PULPIT'S TEAM SETS THE RECORD STRAIGHT

Explaining it was important to clear the air, Claiborne Farm confirmed yesterday that their undefeated three-year-old sensation Pulpit (A.P. Indy) had suffered a stress fracture of his left front leg as a two-year-old in training in South Carolina last March which delayed his racing debut. While Claiborne spokesperson Dell Hancock downplayed the significance of the injury, she said the farm did feel it necessary to set the record straight. Claiborne had earlier attributed his absence at two to "growing pains," but speculation in the press that he had suffered a more serious injury led Claiborne to schedule a press conference yesterday. Veterinarian Larry Bramlage, who treated the colt at two, said stress fractures in young horses were not uncommon as their heart and lungs become highly developed early, but their bones develop more slowly. "He was making progress faster than his bones were keeping up," said Bramlage, who explained the injury could have become more serious had it not been detected early on. "Had he gone on and trained, he would have gotten what is commonly called a condylar fracture in the cannon bone. We simply had to reduce his training schedule to let his skeletal structure catch up with his heart and lungs." Trainer Frank Brothers said the injury caused Pulpit to miss three months of training. He returned to the track in August, and could have been ready to run as early as November, said Brothers, but his connections elected to wait until the opening of the Gulfstream meet in January. Said Hancock, "We felt like it was just a growing pain and it was not a big issue. It kind of got out of hand in the press, and that's why we're meeting everybody head on now." Pulpit makes his next start in this Saturday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream.

Among the horses in the dispersal is multiple Grade I-winning four-year-old filly **Antespend** (Spend a Buck). Cooke is also selling 18 juveniles in the two-year-old sale. King of Daiya, who settled in mid-field until the final turn, showed the most impressive finishing speed on the stretch to score his first graded stakes win by 1 1/2 lengths. The five-year-old became the fifth graded stakes for his sire, Sunday Silence this year and the 37th graded stakes winner in the total produce record of Sunday Silence in Japan. King of Daiya was unbeaten in three starts last year, including the December S. He was third as the favorite in his graded stakes debut last out in the January G2 Jockey Club Cup. Winning jockey Yoshitomi Shibata said, "I have always thought this horse would be a graded stakes winner. It just came true today."

Dancing Brave produced his first graded stakes winner in Japan when Kyohei March, a daughter from his second crop in this country, won this event, one of the most important prep races for the Japanese 1000 Guineas, by a devastating seven lengths. Mikio Matsunaga, settled the filly, whose race record was four starts and three wins including the Elfin S. before this race, just behind the early pacesetter. When the field came into the stretch, Kyohei March took the lead without any action by the jockey and at the wire the horse stopped the clock in stakes record time. Mikio Matsunaga, the winning rider, said, "The race was just what you witnessed--very easy effort for the horse. She has already proved that she stays one mile in the previous start and I believe she should be very close to the title of 1000 Guineas now."

Wild Buster had competed in graded stakes company several times in the past, but had never hit the board before. Winning rider Hiroki Hashimoto said, "He was always very relaxed today. I had settled him the mid-field and as I started to drive the horse at the three-furlongs pole, we were able to draw clear." **ADMIRE CALL (Tai Tehm)**, winner of the Nigawa S., was sent off the 2.70-1 favorite in the field, but finished fourth. Jockey Hiroki Hashimoto said his colt didn't handle the small Nakayama track.

Allen E. Paulson's **Escena** (Strawberry Road {Aus}), seven-length winner of the GI Fantasy S. at Oaklawn in 1996, returns to the races for the first time since last September when she goes postward in today's 10th race at Gulfstream, a 1 1/16-mile turf allowance. It will be the four-year-old filly's career debut on grass. To date, Escena has a lifetime record of 11-4-5-1 and earnings of \$501,700.

Local News, Keeneland:

Keeneland President Bill Greely presented a \$50,000 check to the American Red Cross yesterday to assist the organization's flood-relief effort. Record flooding last week devastated a four-state area in the Midwest, including many towns in northern and central Kentucky. "We wanted to do something to help the many people who are suffering as a result of this disaster," said Greely. "We'd like to encourage other more fortunate individuals and businesses to do what they can to assist with this effort."

Local News, Illinois:

The Illinois Racing Board, by a seven-to-zero vote Tuesday, restored the one-year suspension it imposed on owner/trainer Noel Hickey Oct. 18, 1994 for six violations involving the prohibited medication albuterol at that summer's Arlington meeting. The original suspension by a four-to-two vote was voided last week by the First District Appellate Court of Illinois because the nine-member board didn't have the minimum five-member majority vote the law stipulates in cases involving suspensions and revocations. "It looks like we're in for another two or three years of litigation," said Hickey's attorney, Art Engelland. "This presents many new issues, plus we have all of the old ones. We may proceed administratively or we may proceed with a lawsuit against certain members of the commission. We have a lot of options."

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

GLITTER WOMAN (f, 3, Glitterman--Carols Folly, by Taylor's Falls) & VALID BONNET (f, 3, Valid Appeal--Miss Cox's Hat, by Cox's Ridge)

Close inbreeding to In Reality seems to be gaining in fashion. Over the weekend we saw victories for two fillies who own prominent double doses of In Reality. At Gulfstream, **Glitter Woman** destroyed what seemed on paper a strong field to take the GII Bonnie Miss by 7 1/4 lengths. Meanwhile at Oaklawn, **Valid Bonnet** captured the GIII Honeybee S.

