### LORD GYLLENE WINS GRAND NATIONAL

Leading almost from start to finish, the Steve Brookshaw-trained nine-year-old gelding Lord Gyllene (NZ) (Ring The Bell {NZ}) yesterday became only the second New Zealand-bred horse to win the Martell Grand National at Aintree, following in the hoofsteps of Seagram (NZ), winner in 1991. Ridden by young Northern Irishman jockey Tony Dobbin, the 14-1 Lord Gyllene, owned by Stan Clarke, beat the 8-1 second favourite Suny Bay (Ire) (Roselier {Fr}) by 25 lengths, with 100-1 outsider Camelot Knight (Ire) (King's Ride {Ire}) two lengths away third; 1995 Cheltenham Gold Cup winner Master Oats (GB) (Oats {Ire}) was fifth in the field reduced to 34 after the race was postponed Saturday because of IRA bomb threats. The winner collected a purse of \$284,578. Said Clarke, chairman of Uttoxeter and Newcastle racecourses and involved in racing for 35 years: "Aintree has all the magic you could look for in racing. This was a wonderful achievement. Lord Gyllene is a big, athletic horse, stays all day. I bought the horse from New Zealand after only seeing him on a video." Winning trainer Steve Brookshaw, whose uncle Tim Brookshaw finished second in the 1959 Grand National after losing his stirrup iron, said: "We knew he stayed, as he won over four-and-a-quarter miles earlier this season. I didn't give the jockey any instructions. He gave him a great ride." Dobbin, who missed the last three Grand Nationals due to injury and had had only one previous ride in the race, was partnering Lord Gyllene for the third time and this was their second victory together. "We had only one scare, when one of the loose horses tried to push us out at the fence in front of the stands. He gave me a brilliant ride," he said.

**NEW YORKERS LOOK TO RESUSCITATE**

**RACING** A group of prominent owners, breeders and industry observers figures what New York racing needs is a little CPR. Concerned that New York racing is heading into the future without a comprehensive plan of action to deal with its many problems, a new group has been formed to "research all options and make recommendations to the industry and government and educate the public concerning racing's preservation." The formation of the Center To Preserve Racing, or CPR, was announced yesterday; its leaders hope to act as an industry think tank that will be in place to help racing in any way it can, offering suggestions and opinions on the direction the sport should take, whether those opinions are solicited or not. "This is a critical year in the racing industry nationwide and in New York in particular," said owner/breeder Howard Nolan Jr., who is among 10 individuals listed on CPR's Board of Advisors. "There is the NTA and the recently announced initiative including the NTA, the Breeders' Cup, the Jockey Club and others. New York racing doesn't seem to be involved in taking the leadership role it once did. The industry is going from one crisis to another. It's time to seek solutions rather than continually running to Albany for answers." In addition to Nolan, the Board of Advisors consists of Kenneth Avazino, Steven Crist, Orison Curpier, William Kellman, Michael T. Martin, Richard Morris, Jill Rich, Donald Rudder and Stuart Subotnick.

The first leg of the Japanese triple crown for three-year-old fillies was won by the 8-5 favorite Kyoei March, giving her sire Dancing Brave his first Group 1 winner in Japan. Breaking from the extreme outside in the field of 18, the filly sat second behind the pace of 56-1 MINISKIRT (JPN) (Pluralisme). As the field came into the stretch, Kyoei March took over and drew away to score by four lengths over 1996's Champion Juvenile Filly Mejiro Dober. Winning rider Mikio Matsunaga said, "I was very glad that we did what was expected of us. I am sure that Kyoei March will be able to make it in the long distance race, too." The next race for Kyoei March should be the Japanese Oaks at Tokyo May 25.

Trainer Bart Cummings won his seventh AJC Australian Oaks with his filly Danendri (Aus), runner-up to Ebony Grosve (NZ) in the Australian Derby. Owned by Dato Tan Chin Nam, who also races Melbourne Cup winner Sainly (Aus), and the Wynyarra Stud Syndicate, Danendri, the 11-8 favourite, produced a dramatic and strong late finish to win impressively, with Ellakapella (NZ), unlucky when stopped at the eighth pole, third. Danendri, winner of the G1 Ansett Australia S. two weeks ago was partnered by Glen Boss, who on Thursday rode Australian hope Juggler (Aus) to finish sixth to Singspiel (Ire) in the Dubai World Cup. Cummings said of his filly: "She is as tough as they come. I was always confident that she would be able to back up, as she never left an oat and looked good to the eye. She deserved this after her unlucky run in the Derby." Asked if the Oaks winner would take on Octagonal (NZ) in next weekend's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick, Cummings said: "You can't got to the well too often. If I was Danendri, I would be looking for a spell (rest)."

## Local News: Hong Kong

South Africa's 1995/96 Horse Of The Year **London News (SAf)** (Bush Telegraph {SAf}) has arrived safely in Hong Kong for his attempt to win Sunday's Queen Elizabeth II Cup over a mile and a quarter at Sha-Tin. ## Local News: Illinois

The latest episode in the long series of actions involving the Illinois Racing Board and owner/trainer Noel Hickey unfolded Monday when Cook County Circuit Judge Ellis Reed granted the horseman a stay of the latest one-year suspension imposed by the Board. The order allows Hickey to resume training until the court rules on his petition for review of the penalty, first imposed after six of his horses tested positive for Albuterol in 1994. The Illinois First District Court of Appeals dismissed the suspension March 5, ruling the IRB did have the required majority when it first voted on the case; Board Member John Simon reintroduced the motion at an IRB meeting March 11 and the suspension passed this time by a vote of 7-0.
