CAPTAIN BODGIT READY FOR WOOD Kentucky Derby hopeful Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado), who upset the previously undefeated Pulpit (A.P. Indy) to win the GI Florida Derby March 15, had his final breeze for the April 12 Wood Memorial yesterday. The three-year-old colt sped a half-mile in a bullet :46 1/5 at his hometraining base--Bowie Racetrack in Maryland. Owned by Team Valor, Captain Bodgit was caught in fractions of :11 2/5, :22 3/5 and :34 2/5 and galloped out five furlongs in :59 3/5. "He loves this track," said trainer Gary Capuano. "He really gets a hold of it. It's the type of track that horses do get a hold of. He was very, very sharp today." Captain Bodgit is scheduled to work once more at Bowie before vanning to Aqueduct the day before the Wood.

FAIR GROUNDS ENDS RECORD SEASON

Strengthened by a vast simulcasting network, the Fair Grounds ended its 125th anniversary season Monday with record overall mutuel handle. During the 88-day meet, total mutuel handle on Fair Grounds races, including off-track betting and simulcast outlets nationwide, reached \$221,652,207 for a record daily average of \$2,518,775. That was a gain of 26 percent compared to last season's previous record handle of \$175,360,001 for an average of \$1,992,727. The ontrack handle was \$20,237,627 for an average daily handle of \$229,554. That was up .1 percent from a year ago when the on-track handle was \$20,180,889 for an average of \$229,328. Jockey Curt Bourgue towered over a talented jockey colony, earning 91 wins and over \$1.6 million in purses. Ronald Ardoin finished second in the rider's race with 75 wins. Owner-trainer Louie Roussel III ran away with the owner's title with 28 wins. Bradley Cathey, second in last year's trainer's race, won this year's title with 38 races, one more than Tom Amoss.

He couldn't be any more ready for the race." Swiss Yodeler is scheduled to ship to Santa Anita Saturday morning.

Trainer Fidel Cardiel sent Steel Ruhlr (Ruhlmann) through a three-furlong drill Wednesday morning, which the grey colt completed in :35 2/5 with exercise rider Jesus Jimenez in the irons. "He came back to the barn and, as always, didn't seem the least bit tired after the work," said owner Ed Kelaplane. "We moved up his breeze because he felt so good this morning."

DANEHILL COLT TOPS SECOND DAY IN

SYDNEY While his illustrious Coolmore Stud rival Sadler's Wells stole the show on the first day of the Inglis Easter yearling sale in Sydney, it was champion Australian sire Danehill's turn on the second day to take center stage and his colt out of the G1 Blue Diamond S. winner Lady Jakeo (Aus) (Last Tycoon (Ire)) topped the sale at \$554,060 when bought by Epsom/Melbourne trainer David Hall after a protracted duel with trainer Bill Mitchell from Queensland. The price exceeded that paid for the top-priced Danehill colt at last year's sale, which went for \$534,273. Hall would not identify his clients but said that "they are overseas buyers, having their first foray in Australia" and added the colt, "will also race on Australian tracks." The colt was bred by Arrowfield Stud, who stood Danehill before the stallion was bought outright by Coolmore. Twenty-two of Danehill's yearlings have been sold on the first two days of the sale and they have averaged \$207,490, more than twice the sale average of \$78,715. Another high-priced colt by Danehill was bought by New Zealand agent Michael Stedman for \$534,273. This one is out of the American-bred mare Kingston Cara (Seattle Slew). On the first day of the Inglis sale, 165 yearlings were sold for a gross of \$12,739,433--an average of \$77,211. On the second day 85 were sold for a gross of \$7,115,324 and an average of \$83,709.

PERSONAL HOPE IN DEMAND AT SYDNEY

SALES Offspring of Ashford Stud's 'shuttle' stallion Personal Hope have been in demand on the first two days of the Inglis Easter yearling sales in Sydney. His six yearlings to sell grossed \$386,259--an average of \$64,376. His sale topper was a chestnut colt out of Inject (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}, by Sir Tristram), which was sold to Belmont Bloodstock for \$229,539. Two yearlings by Juddmonte Farm's Epsom Derby winner Quest For Fame grossed \$134,558 for an average of \$67,279, with his filly out of Kibitka (Fr) (Baby Turk {Ire}) going to trainer John Morrisey for \$102,897. Six yearlings by Cigar's sire Palace Music grossed \$334,415 for an average of \$55,735, with a filly out of the American-bred mare Evening Sea (Alydar) fetching \$158,303. Chief's Crown's sole representative at the sale did not reach its reserve.

Serious doubts now surround the prospects of Classic hope Bahhare (Woodman), undefeated in three starts and winner of the G2 Laurent Perrier Champagne S., making the line-up for next month's 2000 Guineas. The John Dunlop-trained colt had been favorite for the May 3 Newmarket Classic, but Britain's bookmakers eased his odds significantly yesterday after it was revealed that the unbeaten three-year-old has suffered a training setback. No precise details of Bahhare's condition will be released from Dunlop's stables at Arundel in Sussex until Friday and the trainer's spokesman refused to confirm any more than that colt "missed work on Tuesday because he was not moving well."

