CAPTAIN BODGIT PULLS RANK IN

FLORIDA DERBY Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado), who made up 19 lengths to finish just two behind Pulpit (A.P. Indy) when third in the GII Fountain Of Youth S. February 22, had an extra half-furlong to work with yesterday and made the most of it, charging past his more fancied foe to take the GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park by a widening 2 1/2 lengths. Racing much closer to the leaders in the early going this time, the Florida-bred dark bay brought the battle to 2-5 Pulpit as they swung into the homestretch, but as the favorite struggled along the rail to get past 68-1 Frisk Me Now (Mr. Frisky) for second, Captain Bodgit swept on by and under the wire a decisive winner as the 7-2 second choice. "I was following Pulpit all the way around," said winning iockey Alex Solis, who was also aboard the colt last time out, "I thought he was the horse to beat. When we got to the five-sixteenths pole, I asked my horse and man, he just exploded. I switched my stick and hit him at the eighth pole, and he hit another gear." Added trainer Gary Capuano, "I think the rain yesterday helped us. It slowed the track down some to set it up for closers. I think the distance also helped us-the farther he goes, the better." The Maryland-based horseman added that his well-traveled colt will head to Keeneland for his next start. "I want to make sure he comes out of the race good, but we're pointing towards the Blue Grass (April 12)," he said. Pulpit, who suffered his first loss in what was only his fourth career start, outgamed longshot Frisk Me Now, who won the GII Danka Hutcheson at odds of 105-1, to get the place. "He just wasn't the same horse as last time," said his rider, Shane Sellers. "When I asked him for a kick, it just wasn't the same as he has shown in his other races. But I'm still proud of him and I remain confident in his ability." Trainer Frank Brothers was also unshaken by the defeat. "He's a young horse; he's still learning," he said, but admitted, "I'm a little disappointed. It would have been great for the sport if he had stayed undefeated. But if he comes out of the race okay, I think he'll still be in the picture. Hopefully he's fine and he'll go forward." The Claiborne colt is also expected to make his next start in the Blue Grass.

Third to eventual GISW Traitor in his debut at Laurel last July, Captain Bodgit then put together five wins in a row, culminating in the GIII Laurel Futurity at a mile and an eighth last November 2. Purchased privately by Team Valor after a third-place finish in his three-year-old bow, the GIII Holy Bull S. January 18, the colt made up a ton of ground to be third again in his latest, the GII Fountain Of Youth three weeks ago. He returned to the winner's circle with a powerful performance, sitting sixth through a half in a moderate :47 3/5 before circling the field on the far turn and rolling past 2-5 Pulpit and rank outsider Frisk Me Now in the stretch to win going away. "He ran a super race," said trainer Gary Capuano. "The race set up perfect for us. The last three-eighths, he has an awesome kick. I knew when he got to Pulpit, he would grind it out. My horse doesn't like to lose."

NTA UNVEILS CHANGES TO BUSINESS PLAN

The Board of Directors of the National Thoroughbred Association yesterday announced revisions to its Preliminary Business Plan. The changes came in response to suggestions received during a 10-week "industry comment period" that followed the release of the plan in December, and include lowering the price of the NTA's simulcast signal (the weekend pooled interstate simulcast rights of NTA affiliated tracks) from 6.5 percent to 5 percent; and introducing a \$5 million NTA bonus program, funded by nomination fees and television and sponsorship revenues. "Overall, the reaction to the core concepts of the Preliminary Plan--particularly the need for centralized marketing of the weekend interstate simulcast signal to fund national advertising and marketing programs for the sport--has been overwhelmingly positive," said NTA Chairman John Gaines. "As we anticipated, however, the Plan has been strengthened and improved by the input and constructive criticism of a number of groups." Added Tim Smith, the NTA's Interim Executive Director, "Our preliminary analysis is that...we can accommodate the Board's suggested changes and still preserve adequate initial funding for the NTA's core programs. These would include, in year one, a \$25 million national advertising budget, 30 new hours of major network TV coverage of live racing, a weekly cable television magazine show, multi-week national print promotion, a professionally staffed national office, meaningful initial purse bonuses and a significant initial revenue-sharing program with NTA participating tracks." The NTA has also added 14 "Founding Members" to its rolls. Joining the association in the first two weeks of March were Prince Khalid Abdullah, Joe Albritton, Craig Bandoroff, Emmanuel de Seroux, Kevin Doyle, Edward Evans, Robert Folsom, Leonard Green, Stanley Gumberg, Georgia Hofmann, Stuart Janney, D. Wayne Lukas, Paul Oreffice and Alec Wildenstein. A total of 61 horsemen have agreed to lend the NTA \$50,000 apiece to fund the planning and start-up costs for the organization; the goal is 100 "Founding Members."
