DUBAI DIARY A large electrical storm brought heavy rains to Dubai Tuesday night and caused racing officials to seal the track in anticipation of Saturday's \$4 million Dubai World Cup. With the sand track closed, the turf course, located on the inside of the sand track, was opened to ensure that horses would be allowed to train. **Siphon (Brz)** (Itajara {Brz}) worked four furlongs Wednesday over the Nad Al Sheba turf course in 37.45 seconds. **Sandpit (Brz)** (Baynoun {Ire}) cantered the same distance under exercise rider Crystal Brown. After watching his horses go through their paces, trainer Richard Mandella said, "I was very happy to get my horses on the turf as I did not want to interfere with the drying process of the dirt by opening up the track. I was relieved to get a nice piece of work into them both today." John Gosden decided against using the turf course to train **Flemensfirth (Alleged)**, who traveled to the Jebel Ali Racecourse where he had a steady canter over seven furlongs. **Hokuto Vega (Jpn)** (Nagurski), the champion Japanese dirt horse, worked at the Al Quoz training track. The seven-year-old mare started off slowly and was allowed to lengthen her stride to the wire, covering five furlongs in 1:05.

COPELAN FILLY TOPS RECORD OBS MARCH

SALE The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company March Open Selected Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale concluded a record-breaking two-day stand Wednesday, topped by Regal Miss Copelan, a Copelan filly who brought a final bid of \$300,000. Regal Miss Copelan was consigned by Mark Casse, agent, and is the first foal out of stakes winner Regal Pennant (Banner Bob). The bay filly caused a stir Monday morning when she worked three furlongs in :33 4/5. Buzz Chace, who signed the \$300,000 ticket on behalf of Bob English, said, "I especially liked the way she handled herself after the work. She seemed to improve each day--she's a beautiful filly to be around. She will go to Aqueduct and be trained by John Dowd." A total of 123 horses were sold in the second session, for a gross of \$6,888,000. The \$56,000 average was an increase of 29 percent from last year's \$43,281 at the corresponding session. Overall 254 horses were sold in the two-day sale, for an aggregate of \$12,828,000. The average was a record \$50,504, up 28.9 percent from 1996's \$39,184. Next on the OBS agenda is the Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, scheduled for April 21-24, 1997.

WOODBINE STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED

The Ontario Jockey Club released its 1997 stakes schedule which features 97 stakes races with a total value of more than \$9 million. The line-up features the Canadian Triple Crown events, the June 29 Queen's Plate, July 27 Prince of Wales S. and August 17 Breeders' S., as well the \$1 million GI Canadian International S. and its companion feature, the \$300,000 GII E.P. Taylor S. on October 19. New to the schedule is the September 20 \$500,000 Woodbine Mile, which replaces the Woodbine Million. Fort Erie will run five stakes races, highlighted by the middle gem of the Triple Crown, the Prince of Wales S. The 1997 racing season opens this Friday at Woodbine.

BAY MEADOWS BACKSTRETCH PROJECT

APPROVED Planners from San Mateo, California, the home of Bay Meadows Race Course, approved plans Tuesday night to replace the track's barns and training track with a \$400 million development, according to the March 26 *San Francisco Chronicle*. The project calls for construction of 900,000 square feet of office space for Franklin Resources, the mutual fund company that is San Mateo's largest employer. Also included in the proposal are approximately 734 homes, condominiums and apartments, a 240-room hotel, multiplex movie theater and restaurants. Final approval is in the hands of the City Council, with public hearings scheduled for April 7 and April 22.

LADBROKE PURCHASES GOLDEN GATE

PROPERTY Ladbroke Racing California, a division of Ladbroke Racing Corporation, announced yesterday an agreement to purchase Catellus Development's interest in the Golden Gold Fields property. Terms of the agreement were not disclosed. "We are optimistic that a definitive agreement can be executed in the near future, which will allow us to control our own destiny and the destiny of our racing operation," said John Long, President and COO of Ladbroke Racing Corporation. "The signing of the agreement will allow us to become owners, not renters." Ladbroke Racing Corporation acquired the lease of Golden Gate Fields from Pacific Racing Association in January, 1989. Racing at Golden Fields began in 1941, resumed after World War II and has continued annually ever since."

