PULPIT SHARP AT GULFSTREAM Drawing a crowd at the Gulfstream Park clockers' stand, GI Florida Derby favorite Pulpit (A.P. Indy) worked five furlongs in a bullet :59 1/5 vesterday morning. The three-year-old galloped out the three-quarters in 1:13 in preparation for Saturday's mile-and-an-eighth event. "All he needed was some air, to open him up a little bit," said trainer Frank Brothers. "He was a little wound up, but no different than he's ever been. Most horses know when they're going to breeze and get on the muscle." Remarking on the much talked-about colt's condition, Brothers said, "Physically, he's getting stronger. I think, both mentally and physically, he's better now. From what I could tell, the Fountain Of Youth didn't take anything out of him. All the tell-tale signs are good." Added jockey Shane Sellers, aboard for the breeze, "You have to throw the stop watch away with this horse. A slow work for him is a fast work for other horses."

# GENTLEMEN OUT OF DUBAI WORLD CUP

Trainer Richard Mandella will send only the top two finishers from the GI Santa Anita H. to Dubai, shipping the Brazilian duo of Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}) and Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}) for the World Cup March 29. Gentlemen (Arg) (Robin des Pins), third as the favorite in the Big 'Cap, will skip the race. "We were a little disappointed in his last race," said Mandella, "and he did show just a little bit of blood when we scoped him. We'll probably just miss one race--we don't have a big problem. But there's no Lasix in Dubai, and with the stress of the trip we thought it would be better to stay home and be safe rather than traveling half-way around the world with him." The trainer added that his two World Cup runners are right on schedule for their next engagement. "They couldn't be better," he said. News cont. p2

Reigning Horse of the Year Octagonal (NZ) becomes the second-highest earner in Australian racing history, bankrolling a total of \$4,028,569 after this latest win. The four-year-old was slowly into his stride and raced at the back of the pack early, but got the run of the race as jockey Shane Dye brought him through the field to catch outsider Gold City and Juggler almost on the line. Gai Waterhouse, who still plans to send Juggler to the Dubai World Cup on March 29, said: "Juggler was going to win and then Octagonal dropped out of the sky!' Super Impose (Aus), with \$4,438,016, is now the only Australian runner who has earned more than Octagonal. The winner of nine Group One races will go for his 10th when he contests the Mercedes Classic over a mile and a half at Rosehill on March 22; he may have one more start after that in the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick in Sydney on April 12, and will then almost certainly be retired to the Inghams' Woodlands Stud in New South Wales. Dye, who has never been beaten on the horse, said: "I've ridden some good horses--Let's Elope, Super Impose and others--and you can take them all. This is the best." Winning trainer John Hawkes added: "He's been something special for a long time. He's an unbelievable horse and has proven that in more ways than one. When it comes to a fight, he finds what he needs--he's guts personified." Stakes Results cont. p2

SKIP AWAY ON TRACK FOR OAKLAWN Trainer Sonny Hine sent last year's three-year-old champ Skip Away (Skip Trial) out to breeze five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 at Gulfstream vesterday morning as he gets ready for his next start in the GI Oaklawn Park H. April 5. "He galloped out in 1:13 and change," said Hine. "It was a good work. I had him too sharp for his last couple of races; he was unmanageable in his last race. I'm pleased with this work. He was hard held. When he gets to run every month, he'll be tough." The grey has been second in both starts this year, the GI Donn H. and GI Gulfstream Park H. in his latest outing March 1.

# SHAKE-UP ON JERSEY RACING CIRCUIT? Ac-

cording to a report in vesterday's Newark Star-Ledger, Senator Richard Codey (D-Essex) has introduced a proposal which would end live racing at two of New Jersey's five racetracks in hopes of improving the health of the Thoroughbred industry in the state. Codey's plan would close the door on racing at Garden State Park and Atlantic City Racecourse, with those facilities to remain open as off-track betting sites. "Atlantic City has been on life support for years and Garden State isn't far from it," Codey told the Star-Ledger. "This is what needs to be done to save racing in New Jersey." In addition, Codey's plan would revamp the state's racing schedule, calling for a Thoroughbred meet at the Meadowlands from March through Memorial Day, and extending Monmouth Park's meet through the end of October or early November--with an eye toward one day hosting the Breeders' Cup. The harness racing schedule at Freehold Raceway would be unchanged, but the harness dates at the Meadowlands would shift to a June through mid-February meeting.

**RACING CANCELED AT SUFFOLK** Racing was called off at Suffolk Downs in East Boston, Massachusetts yesterday due to the snow storm which hit the area early Monday morning. Rather than harrowing the snow into the racing surface, which could have made for unsafe conditions later in the week, the maintenance crew sealed the track and plowed the snow off throughout the afternoon. Simulcasting continued as scheduled, and live racing is expected to resume Wednesday with first post set for 12:45 p.m.

"He's much more a seven-furlong or a mile horse. He's not a Slipper horse," he said. Connections would also have to pay \$78,420 to get Millward into the Golden Slipper, as he was not originally nominated. Said trainer Alan Bell, "You wouldn't enter him for the Slipper if you had a look at him, he's such a big stringy-looking thing."

Four-year-old filly Ruffles, racing in blinkers for the first time, gave jockey Shane Dye a Group One "double" when she led from start to finish to pull off a 16-1 surprise in this prestigious Group One event. This was first Group One win for Ruffles, who has now taken eight of her 19 lifetime starts. Max Lees' son Kris said: "Ruffles got further back in last week's Oakleigh Plate than we would have liked and hung all the way. We put the blinkers on her to make her race a little cleaner and it certainly helped. Shane Dye thought it best to lead and you certainly can't argue with him now." Sadly the race was marred by a serious tendon injury to the New Zealand-trained three-year-old colt O'REILLY (NZ) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), the 1-4 favourite, who may be retired.
