

FULL SISTER TO MECKE SETS RECORD

AT KEENELAND A full sister to multi-millionaire Mecke, winner of the GI Arlington Million and GI Early Times Turf Classic on the grass and the GI Isle of Capri Super Derby on the dirt, brought a bid of \$480,000 to top the first session of the 1997 Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale which began vesterday in Lexington. The price was a record for a filly at the sale, besting the old mark of \$380,000 set last year for Fusaichi Grace (Storm Cat). Consigned by Farnsworth Farms, agent, the bay daughter of Maudlin--Beautiful Bid (Baldski) was purchased by trainer John Ward on behalf of John C. Oxley, "She's a nice, big, smooth filly," said Ward, who will condition the session topper. The top-selling colt on the opening day of the sale was a son of Time for a Change--Spoiled Lady (Graustark); part of the late Jack Kent Cooke's complete dispersal of Elmendorf Farm, the bay, named Spoiled Change, brought a bid of \$310,000 from Ben Glass, acting as agent for Gary and Mary West, "We really liked him," said Glass, who trained for the Wests for about 15 years and now manages their horses. "He's a terrificlooking individual. He's a very athletic, very neat individual." Trainer Mark Hennig will handle the colt. A total of 67 two-year-olds sold for \$6,844,500 Tuesday, an average of \$102,157 and a median of \$75,000. The auction concludes this evening, with the bidding set to begin at 6:30 p.m.

ORDWAY OUT OF DERBY Ordway (Salt Lake), fourth in last Saturday's GII Wood Memorial, will pass the May 3 GI Kentucky Derby in favor of the May 17 GI Preakness, trainer Dave Donk said yesterday. "I think that's what's best for the horse and that's what I'm trying to look out for," said Donk. "I still think he'd run well in the Derby, but there's so much else in front of us the rest of the year and I think the two extra weeks will do us some good." **News cont. p2**

KRIS COLT TOPS AT TATTERSALLS A colt by Kris (GB) out of stakes winner My Sister Ellen (Lyphard) attracted the top bid on the first day of the Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sales, which began Tuesday in Newmarket, England. Consigned by Whitechurch Stud, Ireland, as agent, the chestnut was purchased for \$119,089 by P.F.I. Cole, Ltd. A total of 69 two-year-olds brought \$2,023,179, up 40 percent from last year's opener when 62 lots grossed \$1,444,505; the 1997 average of \$29,321 saw a gain of nearly 26 percent over last year's first-day figure of \$23,298. The two-day auction concludes this evening, with bidding set to begin at 5:45 p.m.

DEFRERE ON THE MEND Defrere (Deputy Minister), who suffered a pelvis injury in February, is expected to make a full recovery but is likely to miss the remainder of the 1997 breeding season. "Defrere has returned to Hill 'n' Dale from Hagyard-Davis-McGee Hospital," said John Sikura, owner of the Lexington farm. "His progress has been considerable and I am happy to report he is walking soundly. But it is unlikely he will breed in 1997, as we are late in the breeding season." Defrere had been booked to more than 80 mares, but was injured just before the start of the season. He stood his first year in 1996; his stud fee is \$5,000, live foal.

BARBARA DAVIS NAMED TOBA "OWNER OF

THE MONTH" Barbara J. Davis, who picked up two more stakes wins last month, has been honored as the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association's "Owner of the Month" for March. Davis' More To Tell (Moro), a six-year-old bred in New York by her father, Albert Davis, captured the GIII Grey Lag H. at Aqueduct March 8, and Royal Haven (Hail Emperor), claimed for \$75,000 in August, 1995, took the Toboggan H. March 16; More To Tell came right back to win an overnight handicap March 22, while stablemate Shoop (Double Sonic) finished second in the GIII Next Move H. March 9. Davis, who currently has approximately 25 horses with trainer Gasper Moschera and exercises many of her string, has been the leading owner in total victories in New York for the last three years, sending out 52 winners in '96 alone.

HALO AMERICA (m, 7, Waquoit--Ameriangel, by

Halo) The tough and durable Halo America gained a well-deserved reward for several seasons of good work when taking Friday's GI Apple Blossom H., her first success in a Grade I contest. Halo America is the outstanding runner sired by the good Maryland sire Waquoit. A son of Relaunch, Waquoit was also a very durable campaigner, winning 13 stakes events from two to five, including successive GI Brooklyn H.'s and a runaway 15-length score in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup.

Waquoit's sire Relaunch is out of a mare by The Axe II and Waquoit himself is out of a mare by Grey Dawn II, which creates a rather interesting pedigree pattern as both The Axe II and Polamia (dam of Grey Dawn II) are by Mahmoud and have Blue Larkspur as sire of their second dams.

