#### IRA BOMBS CANCEL GRAND NATIONAL

A sell-out crowd of 60,000 had to be evacuated from the grandstands at Aintree racecourse in Liverpool. England Saturday and the 150th running of the Grand National Steeplechase had to be abandoned even as the field of 38 was heading for the post parade after two coded warnings about possible bombs at the track were telephoned in to numbers in the Liverpool area. Police and racing authorities ordered the racecourse and grandstand to be cleared, and the rest of the day's meeting was canceled. Attending the races at Aintree yesterday were Princess Anne, as well as Academy Award-winning actor Gregory Peck, who was celebrating his 81st birthday. The public cooperated perfectly and the evacuation went off smoothly, but the telephone warnings were taken extremely seriously; after the evacuation was completed, the police carried out two controlled bomb explosions at the racecourse. It has been confirmed that the Irish Republican Army is responsible; only last Thursday, the IRA brought many of the motorways in Britain to a standstill after activating security alerts, with two minor explosions taking place. Police would not allow racing fans to return to their cars in the Aintree parking lot until they felt the threat has passed; emergency housing for fans stranded in Liverpool was being arranged. This is the second time in five years that the Grand National has had to be canceled. In 1993 the race was declared void when, after two false starts, more than half the field did race, their riders ignoring calls to return to the start. That race was never rerun, but it is expected that this year's edition, sponsored by Martell, will go off Monday, April 7 as the sole race on the Aintree programme.

#### SANTA ANITA DERBY IS ON "THE

HOUSE" The Kentucky Derby picture is far from black and white four weeks before the race, and in fact may be dominated by shades of grey after yesterday's GI Santa Anita Derby. The \$750,000 event saw the dark grey Silver Charm (Silver Buck) and his paler rival Free House (Smokester) battle to the wire, with 7-1 Free House prevailing by a head. It was nearly a rerun of the pair's last encounter, the GII San Felipe S. March 16, when Free House again proved narrowly best, Winning that test by three-quarters of a length. "I definitely see the Kentucky Derby in his future," said jockey Kent Desormeaux. Santa Anita Derby news cont. p3

Teaming up again for the first time since they finished fourth in last December's GI Hollywood Futurity, Free House and jockey Kent Desormeaux, who captured last year's GII Norfolk S. together, were overlooked at the windows despite besting second choice Silver Charm in the GII San Felipe S. in their last meeting March 16. The two sat just behind Silver Charm and slight choice SHARP CAT (Storm Cat) as those two battled through hot early fractions, then came with a three-wide sweep at the top of the stretch and just got the better of the runner-up in the final strides. The winner had finished off the board in three straight after his Norfolk win but has regained his form to join the Triple Crown fray. "He's just a big kid," said trainer Paco Gonzalez. "He likes to play all the time. He likes to look around--he watches everything. But he's more into his races now. He's very competitive." Added Desormeaux, "As we turned for home, I asked the big question and he answered tenaciously. He just went right to the leaders, but he's talented enough that once he gets there he's bored and kind of waits on them. But I'll tell you, after the wire (Silver Charm) came back at him and he would not let him by." As for the second-place finisher, trainer Bob Baffert said, "This horse, he needed the route. This horse has so much heart, and he'll really move forward after this. He's really getting fit now. He's a major player and he showed that today. I can tell my wife (Sherry) to order a hat--! think I've got Derby fever." Third-place finisher Hello (Ire) was unsettled in the starting gate and also upset Sharp Cat, causing her to pop open the stall doors before the break; both are still possible for the Kentucky Derby May 3.