Glitter Woman has In Reality 3x3 through a daughter (the dam of Glitterman) and a son (Taylor's Falls), and Valid Bonnet owns In Reality 2x3 via her sire and her granddam. Opportunities to inbreed to In Reality are relatively new, but we have also noted a 3x3 cross of In Reality in Crafty Prospector's daughter Inferno's Reality, a stakes-winner of over \$400,000, and the Pentelicus filly Cottage Flower, a three-time stakes-winner at two. What is unusual about this In Reality duplication is that it marks a continuing chain of inbreeding to inbred ancestors which takes us right back to Rock Sand and Fairy Gold, two of the grandparents of Man o' War.

A look at In Reality's pedigree shows he was inbred 3x3 to War Relic, who appeared in the male line as his great-grandsire and in the female line as sire of his granddam. The degrees of inbreeding mentioned so far are put in the shade when we take another step back and review War Relic's pedigree. War Relic was by Man o' War out of a mare by Friar Rock. The significance of that pedigree line becomes apparent when one realizes that Man o' War was by Fair Play (dam, Fairy Gold) out of Mahubah (by Rock Sand), while Friar Rock was by Rock Sand out of Fairy Gold. So War Relic was inbred 3x3 to both Rock Sand and Fairy Gold, two of the four grandparents of his sire Man o' War!

War Relic was no one-hit wonder as the pattern also produced his sisters Speed Boat (Test Stakes; dam of the CCA Oaks winner Level Best), War Kilt (Demoiselle S.) and Anchors Ahead (dam of Spinaway S. winner Price Level). A similar inbreeding pattern is found in the good horse and influential sire Eight Thirty (by a son of Friar Rock with a second dam by Man o' War). Champion Two-Year-Old Roving Boy had War Relic and one of the aforementioned sisters, War Kilt, 3x3 in his pedigree. The three-year-old filly Lavender (Smile--More Than Willing {Seattle Dancer}), winner last weekend of the La Habra S. at Santa Anita, is by a son of In Reality, and her granddam, a three-parts sister to Roving Boy, has War Relic and War Kilt 3x2. Thus, Lavender has

three crosses of War Relic and one of his full-sister. Sword Dancer, the sire of Damascus, has another of the War Relic sisters, Speed Boat, as his third dam, as well as an extra Fairy Gold/Rock Sand combination--Mad Hatter--also in the third generation. In Reality and Sword Dancer appear together close up in the pedigree of millionaire Cutlass Reality, Grade I winner Pretty Discreet and the very smart sprinter Robyn Dancer.

In the light of these successes, it is interesting to speculate that inbreeding to ancestors who are themselves closely inbred may be more effective than inbreeding to horses with outcrossed backgrounds. We should include a word of caution here too. Close inbreeding increases the chance of inheriting traits possessed by selected ancestors--whether these traits are desirable or undesirable. In the case of In Reality, it is well-known that undesirable can mean some less than perfect forelegs, so care should be taken over the individuals selected for such experiments.

**PEDIGREE SHORTS...**

The victory of **Flag Down** (h, 7, **Deputy Minister--Sharp Call, by Sharpen Up {GB}**) in Saturday's Gil Pan American H. was a reminder that Sharpen Up seems to have something of an affinity for Deputy Minister's sire Vice Regent and Vice Regent's brother Viceregal. Deputy Minister has sired both Flag Down and the Grade I-winning Clear Mandate as his first two foals out of mares by Sharpen Up, and the reverse cross, Sharpen Up on a Viceregal mare, produced the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor Trempolino. There must be considerable scope for exploring this cross through Deputy Minister's numerous stallion sons, as well as through Sharpen Up's son Diesis.

We have always had a soft spot for Silver Ghost, who sired such as Silver Goblin, Silver Music and Lunar Spook from very limited initial opportunities. He might have another good one in **Northern Silver** (f, 3, **Silver Ghost--Northern Wife, by Northern Baby**), who broke her maiden by 11 lengths in mid-February and then came back to score an Oaklawn allowance win by six lengths Saturday. Silver Ghost is out of a mare by Halo, and Northern Baby is by Northern Dancer, giving Northern Silver a double of Almahmoud. More unusual though is the fact that Silver Ghost's fourth dam is the wonderful mare Gallorette, while Northern Baby's fourth dam is Gallorette's sister, Gallita. In fact, Silver Ghost's dam, the good stakes-winner Misty Gallore, and Northern Baby have a rather similar genetic background with Almahmoud, Native Dancer, Princequillo and Gallorette/Gallita all close up.

Defensive Play scored a major success with his first Southern Hemisphere crop when his two-year-old son **Millward** (g, 2, **Defensive Play--Exploit {NZ}, by Danzatore**) captured the \$350,000 on offer for the winner of the G1 VRC Sires Produce S. in Australia Monday. Millward's broodmare sire Danzatore was a Champion Two-Year-Old in Ireland, and after a sojourn at stud in the Southern Hemisphere, he returned to the U.S., standing first in Kentucky and now Texas. Danzatore is by Northern Dancer out of a Raise a Native mare, giving Millward a 4x4 cross of Raise a Native (through a son and a daughter) and a 5x5x5 cross of Raise a Native's sire Native Dancer. As well as emulating this pattern, it is also worth noting that Danzatore's second dam is by Fleet Nasrullah (by Nasrullah out of a Count Fleet mare). Defensive Play is by Fappiano, a son of Mr. Prospector, and Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger (by a son of Nasrullah out of a Count Fleet mare) is bred on very similar lines to Fleet Nasrullah. In fact, Mr. Prospector and Danzatore's dam, Shake a Leg, have extremely similar genetic backgrounds.
