### TRAITOR DEFECTS FROM TRIPLE CROWN

TRAIL Off his feed recently, Traitor

(Cryptoclearance) has been removed from the Triple Crown trail. Trainer Mary Eppler reported vesterday that her horse has not been eating well and has lost a considerable amount of weight in recent weeks. "He's not eating properly," Eppler said, "I would say he's lost 200 to 300 pounds You can't go into a race if you're not 110 percent. If we were going to make the Derby, he wasn't going to be able to miss any of the preps." Eppler said she believes Traitor has lost the weight because the stable had been rushing to try and make the Derby after the horse was injured in an incident on the Hialeah backstretch. "He missed three weeks and we had to play catch-up and condense his training. By doing that, he slowed down in his eating and lost weight." Eppler said the entire Triple Crown series is out and that Traitor may return to the races by June.

JACK KENT COOKE DEAD Sports and business modul Jack Kent Cooke died vesterday of congestive heart failure at George Washington University Hospital. He was 84. Cooke had announced in January the complete dispersal of his Thoroughbred racing and breeding stock and at the same time had put his 500acre Elmendorf Farm near Lexington, Kentucky up for sale. Cooke, involved in sports for more than 40 vears, was the majority owner of the NFL's Washington Redskins and recently oversaw the building of a new stadium for the team in Raljon, Maryland. He also owned the Los Angeles Daily News and the Chrysler Building in New York. In racing since 1980, Cooke purchased Elmendorf in 1984 and raced such top homebreds as 1996 MGSW Antespend and MGSW Flying Continental.

Blushing K.D. captured her fourth straight stakes victory after winning three stakes at the Fair Grounds including the Mar. 15 GIII Fair Grounds Oaks in her previous start. The favorite disputed the pace between rivals early, grabbed the lead before going a half-mile, opened up around the far turn and increased her advantage through the stretch. "The (May 2) Kentucky Oaks has been our plan all along, and we are sticking with it," winning trainer Sam B. David Jr. said. "We were going to take her back a little (off the pace), but that horse (Ajina), came out and bumped us on the far turn, but ours jumped into the bridle and went on." Valid Bonnet, winner of the GIII Honeybee in her last outing, sat just off the early speed battle, tried to challenge the winner turning for home but could not get by the winner. "I'm going to have to stop following that other filly (Blushing K.D.)," Steve Asmussen, trainer of Valid Bonnet, said. "She's too much. On the (far) turn, I could see we had a lot left, but so did the winner." Multiple graded stakes winner Aiina held a short lead early but tired to third in the stretch.

The bay, last after three-quarters, rallied sharply through the stretch to earn his first stakes victory. "This is a very nice horse," winning rider Chris McCarron said after the race. "He hasn't had a chance to run very many times because he's been kind of prone to injury. He's a very talented racehorse, though." Trainer Ron Ellis added, "He had shin (problems) when he was younger--a lot of small problems, but he looks like he's ready for a good year this year."

GRAND NATIONAL TO RUN TODAY Mersevside police have given racing officials the green light to stage the Grand National Steeplechase today. The race was originally scheduled for this past Saturday, but bomb threats forced the abandonment of the race meeting at Aintree. Police are now satisfied that the racecourse is safe and the Grand National Steeplechase will be run this afternoon at 5:00 p.m. local time. However, it will be the only race to take place, the final two scheduled races on the program have been canceled. It is not vet certain that all 38 intended runners in the Grand National will be in the line-up. All wagers taken on the race will stand, unless fans request their money back before the race. Most trainers have shown willingness to run their horses, but some have expressed concern that the track may have been damaged by the public walking over it after Saturday's emergency evacuation of the grandstand areas. Fancied runners Belmont King and Suny Bay are now doubtful for the race. The police allowed members of the public, not permitted to return to the car parks Saturday night, to collect their vehicles Sunday under strict security supervision.

#### MCGAUGHEY MULLS OPTIONS FOR GLITTER

WOMAN Coming off a 61/2-length win in Saturday's Ashland at Keeneland, Glitter Woman (Glitterman) is likely to make her next start in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks, but trainer Shug McGaughey is still keeping an eye on the Triple Crown trail. While McGaughey has not ruled out starting the 3-year-old filly in the Kentucky Derby, he admitted yesterday he's more inclined at this point to look at the May 17 Preakness. "The Preakness makes a lot of sense," he said. "We could run her in the Kentucky Oaks, and, if she runs good there, that gives us something to look at. Unless something outstanding happens in the Derby, we could look at running her in the Preakness. I'd be more inclined to go in the Oaks and then the Preakness, than in the Derby," Glitter Woman has won four straight, but has never run beyond a mile and a sixteenth. McGaughev admitted he has reservations about her getting a distance, but Glitter Woman continues to handle every challenge thrown her way. "I was surprised when she ran long in the first place," McGaughey said. "Now, I think she's better going long than short. But going a mile and a quarter in Louisville is a long way and it's a long year."

SANTA ANITA DERBY WRAP-UP The connections of Free House (Smokester) and Silver Charm (Silver Buck), the first two finishers in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, are making plane reservations for a trip to the 123rd Kentucky Derby. "He came out of the race in good order," trainer Paco Gonzalez said of Free House. "We're planning on going to Kentucky next." Bob Baffert, trainer of Silver Charm, admitted his charge was, "pretty tired after the race," but added, "Silver Charm has so much heart and he'll really move forward after this." Trainer Ron McAnally listed the Kentucky Derby "a possibility" for Santa Anita Derby third-place finisher Hello (Ire) (Lycius). Also possible for the Run for the Roses, is fourth-place finisher Steel Ruhlr (Ruhlmann). Trainer D. Wayne Lukas expressed some doubt that his filly, Sharp Cat (Storm Cat), sixth as the favorite Saturday, would make the Derby line-up. "It's more likely we'll go next in the Kentucky Oaks (May 2)," Lukas said. "But we can wait until the last minute to make the decision."
