## KENTUCKY DERBY UPDATE

### LONE STAR OPENING NIGHT EXCEEDS

**EXPECTATIONS** Final figures are in for the first-ever live racing card at Lone Star Park at Grand Prairie, held Thursday night. Opening night attendance numbered 21,754, and fans on track wagered \$1,435,274 on the nine live Lone Star races. They bet an additional \$547,800 on the simulcasts Lone Star took--which included Santa Anita and Keeneland. Lone Star's opening night signal was sent to over 200 simulcast outlets nationwide, with \$2,731,892 bet on the card. The track's General Manager Corey Johnson said, "We were very encouraged by the level of the mutuel handle. Our goal is to present world-class racing and without the proper handle to support it, it's impossible. The fact that there was a handle greater than \$1.9 million within our facility yesterday is extremely encouraging. Usually an opening day has a low handle. With new employees, new fans and a new building it's difficult to be very efficient. The crowd was much greater than I expected for a Thursday opening day. I think everybody had a good time."

### GLITTERMAN FILLIES SHINE AT OBS

Glitterman fillies posted the fastest eighth and quarter mile works Friday during the second session of the four-day Under-Tack Show for the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's annual April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Hip 540, a Glitterman filly out of Make the Cut (Cutlass) who sells Wednesday as property of Michael Yates, agent, recorded the fastest eighth-mile, stopping the timer in :10 2/5. Another Glitterman filly, Hip 335 out of Flight to Rome (Storm Bird), shared honors for the fastest quarter-mile breeze of the session. The Tattenham Corner consignee covered the distance in :22 flat--the identical time posted by Hip 496, a filly by Fight Over--Let's Be Exclusive (Exclusive Era) from the consignment of Briar Lane Farm. Hip 434, a colt by Robyn Dancer--Island Capitol (Manila) consigned by Farnsworth Farms, agent, had the fastest three-furlong drill Friday, going the distance in :35. The Under-Tack Show's third session gets underway this morning at 9 a.m. and continues with a final session Sunday morning. The OBS April sale begins Monday, April 21 and runs through Thursday, April 24.

### Saturday, May 3, Churchill Downs:

#### KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 1 1/4m

Trainer Nick Zito reported Friday that Corey Nakatani will ride GII Toyota Blue Grass runner-up **Acceptable** (Capote) in the Kentucky Derby.

Dogwood Stable's **Jack Flash** (Sovereign Dancer) will skip the GIII Derby Trial at Churchill Downs April 26 and instead train up to the Kentucky Derby, reports Dogwood President W. Cothran "Cot" Campbell. Regular rider Craig Perret will be aboard the GII Jim Beam runner-up in the Run for the Roses.

A hoof injury has caused GIII El Camino Real Derby winner **Pacificbounty** (Pirate's Bounty) to miss another day of training at Churchill Downs. The colt jogged Thursday in his first trip to the track since grabbing a quarter while finishing third in the GII Arkansas Derby April 12. He suffered a nasty cut on the fleshy bulb of his right front hoof when he nicked himself with his rear hoof at the start of the Oaklawn Park race. "We cut into his foot a little bit yesterday and it was a little tender," said assistant trainer Dean Greenman Friday. "I didn't want to get any dirt and stuff in it. So he's got one day off." Greenman said Pacificbounty will return to the track for a jog today, and that his status for the May 3 Kentucky Derby is being evaluated day-to-day.

Darrell Yates, owner of GII Arkansas Derby and GIII Louisiana Derby winner **Crypto Star** (Cryptoclearance), has received several big-money offers to buy his Kentucky Derby hopeful--including one in the \$3 million range. But Yates, a Chicago construction executive, rejected the offers, much to the delight of Crypto Star's trainer Wayne Catalano. "I wasn't in control of that; I don't own the horse," Catalano said. "But we're all here to have the big horse. You know, money's all nice, but what are you going to do with it?"

Canada's 1996 Champion Sprinter **Langfuhr** (Danzig) will make his 1997 debut in this Sunday's seven-furlong Vigil H. (GIIIC) at Woodbine, but if trainer Mike Keogh was looking for an easy spot for the GI winner's seasonal bow, he didn't find it there. Trainer Barbara Minshall has also entered **Kiridashi** (Bold Ruckus), a MSW of over \$800,000 who took the April 5 Jacques Cartier S. (GIIIC) by four lengths in his first start of '97. Langfuhr hasn't raced since finishing eighth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint last Oct. 26 at Woodbine. "They have a big fitness edge," conceded Keogh. "I've missed three works with Langfuhr and I'm worried I might not have him 100 percent tight."

Dance Parade, winner of the G3 Queen Mary S. at Ascot last June, tracked pacesetter Well Warned in the early going, then took command inside the final furlong to win her three-year-old debut. "She must be a probable for the 1000 Guineas (May 4), but she is also in the French equivalent (Poule d'Essai des Pouliches) a week later," said winning trainer Paul Cole. "I will discuss it with Prince Fahd Salman before we make a decision." The 2-5 favorite **SLEEPYTIME (IRE)** (Royal Academy) raced evenly to be fourth. Sleepytime's jockey and trainer disagreed over her effort. Trainer Henry Cecil said, "This was very disappointing. She couldn't get out, but when she did, it was hopeless. We have not made any future plans for her yet." Jockey Kieran Fallon, on the other hand, stated, "If she had got out earlier, she would have won. She made up five lengths in a couple of strides."

The Michael Stoute-trained colt, successful in two of his three starts as a juvenile, booked his ticket when working easily over five furlongs at Newmarket Thursday. "We are thinking of going straight to the Guineas with him," said Stoute. "It wasn't a strong work, but we thought it would be a useful exercise." Entrepreneur's 1000 Guineas-bound stablemate **Dazzle (GB)** (Gone West), partnered by her likely big-race jockey Walter Swinburn, had a similar workout in preparation for the one-mile fillies' Classic May 4.