Champion three-year-old Mouawad (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}, by Sir Tristram) was put on the market as a stallion prospect only Tuesday and a deal has already been struck which values him at \$3,166,069. His owners, the Rob McAnulty-led Easter Syndicate, which includes the colt's New Zealand-based breeder Patrick Hogan, have clinched a deal which will mean Mouawad will be shared between Glenlogan Park Stud in Queensland and the German-backed Roselands Stud in Victoria, with the new stallion doing alternate seasons at each.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

SECRET SAVINGS (h, 6, Seeking the Gold-Jurisdictional, by Damascus)

The fact that Thoroughbred racing and breeding is growing ever more international was underlined again on Saturday at Randwick racecourse, Sydney. There, Australia's leading mile contest, the G1 Doncaster H., was captured by Secret Savings, a U.S.-bred owned by His Excellency Nasser Lootah, who is from Dubai.

Secret Savings, who was bred by Ogden Mills Phipps, had smart form in the U.S., where he won six races. But since being given the chance to race on the turf in Australia, he has truly blossomed. In his Australian debut, Secret Savings bettered the track record for 1,200m (the metric equivalent of six furlongs) while taking the G3 STC Frederick Clissold H. In the Doncaster H., Secret Savings carried 57 kg (approximately 126 lbs.), a weight which has only been exceeded by one Doncaster winner in the last 25 years.

There has been considerable controversy in recent weeks regarding the Rasmussen Factor, a name coined by *Owner-Breeder* magazine to describe "inbreeding to superior female families through different individuals," a technique long advocated by breeding writer Leon Rasmussen. Secret Savings's dam is a sister to Time for a Change, which means he is inbred to the mare Broadway, who appears 3x4 as granddam of Seeking the Gold and dam of Reviewer, the sire of Jurisdictional's dam Resolver.

Broadway's claims to superiority are pretty strong. On the track she won the Polly Drummond S. and was second in the Selima S. At stud she did even better, producing four stakes-winners headed by Reviewer, a talented but fragile colt who went on to sire the brilliant and tragic Ruffian, and Reviewer's sister, Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Queen of the Stage. Broadway's unraced daughter Con Game is dam not only of Seeking the Gold, but also of graded stakes-winners Fast Play and Stacked Pack.

Secret Savings's fifth dam is another great mare, Grey Flight, and by coincidence Grey Flight is the Rasmussen Factor in another outstanding Australian speedster. This is the G1 Australian S. winner Spartacus (Snippets-Pazzihi, by Manihi). Snippets is a great-grandson of Tom Fool and is out of a mare by Northern Dancer's son Grand Chaudiere. His granddam Scampering (Aus) is by Misty Day, a son of Grey Flight. Spartacus's granddam is by American-bred Bay Phantom. Since Bay Phantom is by Misty Day's half-brother Gray Phantom, Spartacus has Grey Flight 5x5 in his pedigree.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

Was there ever a mare with a less appropriate name than No Class? Having demonstrated fair class on the racetrack--she won three races and finished third in the GIC Princess Elizabeth S .-- No Class has produced virtually nothing but class at stud. From seven foals of racing age, No Class is dam of six starters and six winners and when Always a Classic (c, 4, Deputy Minister--No Class, by Nodouble) won the GIII Explosive Bid S. at Fair Grounds Saturday, he became her sixth graded stakeswinner (including Canadian graded stakes). The others include Champion Canadian Two-Year-Old and very successful Canadian sire Regal Classic; multiple Champion Sky Classic, now a promising young sire; and Classy 'n Smart, a Canadian Champion who subsequently produced Canadian Horse of the Year Dance Smartly. In passing, it might also pay to note that there seems to be something of an affinity between Deputy Minister's sire Vice Regent and No Class's sire Nodouble.

The victories of Concerto (c, 3, Chief's Crown--Undeniably, by In Reality) in the GII Jim Beam S. and Set to Sizzle (c, 3, Miswaki--Smiling Neatly, by Neater) in the GIIIC Friar Rock S. made it a good weekend for inbreeding to the Nasrullah/Princequillo cross. Concerto, who now looks like a real contender for the Triple Crown, has the cross 3x3 through Chief's Crown's broodmare sire Secretariat and through Envoy, grandsire of his second dam, this pair both being by Bold Ruler out of Princeguillo mares. Set to Sizzle is by Miswaki, whose second dam Rose Bower is by Princequillo out of a Nasrullah mare. Set to Sizzle's third dam Stolen Scepter is by Jacinto (by Bold Ruler, by Nasrullah) out of a mare by Princequillo. To extend the connection, Concerto is out of a mare by In Reality and Set to Sizzle is out of a mare by a son of In Reality. Another weekend stakeswinner with Nasrullah/Princequillo combinations--along with a double of Northern Dancer--is the Queen Breeders' Cup H. scorer Flashy Four (f, 4, Storm Cat--Amy Be Good, by Northern Raja). Storm Cat is out of a mare by Secretariat (Nasrullah/Princequillo) and Amy Be Good's dam is by Go Marching (by Princequillo out of a Nasrullah mare). Flashy Four also has Northern Dancer 3x4 through a son and a daughter (in the male line of the sire and on the zig-zag of the dam).

It seems only fairly recently that we first started noting stakes-winners with Northern Dancer inbreeding. Of course, not only are these now weekly occurrences, but we are starting to get stakes-winners inbred to Northern Dancer's sons. The latest of these is Yxenery (Ire) (f, 3, Sillery--Polyxena, by Lyphard), who took the Prix La Camargo, a French 1,000 Guineas trial, at Saint-Cloud Friday. Her sire, Sillery, the Leading European Freshman Sire of 1996, is by Blushing Groom out of a Lyphard mare, giving Yxenery a 4x2 cross of Lyphard.
