DUBAI WORLD CUP PROBABLES RELEASED

The probable field for the March 29 \$4 million Dubai World Cup, issued yesterday, includes the following 13 horses: Bijou D'Inde (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), Even Top (Ire) (Topanoora {Ire}), Flemensfirth (Alleged), Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}), Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King), Hokuto Vega (Jpn) (Nagurski), Juggler (Aus) (Jugah), Kammtarra (Zilzal), Kev Of Luck (Chief's Crown), Luso (GB) (Salse), Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}), Singspiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}), and Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}). Ladbrokes, the biggest bookmaking company in Britain, have the Richard Mandella pair of Siphon (Brz), 3-1, and Sandpit (Brz), 7-2, as the favorites. Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Helissio (Fr) and Canadian International and Japan Cup winner Singspiel (Ire) come next at 5-1. Mike Dillon, spokesman for Ladbrokes, said: "This looks to be an ultra-competitive field, which is highly appropriate. In my opinion the professional dirt horses from America must have an advantage with their experience on the surface and must have the call in the market." (Severe weather in Dubai puts the event in ieopardy--see related News).

HEAVY RAIN CLOSES NAD AL SHEBA Dubai's Nad Al Sheba racecourse, venue of the \$4 million Dubai World Cup on March 29, has been badly affected by persistent heavy rain recently and, as the deluge continues, the main sand track has been flooded and is now closed for training, which, ironically, has been transferred to the grass. Monday, the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Helissio (Fr) (Fairy King) and the John Gosden-trained Flemensfirth (Alleged) had to be vanned to another track to do their work. With more rain forecast, doubts are already being expressed in Dubai about Nad Al Sheba being able to stage the World Cup, which might have to be transferred to another track or even be canceled.

TRAITOR RETURNS AT OBS Last year's GI Futurity winner Traitor (Cryptoclearance), away from the races since finishing second in the GI Moet Champagne last October, will make his three-year-old debut in the \$100,000 OBS Championship S. in Ocala, Florida, Monday, March 24. A \$102,000 purchase from last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Calder Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the Alfred Vanderbilt colt heads a field of 11 in the mile-and-a-sixteenth event; he will be ridden by jockey John Velazquez.

LOTTSA TALC RETIRED Lottsa Talc (Talc), one of New York's most durable and consistent stakes performers the past several seasons, has been retired after a seventh-place finish in Sunday's Next Move H. at Aqueduct. The seven-year-old mare won 21 of 65 starts, earning \$1,211,996 in a career that spanned four-and-a-half years. Sixteen of those wins came in stakes, including the 1996 GII Barbara Fritchie at Laurel. Nine of those stakes wins, topped by the '96 GII Distaff, were at Aqueduct. She placed in 15 other stakes events, and finished in the money in 43 of her 64 outings. "We had been discussing retiring her the last couple of months, and we just wanted to see how she fared this year," said her trainer, Tim Kelly. "She gave us hope, finishing second in the Barbara Fritchie (Feb. 15), but she didn't fare too well in the Next Move. We're very pleased she's retiring sound after an illustrious career." Kelly said that breeding plans would be firmed up in the next few days.

COOPERATION RESOLVES RACETRACK

LIABILITY ISSUE In a joint effort between the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, the United Thoroughbred Trainers of America, and Kentucky racetracks, a model regulation has been adopted in Kentucky dealing with issues of liability at the track. The Kentucky Racing Commission recently approved the regulation: it was also approved by the interim joint committee on Licensing and Occupations March 14 and becomes effective immediately. Sam Ramer, executive director of the UTTA, explained, "For a long time nationwide there has existed what I've always believed to be an inequity between the relationship of the horsemen and the racetracks. Buried in all documents such as stakes nominations, stall applications and badge lists was language, in small type, that basically moved the line of responsibility away from the racetrack for their own negligence and...assigned that responsibility to the owner and/or the trainer. We have found language wherein everybody stands good for their own negligence on the racetrack, just as they do outside the racetrack, with the temporary exception dealing with injury to horses as property damage." As to that particular issue, Ramer added, "If a horse was damaged off the racing surface due to the negligence of the racetrack, and that were proven, then we feel that there should be some way for the racetrack to accept some exposure. At the same time, we also want to limit this exposure because we realize that one horse--for instance Cigar--could come onto the racetrack, take a bad step, and basically bankrupt a racing association. We don't want the regulation to be allinclusive, but we want it such that the track shoulders some responsibility..." Drew J. Couto, president of TOBA, added, "The issues addressed--personal injury and property damage--were not the easiest issues to resolve because of the diversity of the parties' interests. But it was a very creative group of individuals who got together and put serious effort into equitably resolving these issues. And I think we've come a long way toward a fair solution, one that will protect the interests of the racetracks, of owners, trainers and of the sport."

