FANS SPEAK: CHURCHILL LISTENS Responding to suggestions submitted by hundreds of fans via letters, e-mail and telephone calls, Churchill Downs yesterday announced a marketing plan which will include a \$1.6 million reduction in prices and \$1.2 million in improvements. Price reductions include free parking in the track's Longfield Parking Lot, starting after Derby Week; a 25-percent decrease in food and beer prices, starting with the Spring Meet; and a reduction in Clubhouse admission to \$2 (\$1 for senior citizens) starting with the Fall Meet. Improvements will be highlighted by the construction of a \$1 million state-of-the-art simulcasting facility, to be called the Paddock Pavilion, and the creation of a family picnic area. The track will also offer three new wagering options as well--the Odd-Even Bet, parlay wagering, and Racetrack Roulette, a single wager where fans can bet on a number, between 6 and 33, which they think will be the combined total of the numbers of the first three finishers in a given race. "Our customers spoke loud and clear," said President and CEO Tom Meeker. "They are overwhelming in their support for Churchill Downs and their love of Thoroughbred racing, but adamant that we lower our prices, improve our facilities and improve certain products. We appreciate the input but more important are thankful for the opportunity to present a better and more appealing product. We are excited about these changes and look forward to delivering quality Thoroughbred racing with a smile and a thank you to an extremely loyal group of people--our fans."

RACING CANCELED IN MARYLAND, NEW YORK Racing was called off after the third race at Aqueduct and Laurel Park yesterday afternoon due to high winds. At Aqueduct, rain checks were issued for admission, parking and programs. Both tracks are expected to be back in action today, with first post set for 12:30 p.m. at Aqueduct and 12:35 p.m. at Laurel.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

New York-bred **Stalwart Member (Claramount--Ms. Stalwart, by Stalwart)**, winner of the Hollie Hughes S. at Aqueduct Sunday, is a horse with a very smartly put-together pedigree. His sire is a grandson of Riverman (by Never Bend out of a Prince John mare) and his maternal grandsire, Stalwart, is out of Yes Dear Maggy (by a son of Never Bend out of a Prince John mare). To cap it off, Stalwart Member is inbred to Eight Thirty, a horse who combines extremely well with Prince John (their pedigrees contain a son and daughter of the important tap-root mare Herodias, with the brother and sister, Over There and Bathing Girl).

Dr. Fager's "untouchable" world record for a mile, set almost 30 years ago, still stands as the fastest-ever on the dirt, but the time has been bettered twice in a month on the lightening fast Santa Anita turf course. First Isitingood took it down to 1:32.05, and then **Atticus (Nureyev--Athyka, by Secretariat)** lowered it to an astonishing 1:31.89. The cross of Northern Dancer line stallions onto Secretariat mares is a long-established one and Atticus is one of four stakes winners by Nureyev out of a Secretariat mare, the cross also supplying stakes winners by Nureyev's sons Alwuhush and Soviet Star, and his three-parts brother, Sadler's Wells. There is another important factor in Atticus' pedigree. His granddam, Princess Kali, is very closely related to Val de Loir (she is by a son of Vieux Manoir {Fr} out of a daughter of Vali {Fr}, these two being the parents of Val de Loir). Compare the pedigree of Nureyev's granddam, Thong, with Princess Kali, and one finds that both trace to the famous tap-root mare Simon's Shoes (GB); both have Nasrullah, and where Thong has Flares, Princess Kali has his close relative Black Devil. Nureyev's three-parts brother Sadler's Wells also seems to like this background, as he turns up in such notable Sadler's Wells stakes winners as Saddlers' Hall (Ire), Prince of Dance (Ire), Poliglote (GB) and Dancing Bloom (Ire), and there are at least another two stakes winners featuring Sadler's Wells with Val de Loir's close relative, Country House (GB). Europe's champion three-year-old of 1996, Helissio (Fr), is by Sadler's Wells' brother Fairy King, and also has Val de Loir on the distaff side of his pedigree.

Eclipse winner **Jewel Princess** (Key to the Mint) heads the field after making a masterful seasonal debut in the GI Santa Maria H., winning by five lengths in that February 16 event. "She did more than I expected in that race," said trainer Wally Dollase. "I really didn't know what to expect out of her, but she did it pretty impressively. She may be better this year than she was last year." Also expected Sunday, **Belle's Flag** (Avenue Of Flags), winner of the GII El Encino and GII La Canada S. in two starts this year, worked a half-mile in :49 1/5 on the Santa Anita training track yesterday; **Port Plaisance** (Woodman) went the same distance on the turf in :48.
