CAPTAIN BODGIT TO WOOD Florida Derby winner Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado) will make his final start before the Kentucky Derby in Aqueduct's April 12 GII Wood Memorial. The Team Valor colt was originally scheduled to start in Keeneland's Blue Grass S. that same day, but a nominating snafu forced the change in plans. "Keeneland never received our nomination for the race," said Barry Irwin, president of Team Valor, "so we have had to change our plans. Oddly enough, we faxed nominations the same day to Hialeah for the Flamingo and to Turfway for the Jim Beam and they got there fine. But for some reason the Blue Grass nomination didn't make it." Captain Bodgit will leave Hialeah next weekend and train up to the Wood at trainer Gary Capuano's home base, Bowie race track in Maryland, Following the ninefurlong Wood Memorial, plans call for the colt to fly to Louisville. "I think my trainer likes this idea better," Irwin said, "He was worried about the sharp turns at Keeneland."

MANDELLA PAIR ARRIVE FOR WORLD CUP Trainer Richard Mandella's pair Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}) and Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}) arrived safely in Dubai Thursday morning after their flight from California via Amsterdam. Both are now settled in the quarantine center in Dubai, along with Australia's flag-bearer, the Gai Waterhouse-trained Juggler (Aus) (Jugah, by Northern Dancer), who also arrived yesterday, having traveled from Sydney via Hong Kong. The Japanese contender Hokuto Vega (Jpn) (Nagurski) breezed a half-mile over the Nad Al Sheba Racecourse yesterday.

HALL OF FAME NOMINEES ANNOUNCED The National Museum of Racing announced yesterday its nominees for this year's induction into the official National Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame. Ogden Phipp's champion Easy Goer is one of three nominees in the Modern Male horse category. Others in that category are Exceller, who defeated Triple Crown winners Seattle Slew and Affirmed in the 1978 Jockey Club Gold Cup, and D & H Stable's Kentucky Derby winner Needles, Jockeys nominated for Hall of Fame induction in 1997 are Gary Stevens, who won the Kentucky Derby on Winning Colors and Thunder Gulch, the recently retired Jacinto Vasquez, another two-time Derby winner and regular rider of Ruffian, and the late Jack Westrope, who led the nation's riders as an apprentice at 15 in 1933. Nominated trainers are Willard Proctor, Phil Johnson and Virgil "Buddy" Raines. Bold 'n Determined, a winner of six Grade I races in 1980, two-time champion Bowl of Flowers and three-year-old champion of 1963 Lamb Chop were nominated in the Modern Female horse category. The Horse of Yesteryear category--for runners who made their last start at least 50 years ago-is made up of Endurance by Right, who won 16 of 18 races at two; Granville, the first winner of the Horse of the Year balloting in 1936, and Princeguillo, who rose from a \$2,500 claimer to become a distinguished stayer in the mid-1940s. More than 100 racing journalists, historians and commentators will participate in the balloting and results will be announced at Churchill Downs during Kentucky Derby week. The Hall of Fame induction ceremony will be held 10:30 a.m. Monday, August 4 at the National Museum of Racing in Saratoga Springs, New York.