Halo America is out of a mare by Halo, a stallion whose dam is by Cosmic Bomb (out of a Blue Larkspur mare) and whose second dam Almahmoud is by Mahmoud. Halo likes nothing better than to pick up more Mahmoud, preferably in combination with Blue Larkspur. For example, millionaire Lively One is out of a mare by The Axe II; Devil's Bag, Saint Ballado and Glorious Song all have The Axe II's three-parts brother Cohoes (Mahmoud out of a Blue Larkspur mare) as sire of their second dam, and Canadian champion filly Tilt My Halo is out of a mare by a son of Cohoes. Halo also seems to have something of a prediliction of the strain of Grey Dawn II's sire Herbager. Devil's Bag, Saint Ballado and Glorious Song are all out of a Herbager mare and Herbager also appears in the pedigrees of Halo's Canadian Grade I winner Devilish Gleam and the Matchmaker S. victress Radiant Ring.

While Waquoit provides the Mahmoud, Blue Larkspur and Herbager strains which work so well with Halo, Halo America's dam returns the compliment with double of a strain which Waquoit enjoys, that of Turn-to. Six of Waquoit's 14 stakes winners have a strain of Turn-to in their pedigree and Halo America's dam has that horse 3x2. That Waquoit works with Turn-to should be no surprise. Turn-to is by Royal Charger and Waquoit is inbred 4x4 to Mahmoud, who is three-parts brother to Royal Charger's granddam, Mumtaz Begum and in fact is even more closely related to Royal Charger's dam, Sun Princess.

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

The combination of Lear Fan with mares by Nureyev has already produced French champions Loup Solitaire and Verveine and it looks as if the cross has another very nice representative in Fantastic Fellow (c, 3, Lear Fan--Chateaubaby, by Nureyev), easy winner of the French 2000 Guineas trial, the Prix Djebel Saturday. The success of the combination is no coincidence as it gives the brother and sister to Lt. Stevens and Thong 3x4. Similarly, French listed scorer Hill Silver is by Alysheba (dam is a sister to the dam of Lear Fan) out of a Nureyev mare and is bred on the same pattern.

Champion Pleasant Tap was represented by his first stakes winner from his freshman crop when three-yearold Willing (c, 3, Pleasant Tap--Lusty Lady, by Star de Naskra) landed the Citation S. at Hialeah Sunday. Willing has Never Bend 4x4 through daughters and Double Jay 5x5 through sons.

Wild Again seems to like to pick up the strain of his broodmare sire Khaled, a Khaled duplication having appeared in Wild Again's graded stakes winners Power Lunch and La Rosa and in the speedy Wild Harmony. There was a new addition to the club on Saturday when the Bayakoa S. at Oaklawn fell to **Omi (f, 4, Wild Again** --**Flying Heat, by Private Account)**. It was a good weekend for Omi's dam, Flying Heat as her three-year-old daughter, Flying Lauren (by Storm Bird) won an allowance at Keeneland.

The Avenue of Flags bandwagon continues to roll. When Avenue of Gold (f, 4, Avenue of Flags--Golden Garden, by Golden Eagle II) won the Powder Room H. at Golden Gate Saturday, she brought his total of stakes winners to four, a figure achieved from just 38 starters. Avenue of Flags' other three black-type scorers have Northern Dancer in the pedigree, but Avenue of Gold has a rather different pattern. Avenue of Flags has Princequillo 5x6x5 and Avenue of Gold's broodmare sire, Golden Eagle II, is out of a Princequillo mare. One of the Princequillo strains in Avenue of Flags comes through Stepping Stone, the granddam of Bold Bidder (sire of Avenue of Flags second dam). What's particularly interesting is that both Stepping Stone and Golden Eagle II's dam, Aquilla, are by Princequillo and both are out of daughters of the mare Traverse. We might also note that while the dam of Avenue of Gold is inbred to Case Ace, Seattle Slew, the sire of Avenue of Flags, carries a half-sister to Case Ace.

Hong Kong's international Queen Elizabeth II Cup Sunday saw local champion Privilege and Godolphin challenger Annus Mirabilis defeated by South African star London News (SAf) (h, 5, Bush Telegraph {SAf}--Soho Secret {SAf}, by Regent Street {Arg}) who ran the 10 furlongs in a course record-breaking 2:00.30. While London News's sire and dam might not be immediately familiar names, there is a considerable North American background to the pedigree. The sire is by Bold Ruler's son Jungle Cove and the second dam is Secret Landing, a North American-bred daughter of First Landing. The pedigree is also interesting for boasting the three-quarters brothers Heliopolis and Gulf Stream 3x5.
