feet. The river crested at 64.4 feet vesterday afternoon at 4 p.m., and floodwater began to recede. The barn area, main track and turf course were all underwater in the most severe flooding the area has seen in 30 years. "If there is one blessing to be found it's that the backstretch has not opened for summer racing so there are no horses to be moved right now," said track spokesman John Englehardt. "Because this does happen every spring, the track is sealed like cement after racing ends," he said, adding that the turf course seemed to benefit from a routine flooding due to the silt left behind from the riverbed. Cleanup is expected to take several days once the water recedes.


