HALO AMERICA MAKES THE GRADE IN

APPLE BLOSSOM Halo America (Waquoit) increased her record at Oaklawn Park to five wins and three seconds from eight starts and picked up her first Grade | stakes victory, taking yesterday's GI Apple Blossom S. by four lengths. The seven-year-old led from gate to wire at nearly 6-1 and handed 1996 champion older mare Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint) her first defeat of the season; the Eclipse winner and 4-5 favorite rallied but couldn't catch the winner while outfinishing 5-2 Different (Arg) (Candy Stripes) to take second by a head. "This mare is really doing good right now--as good as she has ever done," said winning jockey Calvin Borel. "By the middle of the first turn I was grinning from ear to ear. From that point on all I had to do was make sure I ddin't fall off." Halo America will now head for the breeding shed, but winning trainer Bobby Barnett left the door open for a return to the track after she is bred. "We nominated her to a couple of races at Churchill." he said. "In the past (owner John Franks) has bred 'em and brought 'em back." (Chart, p3)

CIGAR PAYOUT IMMINENT? According to a report in vesterday's Racing Post, the insurance company which holds the fertility policy on Cigar (Palace Music) is expected to make the \$25 million settlement payment by the end of this month. But before the check is delivered, Assicurazioni Generali SPA is looking into the question as to who holds the merchandizing rights to the two-time Horse of the Year. "(Allen) Paulson signed over the rights to hats, T-shirts, statues and the like to a management group, and there are numerous companies who are producing such things," Pete Trend, the company's leading underwriter, explained to the Racing Post. "They have all got to be stopped. As is common in insurance laws, if you are paying for something you expect to own the whole of it, and our lawyers were talking about it just last night." But he added, "Everyone is relaxed about it and we are ready to go as soon as all that is resolved."

WORLD-RECORD HOLDER LUCKY FOREVER

RETIRED Lucky Forever (Lucky North), who set the world record for six-and-a-half furlongs going the distance in 1:13 1/5 in the 1995 Rich Cream H. at Hollywood Park, is likely to be retired after finishing fifth in the GII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita April 5. "He had a lot of deep cuts on him after the race," said trainer Gary Lewis. "We're turning him out four-to-five months, but by the time we get him back to racing, he'll be almost nine. So I think we'll retire him." The eight-year-old gelding posted his final victory in a Santa Anita allowance February 14, coming off a 13-month layoff to win by 4 1/2 lengths. He won seven of 22 career starts and \$451,150.
