LONE STAR PARK BREAKS "SHARP" The crowd whooped, the gates snapped open and they were off and running under a cloudless sky vesterday at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie. When the dust settled after the first race at Texas's newest Class 1 racetrack, it was 49-1 I Are Sharp (Timeless Moment) standing in the winner's circle for owners Henry White and Hugh Fitzsimmons, first in the aptly named Premier S. "I think we're going to have a lot of fun here," said K.C. Woiciechowski, the leading trainer after the first. "I know I am today." Full fields, compliments of a barn area boasting 1,358 inhabitants, a grandstand filled to capacity and racing fans overflowing with enthusiasm were the order of the day. Betting lines stood 12-deep at every window; the 48 luxury boxes were sold out long before opening day. There were five helicopters, not to mention a small plane or two, circling with the runners for the first race. "Sixty years ago, and less than five miles from this very location, racing fans in Texas enjoyed and supported the sport of major-league horse racing. Arlington Downs was considered to be one of the top tracks in the country. It's been a long wait, but we're back," said Lone Star President Bob Kaminski. "No one person or group can claim credit for the opening of this track today. It's truly a joint effort. But I can attest that it never would have happened if it had not been for a unified effort in search of a common goal." Total on-track handle, including betting on both the live card and simulcast signals, was over \$825,000 through the first three races. "I would have been disappointed if we hadn't done \$800,000 for the day--we've already done more than that," said General Manager Corey Johnsen. Voicing the prevailing opening-day opinion, he added, "This is exciting, it's gratifying and it's moving." Quick out of the gate, Lone Star Park is moving in the right direction.

BLACK TIE AFFAIR DRAWS JAPANESE

INTEREST Vinery has declined a "substantial" offer from a Japanese group for Black Tie Affair (Ire), according to Ben Walden Jr., the owner of the Midway, Kentucky farm. Black Tie Affair, the leading third-crop sire and currently 10th on the general sire list, is owned by Vinery and Jeff Sullivan, who campaigned the 1991 Champion Older Horse and Horse of the Year. "We received a substantial offer," said Walden. "My understanding is that there are three major groups in Japan which have shown an interest in the horse, and we have received one offer from one group. We feel confident that we're going to keep the horse and march on. We feel strongly about Black Tie Affair's current stature within the industry as well as his potential position in the industry in the long run. We think it's pretty incredible he's the 10th-leading sire on the general list with just two crops and he's just beginning to make an impact on the whole as a stallion." But while Walden said they were `reluctant' to sell the stallion, "the numbers are getting steep enough to consider it. We are businessmen, and there is a point at which we would have to weaken. At this stage, however, we are bold enough to feel the horse is secure in this country. We're proud to have him at Vinery."
