ANTESPEND BRINGS \$900,000 AT

KEENELAND Keeneland's April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale concluded yesterday with MGISW Antespend (Spend a Buck)--one of 12 older horses in the dispersal of the late Jack Kent Cooke's Elmendorf Farm--selling for top price of \$900,000. An earner of \$865,399, the four-year-old filly was sold to Chester Broman of Chestertown Farm in Chestertown, New York, Broman said he intends to race Antespend again. "It's a little late to breed her this year," he said. "My goal is to get her ready for Saratoga, if it's possible." Broman left open the possibility of racing the filly next year, "It all depends on how she does this year. If you get her back to form, you might race her next year as a five-year-old." Broman had not decided on a trainer for the filly. Wednesday's top two-year-old was hip number 233, a bay Irish-bred filly by Caerleon out of the Baillamont mare Belize Tropical (Ire). The filly, consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent I, brought a final bid of \$475,000 from English bloodstock agent John Ferguson. Ferguson would not divulge the identity of his client "until I've got his permission to do so." The highest priced colt at yesterday's second session was hip number 163, a chestnut by Cure the Blues--Mended Heart, by Le Fabuleux. The colt, a half brother to GSW Tropicool (Carr de Naskra), was consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent for Bailey-Ellenberg Select and brought a final bid of \$325,000 from John Kimmel, agent for Robert Waxman. "He'll probably go to Florida for two or three weeks of letting down from the sale," Kimmel revealed. "He'll start back and I expect him to come to New York some time in June. We don't think of him as a precocious two-year-old type, but we hope he's around this time as a three-year-old looking at the classic picture." Kimmel will train the colt. In all at the two-day sale, 135 horses were sold for \$12,999,000. That is down nine percent from last year's total of \$14,305,000 when 124 horses were sold. The 1997 average was \$96,289--down 16.5 percent from last vear's average of \$115,363.

LONE STAR PARK OPENS FOR INAUGURAL

MEET TODAY The eyes of Texas, and the entire Thoroughbred racing industry, will turn to the Dallas-Fort Worth area today as Texas's newest racetrack, the \$96 million Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, kicks off its inaugural 73-day stand. Gates open at 1 p.m., with ribbon-cutting ceremonies scheduled for 3:30 p.m.; post time for the first race at the track, the \$50,000 Premier S., is 5 p.m. The lucrative stakes schedule, which offers 27 races worth a total of \$2,875,000, has already attracted attention; it has also attracted the first Eclipse Award winner to race in the state of Texas. Last year's champion three-year-old colt Skip Away (Skip Trial) will make his next start in the \$250,000 Texas Mile at Lone Star Sunday, April 20. Also featured on Sunday's card will be the \$250,000 Lone Star Derby; both races will be televised live on ESPN. The first-ever Lone Star season runs through July 27, with racing Thursdays through Sundays. Post time will be 6:35 p.m. weekdays and 1:35 p.m. weekends.

SMOKIN MEL DOUBTFUL FOR DERBY GII Gotham S. winner Smokin Mel (Phone Order), third in the GII Wood Memorial last Saturday, suffered a quarter crack the day before the Wood, and the injury may cause the colt to miss the GI Kentucky Derby May 3. "The foot is a little warm and it is still a little sensitive around the coronet band where the crack broke through," said trainer John DeStefano. "We'll make a final decision over the weekend. Right now, we're probably leaning toward the Illinois Derby (GII, May 10)." Ian McKinlay, a New Jersey veterinarian who specializes in treating quarter cracks and other hoof injuries, is ex-

pected to patch the colt's foot today.

TATTERSALLS BREEZE-UP SALE SETS NEW STANDARDS The 1997 Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket, England concluded Wednesday with 141 two-year-olds selling during the two-day auction for a gross of \$3,668,962 and an average of \$26,020. The gross was up 44.3 percent from last year's \$2,542,812, and the average rose 28.9 percent from \$20,180 in 1996. Wednesday's high price of \$124,121 was paid by C.B.A. Ltd. for a bay colt by Persian Bold--Cellophane (Coquelin). The colt was consigned by Mocklershill Stables, Ireland, agent for Browne Bloodstock Enterprises. Tattersalls Marketing Director Andrew Howland said, "This has been a great way to kick off our 1997 sales. There have been new records set in every department of the Breeze-Up Sale, including the highest prices ever for Breeze-Up horses in Britain--71,000 guineas (\$119,089) for the Kris colt out of My Sister Ellen fol-

lowed by 74,000 guineas for the Persian Bold colt."