Looking for her fourth straight stakes score after going three-for-three at Gulfstream, Glitter Woman was just as much at home on the surface at Keeneland, sitting second for a guarter before surging to the lead and then steadily increasing her margin to post yet another impressive score. "This race didn't come up exactly the way we wanted," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "I like for a horse to be in front of her because she can get to looking around a little bit. Mike (Smith) said when she turned for home and she heard the crowd screaming, he reached back and hit her one time and she jumped right back into it. There wasn't any doubt." As for what's next, McGaughey left the door open for a Kentucky Derby bid, saying, "Right now, we're pointing for the Kentucky Oaks (May 2), but that's something (owner Joe Allen) and I will sit down and talk about. We'll see what happens (in the Santa Anita Derby). We'll see what happens next Saturday here and in Arkansas and New York--and we'll just take it from there." Eclipse Award winner Storm Song, off the board against Glitter Woman at Gulfstream in her first two starts this year, showed a little more life with an even third-place finish here. "My filly ran real good." said jockey Craig Perret. "We just wanted to get her back on track. That track in Florida was too hard, and she wouldn't finish there. It was just stinging her too much. Now she's trying, so hopefully this will set her up for a big race."

Atticus ended 1996 with a sixth-place performance in the Nov. 30 GI NYRA Mile H on the main track. He started 1997 with a world record-setting performance in winning the Mar. 1 Gll Arcadia H. on the turf at Santa Anita, going a mile in 1:31 4/5. The third choice ran up close the pace the entire way, slipped past the pacesetter on the inside to grab the lead after a half-mile, opened up on the turn and increased the margin in the stretch. "Unlike Siphon, Atticus has never had to have the lead," assistant trainer Gary Mandella said. "This horse is very ratable." Second choice Isitingood, whose record Atticus broke, sat off the pace, moved into contention around the far turn, but couldn't gain ground in the stretch. "I was happy with my position as we went around the first turn," jockey David Flores said. "On the backside, he wanted to back out of there a little, and I had to start riding him more than I wanted to going into the turn." Favorite Tejano Run trailed the field early, advanced in the stretch but never was a threat. "He's a millionaire now," trainer Kenneth McPeek said. "The race track at Hialeah, where he ran a big race in the Widener, is much deeper than Oaklawn. That was his kind of track. Our next start likely is the Pimlico Special." VICTORY SPEECH (Deputy Minister) pressed the early pace but faded in the stretch. EDITOR'S NOTE (Forty Niner) tired nearing the far turn and finished last.

ON "THE HOUSE" cont. Kent Desormeaux picked up the winning mount on Free House in the Santa Anita Derby after David Flores chose to stick with Isitingood for the Oaklawn H. "He ran super," said the jockey. "What a luxury for a jockey to just, at will, put him everywhere we needed to be. I needed him to move up and I'd just ask a little bit and he'd move that length and then just cruise again. It was a wonderful effort. I'll tell you, nasty, nasty fractions. He had every right to cave in, but he was the most tenacious to the wire. He's got the kind of capabilities and the kind of mind you want to go a mile-and-a-quarter." Owners John Toffan and Trudy McCaffery, whose Mane Minister finished third in all three Triple Crown races, are looking forward to another crack at the series. "We just got over the last one, which was six years ago, but Paco (Gonzalez) knows how to handle it this time," said Toffan. Silver Charm, pressed from the outset through fractions of :45 and 1:09 by the filly Sharp Cat (Storm Cat), held on with determination in his second two-turn start. "He was coming back," said his jockey, Gary Stevens. "I thought I was going to get it back, I really did." Sharp Cat, facing colts after four straight wins against fillies, tired from her early effort and finished sixth. "I thought she ran well," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "More than anything, this was the first time she had that pressure pushing and banging on her. It's a growing experience." As for the Derby, Lukas said, "I think Richard Mulhall, the Prince and I will get together--it will be a discussion. If you're thinking of the Oaks, you can make a decision on Wednesday or Thursday (of Derby week). So we'll just take it one step at a time." Carmen's Baby (lam the Iceman), fifth at 62-1, pulled up lame and was vanned off. He suffered ruptured left front suspensory ligaments, "It's probably career-ending, but it's not lifethreatening," said Los Angeles Turf Club veterinarian Dr. Ray Baran. Saturday's handle at Santa Anita, \$20,621,422, was a record for Derby Day and the third-highest in track history; handle on the Grade I event was a record \$3,886,607. Yesterday's attendance was 36,625, up 12.6 percent over last year's Santa Anita Derby crowd.
