DUBAI WORLD CUP UPDATE After two days of fine weather, the Nad Al Sheba main sand track is drying well, accelerated by the use of a helicopter being flown low over the track. In preparation for Thursday's re-scheduled Dubai World Cup, the Richard Mandellatrained pair of Siphon (Brz) (Itajara {Brz}) and Sandpit (Brz) (Baynoun {Ire}) breezed on the Nad Al Sheba turf track, with Siphon, the present race favourite, clocking:47 for a half-mile. William Perry's Formal Gold (Black Tie Affair {Ire}) was shipped to Al Quoz training track, where he cantered over seven furlongs. He is expected to have his final workout on the sand today.

ENCOUNTER GAINS REVENGE ON GUINEAS

Nine days after losing the Golden Slipper at Rosehill when he ducked out inside the final furlong and handed the victory to Guineas (Aus) (Crown Jester (Aus)), the Clarrie Conners-trained juvenile colt Encounter (Aus) (Tierce {Aus}) gained sweet revenge on that rival when winning Monday's G1 Sires Produce S. over seven furlongs at Randwick. Encounter was made 15-8 favourite and beat the 5-2 Guineas by a half-length, with 12-1 shot filly Adeewin (Aus) (Snaadee, by Danzig) a further length and a half away third. But inside the final furlong, when jockey Shane Dye hit him once with the whip, Encounter again ducked left; this time he battled on to gain the win. "The Golden Slipper was one of those things," said Conners, recording his fourth win in this event. "The incident just happened so quickly. Outwardly I was OK, but I'd have to say it was one of the most disappointing moments I've ever experienced in racing. It's a bloody shame he didn't win." Dye, who was on board Encounter in the Golden Slipper, said: "Nothing makes up for not winning the Slipper, but winning is always nice." Encounter, bred by Newhaven Park Stud, will now attempt to follow up in the G1 Moet & Chandon Champagne S. over a mile at Randwick on April 12.

PULPIT SHARP AT CHURCHILL DOWNS GII Toyota Blue Grass contender Pulpit (A.P. Indy) posted a strong five-furlong workout Monday morning, going the distance in 1:00 2/5 with regular rider Shane Sellers aboard. The three-year-old galloped out six furlongs in 1:13 3/5 after completing the first quarter in :24 2/5 and a half-mile in :47 2/5. The work matched one other as the fastest among 12 at the distance. "The track was kind of wet and it's a little deep," Sellers said. "Not many horses are going to work like he did this morning. He got over it real good and he was nice and relaxed this morning. He's coming into his own; it's about the time in his career where he needs to start settling down and he is." Added trainer Frank Brothers, "He was fine, willing and galloped out strong. So far, so good," Brothers said the Blue Grass April 12 at Keeneland will probably be the next start for Pulpit.

Top filly Glitter Woman (Glitterman) heads a list of 12 three-year-olds whose names were added to the list of Triple Crown nominees after last Saturday's late closing. Also joining the Triple Crown fray are Air Power (Lord At War {Arg}), Cryp Too (Cryptoclearance), Dipperon, Direct Hit (Mamaison), Frisk Me Now (Mister Frisky), Hamilton Creek (Fortunate Prospect), Jack At The Bank (Water Bank), Lasting Approval (With Approval), Las Vegas Ernie (Time for a Change), Mr. Sweeney (Meadowlake) and Phantom On Tour (Tour d'Or).

ERNIE POULOS PASSES AWAY Funeral services will be held Wednesday morning at Arlington International Racecourse for Ernie Poulos, trainer of Black Tie Affair (Ire), North America's 1991 Horse of the Year, A longtime trainer on the Chicago circuit and a former semi-pro football player, Poulos died Sunday at age 71 at Northwest Community Hospital in Arlington Heights, Illinois of a bacterial infection. He is survived by his wife Dee, a Thoroughbred owner; one son, two daughters and six brothers. Poulos took over the training of Black Tie Affair in 1989 when Jeff Sullivan bought the horse and moved him from the East to the Chicago racing circuit. Third in the 1990 Breeders' Cup Sprint, the grey was stretched out to a mile and a quarter for his next start, the Hawthorne Gold Cup, and responded with an impressive victory. The following year, Poulos kept him running long, highlighting his Horse of the Year campaign with a triumph in the Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs, the last race of his career. Poulos still had horses in training at Sportsman's Park at time of his death.

WINTER WEATHER CANCELS EAST COAST

RACING March exited like a lion on the East Coast yesterday, causing racing cancellations in three states. Aqueduct, running a special Monday card to make up for Sunday's holiday, was forced to conclude the day's program after the second race as early-morning rains turned to snow. "In the best interests and safety of all concerned, we thought it was best to cancel the races today," said NYRA President and COO Terry Meyocks. "The winds are increasing and the precipitation is turning from rain to sleet to snow." After meeting with jockeys yesterday, Suffolk Downs officials canceled live racing shortly before first post time. Also canceling its race card yesterday was Philadelphia Park.

MASSCAP DAY HIGHLIGHTS SUFFOLK

DOWNS SPRING MEET Suffolk Downs plans a blockbuster program May 31 for the 58th running of the GIII Massachusetts H., including six stakes races that could bring the day's total purse payout over the \$1 million mark for the first time in the history of New England racing. In addition to the \$300,000 MassCap. the day will feature the \$200,000 Suffolk Downs Breeders' Cup H. and the \$100,000 Drumtop H. and the \$75,000 Suffolk Downs Oaks. "We've worked hard to make the MassCap a showcase event over the past several seasons," said Executive Vice President of Racing, Lou Raffetto, Jr. "Cigar coming to Suffolk Downs and winning in 1995 and 1996 certainly put the MassCap back on the map. Now our goal is to make the entire weekend a festival-like atmosphere on the Boston sports scene. The big-money stakes races, steeplechase racing and special promotions and giveaways will all add up to a top-class event."

This was New Zealander Shane Dye's first AJC Derby victory and he was fortunate to be riding in the race at all, having incurred a suspension for his ride in last weekend's G1 Ansett Australia S. He managed to persude the Australian Jockey Club stewards to give him a stay of proceedings and they did not hear his appeal until Thursday, the day after the riders for the Derby were announced. Winning trainer Graeme Rogerson said: "Shane told me last September that Ebony Grosve could win the AJC Derby and he has always told me not to worry, despite the horse being defeated a few times. A lot of the credit must go to Shane." Just last weekend Ebony Grosve finished only 10th of 14 behind Octagonal in the Mercedes Classic at Rosehill and Rogerson admitted that he has "drastically changed his routine," with perfect results.
