WORLD CUP PLANS FINALIZED The Dubai World Cup Committee has confirmed that the \$4 million Dubai World Cup, and the rest of the World Cup card, will be run this Thursday, April 3. A field of 12 will go to the post for the World Cup with last year's Arc winner **Helissio (Fr)** (Fairy King) the lone defector. First post will again be 5:00 p.m. Michael Osborne, chairman of the Dubai World Cup Committee, said yesterday, "With no more rain, the track will be in perfect shape for Thursday night." Sheikh Mohammed has organized for a helicopter to fly around the course to aid the drying-out process.

TESIO NEXT STOP ON CONCERTO TOUR? The connections of Saturday's GII Jim Beam S. winner **Concerto** (Chief's Crown) have not decided on the colt's next start, but a possible schedule may include the GIII Federico Tesio S. at Pimlico April 19--and may not include the Kentucky Derby May 3. "If everything stays on course, we're thinking strongly of the Tesio," said Mike Boyd, manager at owner George Steinbrenner's Kinsman Farm in Ocala. Next stop after the Tesio could be the Kentucky Derby, Illinois Derby May 10 or the Preakness May 17. "Mr. Steinbrenner is like everybody. Who wouldn't want to win the Kentucky Derby?" said Boyd. "But he isn't willing to run at all costs. He likes to participate in all kinds of sporting events, but he does not have Kentucky Derby fever." A final decision on Concerto's next start will be made in about one week.

THE SILVER MOVE OFF DERBY TRAIL Strike **The Silver Move** (Silver Buck), 10th in the Gotham S. at Aqueduct Saturday, from both the Wood Memorial and Kentucky Derby pictures. Trainer Linda Rice said yesterday that a displaced soft palate caused her colt's disappointing performance, and she will give him a brief rest. "I think what happened was the result of him running back too soon after his last race," said Rice. "It was sooner than he was ready to handle, mentally or physically. There's no chance we'll make the Derby, but we might make the Preakness."

Bidding for his fourth straight win after taking three consecutive Gulfstream allowance tests to start the year, Sharp Appeal ran his 1997 record to four-for-four. Coupled with Claudius in the wagering, the bay settled in the middle of the pack for six furlongs, started his rally around the far turn and then hooked Ok by Me for the stretch duel, prevailing in a hard-fought finish. "He has taken each step up and been up to it," said trainer Martin Wolfson. "We claimed him for \$50,000 as a two-year-old and gave him some time off, then I had to stop on him after he finished second in the Everglades here last year to take a chip out of his left hind. He's come back beautifully for us. He's matured and getting better with age, as did The Vid (a Wolfson trainee also by World Appeal who was recently retired). Maybe it's a good omen--he's now in The Vid's stall." Wolfson added that the colt's next start is up in the air, but stablemate Claudius will run back in the GIII Hialeah Turf Cup April 19. The 3-1 slight choice **DIPLOMATIC JET** (Roman Diplomat) was never in the hunt and finished seventh.

Richter Scale shook things up with an eight-length maiden win at first asking last August at Ellis Park but his next start was a natural disaster, finishing 33 1/2 lengths behind Traitor after pressing the pace in the GI Futurity September 15. Sidelined since, the colt was faultlessly prepared for his return, shadowing the pace to the top of the stretch, then putting a head in front and outfinishing 6-5 favorite Crown Ambassador for his first stakes score. The runner-up was making his first start since running third in the GII Danka Hutcheson S. February 2.

On the turf her two prior starts, Lavender was third in a Santa Anita allowance and then captured the La Habra S. March 8. The versatile bay switched back to the dirt here and made it two stakes wins in a row, battling head-and-head with Soiree to the top of the stretch before gaining the upper hand and drawing away. "I'm really proud of her," said winning jockey Alex Solis. "She is really coming around. She is beginning to settle more. After she got the lead, she heard (Silken Magic) coming and she started flying. I didn't have to ask her. She did it on her own. She flew home." Trainer Ben Cecil said the filly would make her next start in the GII Railbird S. May 18 at Hollywood.

WRITERS UP
WHO'S HOT**By Jack Werk**

When *Daily Racing Form* published its final standings of the Leading Sires of 1996 by North American progeny earnings, Forty Niner appeared at the top of the list. This is a dramatic reminder of some of the very shrewd stallion purchases made by Japan's breeders in recent years. The first major score was Sunday Silence, who was purchased by Zenya Yoshida to stand at his Shadai Farm. Incredibly, after Herculean efforts by Arthur Hancock to syndicate the 1989 Horse of the Year, he was able to come up with just three firm commitments from an industry skeptical of Sunday Silence's stud potential.

Since his first crop stepped foot on the racetrack in 1994, Sunday Silence's influence on Japan's breeding and racing industry has been astounding. He was Japan's Leading Freshman Sire of 1994 and Japan's overall Leading Sire of 1995 and 1996. After having 10 graded stakes winners in 1996, he's come back with five graded stakes winners in the first 75 days of 1997.

The success of Sunday Silence encouraged Japan's breeders to step up their shopping spree for U.S. stallions. In addition to Forty Niner, acquisitions include Criminal Type, Polish Navy, Sunshine Forever and, most recently, Soul of the Matter and Jolie's Halo. They were also the underbidders on Cigar and Unbridled's Song.

There is another stallion acquired by Japan that has turned out to be a major loss to the U.S.--Afleet. Afleet retired to Gainesway Farm in 1989 for a stud fee of \$25,000. Disappointment in the performance of his first two crops to race caused a reduction in his fee to \$10,000 for 1994 after Canada's 1987 Horse of the Year had sired just three minor stakes winners by the end of 1993. However, with three crops to race by the end of 1994, Afleet had produced a respectable 66 percent starters, 46 percent winners to foals, 16 percent two-year-old winners and 14 stakes winners (seven percent). But, with big money on the table and waning interest from U.S. breeders, Afleet was sent to Japan soon after the 1995 breeding season.

No sooner had Afleet crossed the International Date Line than his U.S. runners began to get hot. In 1996 he placed third on the *DRF* Leading Sires list; his 12 unrestricted stakes winners also placed him third among U.S. stallions. The performance of his progeny for 1997 indicates he may be heading for his best year ever. He leads all sires with eight unrestricted stakes winners and is currently ranked No. 1 in progeny earnings.

A review of his current record reveals a stallion who U.S. breeders may have given up on one year too soon. Now, with five crops to race, he has sired 74 percent starters, 61 percent winners to foals, 17 percent two-year-old winners and an outstanding 11.5 percent stakes winners. He has average earnings per starter of \$63,940 and sired 36 stakes winners, averaging better than seven stakes winners per crop. Of his 31 unrestricted stakes winners, 15 are graded, including GI winners Twist Afleet and Flat Fleet Feet.

Afleet's final U.S.-conceived crop, two-year-olds of 1997, totals 60 and I suspect they will continue to remind us of our loss. The only question about his prospects in Japan is his ability to sire turf runners. To date, just six of his 31 stakes winners have won on the turf.