PAULSON FILES INSURANCE CLAIM Allen Paulson has filed an infertility claim with the insurers of Cigar (Palace Music) after a team of fertility experts announced that "we unanimously believe that Cigar will not be capable of rendering any mares pregnant in the 1997 breeding season." The panel of experts included veterinarians representing both the insurance company and Cigar's owners. Cigar had covered 34 mares up to March 5, the date on which samples were taken for examination for insurance purposes. All 34 have been scanned and all have tested negative for pregnancy.

TOBA "OWNER OF THE MONTH" TO PRINCE AHMED BIN SALMAN With a stable headed by the West Coast's top three-year-old filly Sharp Cat (Storm Cat) and last year's champion older mare Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint), Prince Ahmed bin Salman's The Thoroughbred Corporation enjoyed a banner month in February, capping it off with the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association "Owner of the Month" Award. The two stable stars each garnered Grade I races during the month, with Sharp Cat taking the GI Las Virgenes S. February 15 and Jewel Princess, owned in partnership with Mr. and Mrs. Richard Stephen, taking the GI Santa Maria H. in her season opener February 16. The Thoroughbred Corporation has approximately 30 horses running in the U.S., 25 in England and 20 in Saudi Arabia: the Prince purchased his first horse in 1981.

BOB BAFFERT NAMED UTTA/VINERY

"TRAINER OF THE MONTH" Trainer Bob Baffert saddled four stakes winners last month, earning himself the February "Trainer of the Month" Award from the United Thoroughbred Trainers of America, Inc. and Vinery Stallions '97. The horseman opened the month with Batroyale (Batonnier), who made her return from a six-month layoff to win the Bay Meadows Matron H., and High Stakes Player (High Brite), winner of the GIII Palos Verdes H. at Santa Anita, both on February 1. Baffert's third stakes win was also a world-record performance by Isitingood (Crusader Sword), who captured The Bart S. running a mile on the turf in 1:32.05 February 5. Triple Crown hopeful Silver Charm (Silver Buck) completed the package, coming back after a five-month absence to capture the GIII San Vicente S. February 12.

The crowd's choice here, the chestnut was content to settle off solid early fractions but moved to challenge pacesetter Top Secret nearing the eighth pole and then drew away in the final yards to win it decisively.

Local News, Rockingham Park:

Rockingham Park has released its 1997 stakes schedule, featuring 14 events with a minimum guaranteed purse of \$25,000. The meet runs from June 8 through September 21. The centerpiece of the stakes program remains the three prestigious turf races, the June 15 GIII \$200,000 New Hampshire Sweepstakes, the July 6 \$100,000-added Rockingham Breeders' Cup and the August 3 \$100,000 Spicy Living S.

Local News: Gulfstream Park

Jockey Shane Sellers booted home 91 winners at the 1997 Gulfstream Park meet which ended Sunday to lead the standings at the track for the first time. Jerry Bailey, who had taken the title the last two years, was second with 82 wins. Bailey did lead in two other categories, winning the most stakes at the meeting with 11, and bankrolling a meet-high \$2,797,005 in purses. The Gulfstream trainer title went to Bill Mott for the fifth straight year, tying the mark for consecutive titles set by Arnold Winick Jr. (1959-63). Mott saddled 27 winners, 11 more than runner-up Ed Plesa Jr.