SYDNEY EASTER YEARLING SALE OPENS

TUESDAY Next week's William Inglis Easter Yearling Sale is the premier Australian yearling auction and there is little doubt it will be dominated by the progeny of 'shuttle stallions' from the Northern Hemisphere. Danehill, champion sire in Australia for the past three seasons, will be represented by no fewer than 44 yearlings, including a full-sister to 1996 Golden Slipper winner Merlene and the offspring of four Group 1 winners--Lady Jakeo, Mapperley Heights, Satin Sand and Savana City. But the sales topper could well be his colt out of the Group 2 winner Twiglet. Other shuttle stallions to be well represented include Last Tycoon with 43 yearlings, Royal Academy with 29, Brief Truce 17, Cigar's sire Palace Music with 13, Personal Hope with 10, Night Shift 5, and Quest For Fame 3. Of great interest will be four yearlings conceived to Southern Hemisphere time by Coolmore's champion European sire Sadler's Wells and two by Seattle Slew. Another American-based sire, Chief's Crown, has one representative. The sale will also feature the penultimate crop of yearlings by the mighty New Zealand-based stallion Sir Tristram, who has now been retired at the age of 25.

Local News, France:

Former leading French trainer John Cunningham, Jr, died Wednesday of a heart attack at Chantilly in France, Cunningham, 69, retired three years ago. He leaves behind a wife and 12-year-old daughter. Amongst the many top-class horses he trained were Irish River, the champion European miler and Classic winner; Pharly, winner of the Prix Lupin and Prix du Moulin de Longchamp; Gazala, winner of the Prix de Diane (French Oaks) and Pampered Miss, winner of the Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas).

Local News, Dubai:

Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum has decided to follow the Godolphin plan and winter a much larger team of his horses in Dubai at the end of the 1997 flat racing season in Britain. The Sheikh plans to send as many as 60 of his horses to the Gulf next winter, but they will return to their original trainers in England at the end of the winter. A team of 13 of the Sheikh's horses have just wintered in Dubai and are now due to return to England this week, including his 1000 Guineas hope **Sarayir** (Mr Prospector) and Epsom hopeful **Shaya** (GB) (Nashwan).

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

There has been a lot of discussion recently about the potential for inbreeding to Northern Dancer through similarly bred horses such as Nijinsky II, The Minstrel and Storm Bird. Storm Bird and The Minstrel are found together in the pedigree of last year's Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Storm Song, while French Classic winner Green Tune is by a son of Nijinsky, and his granddam is a three-parts sister to Storm Bird. Sunday's Tampa Bay Derby supplied the first North American stakes winner we can recall with Nijinsky II and Storm Bird combined, the pair appearing 3 x 2 in the pedigree of **Zede (c, 3, Strawberry Road--Index's, by Storm Bird)**.

One Northern Dancer-line stallion who really likes to receive more Northern Dancer in his mares is Danehill. **Danendri (Aus) (f, 4, Danehill--Stormy Exchange, by Storm Bird)**, one of nine Danehill stakes winners to carry inbreeding to Northern Dancer, added to the success story of the combination when taking the G1 STC Answett Australia S. this past weekend. Of course, Danehill has a very different pedigree to most Northern Dancers in that his granddam, Spring Adieu, is a half-sister to Northern Dancer, giving any Danehill with Northern Dancer in the dam two son- and one daughter-cross of Natalma. There is even a Danehill stakes winner with four crosses of Natalma's dam Almahmoud. This is Greiga, who is out of a mare by Bering (GB) (inbred to Almahmoud through Arctic Tern and Lyphard), so it looks as if there is no limit to the amount of Almahmoud one can successfully build up.

Australia's richest two-year-old race, the G1 Tooheys Golden Slipper, went to **Guineas (Aus) (c, 3, Crown Jester {Aus}--Foreign Bank {NZ} by Sir Tristram)**, a colt who sports a rather clever pedigree. His sire is out of a mare by Wilkes' half-brother Worden II. One day earlier, **Octagonal (NZ) (h, 5, Zabeel {NZ}--Eight Carat {GB} by Pieces of Eight {GB})** had captured the G1 Mercedes Classic to become the leading Australian money earner of all time. By a strange coincidence, Octagonal is very closely related to Foreign Bank, the dam of Guineas. Octagonal's sire, Zabeel, is by Sir Tristram, the sire of Foreign Bank. The grandams are both by Klairon, and the fourth dams are the three-parts sisters Tessa Gillian and Allasio.
