ATTICUS RETIRED Atticus (Nureyev), who set the mile world record time of 1:31.89 in the March 1 Gll Arcadia H. suffered a chip fracture of his right front sesamoid bone and will be retired to stud, according to trainer Richard Mandella. "He came out of his Friday work walking a little funny," Mandella said. "We examined him and found the chip fracture in his inside right forelimb. It's really too bad--it looked like he had a bright future ahead of him." Atticus retires with a record of seven wins, three seconds, one third and earnings of \$1,200,120 in 18 starts. In his final start, the five-year-old chestnut won the April 5 Gl Oaklawn H. Stud plans for Atticus have not been finalized. "The owners are talking with a few farms in Kentucky," Mandella said. "It's still up in the air as far as to where he'll stand."

WINNING COLORS FOAL DIES A foal by Kentucky Derby winners Unbridled and Winning Colors died during a difficult birth at Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, according to the Associated Press. Winning Colors, who in 1988 became only the third filly to wear the roses, is doing fine and probably will be bred to one of Gainesway's stallions in about a month, the farm's sales director Michael Herndon said. The foal, born last weekend, would have been the first with two Kentucky Derby-winning parents. The last attempt to breed two Kentucky Derby winners was in 1982, when 1980 winner Genuine Risk retired from racing. Her first mating was with 1973 Triple Crown winner Secretariat, but the colt was stillborn. Winning Colors has given birth to six healthy foals, including a winner in France and one in Japan. The 1990 Derby winner, Unbridled stood at stud at Gainesway before being sold to Claiborne Farm last year. Among his first crop of offspring were Grindstone, last year's Kentucky Derby winner and Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Unbridled's Song.

Churchill Downs, Saturday, May 3: KENTUCKY DERBY-GI, \$1,000,000, 3yo, 10f

Captain Bodgit (Saint Ballado) worked a half-mile in :47 1/5 Wednesday morning over a fast Churchill Downs track with regular exercise rider Sam Davis up. Clockers caught the first quarter in :23 3/5, the three-eighths in :35 2/5 and a five-furlong out time in :59 4/5. The move was the fastest of 43 half-mile works.

Celtic Warrior (Fast Play) worked five furlongs yesterday in 1:04 4/5 with Derby rider Francisco Torres up. "He always works slow," trainer Danny Hutt commented after the work. "Cisco liked it and that's all that concerns me."

Dogwood Stable's **Jack Flash** (Sovereign Dancer) was scheduled to arrive at Churchill Downs from Keeneland at noon yesterday. The Nick Zito trainee is scheduled to work six furlongs in company Monday.

Pacificbounty (Pirate's Bounty) continues to recover from a cut to his right front foot sustained during the Arkansas Derby. "It looks like the foot is toughening up," trainer Walter Greenman reported after his colt returned from a 1 1/4-mile gallop yesterday morning. "He will work either Monday or Tuesday and go three-quarters and he would probably work in the bar shoe. He won't race with it."

ANOTHER GLITTERMAN FILLY TOPS OBS For the second straight session, a filly by Glitterman brought the highest price of the day at the third session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's annual April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Hip number 540, a bay filly by Glitterman consigned by Michael Yates, agent brought a final bid of \$125,000 from Cecil Seaman. The first foal of stakes-placed Make the Cut (Cutlass) breezed in :10 2/5, co-fastest eighth-mile work of the sale. The third session of the April sale saw 151 horses sell for a gross of \$2,614,200, compared to \$2,236,500 grossed by 161 horses in the third session of the 1996 sale. The average price of \$17,313 represented an increase of 24.6 percent over 1996's \$13,891. "I'm delighted the market remained strong for the third straight day," said Tom Ventura, OBS Director of Sales. "Especially in view of the threatening weather conditions. We literally weathered the storm today and look forward to finishing strongly tomorrow." The final session of the sale gets underway today at 11 a.m.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS...

The three-year-old classic scene gained an exciting newcomer when Touch Gold (c, 3, Deputy Minister--Passing Mood, by Buckpasser) stormed home eight and a half lengths clear in the GII Lexington S. on Sunday. Touch Gold, who will miss the Kentucky Derby but might well be seen in the Preakness, certainly has the breeding for the job. He is a half-brother to Canadian Triple Crown winner With Approval and two other stakes-winners and is a full brother to 1996 Canadian Grade I winner Daijin. Touch Gold also has a very interesting pedigree pattern with Northern Dancer 3x3 through Deputy Minister's sire Vice Regent and Touch Gold's second dam Cool Mood. This is backed with a double of La Troienne through a son (Bimelech) and a daughter (Bimelech's five-eighths relative, Businesslike). Incidentally, although we haven't sighted a Deputy Minister graded stakes-winner inbred to Northern Dancer through sons. Touch Gold is the fourth by the sire to be inbred to Northern Dancer through a son and a daughter. The reverse of the Touch Gold cross also came up with a major winner over the weekend. This was Thesaurus (c, 3, With Approval--Written Word, by Vice Regent), who is inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer and who took the GIII Forerunner S.

There are few more successful owner/breeders than the Wildenstein family, which unleashed a formidable French Derby contender in the shape of Peintre Celebre (c, 3, Nureyev--Peinture Bleue, by Alydar), who showed a sparkling turn of foot to claim the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Longchamp Sunday. Peintre Celebre comes from a strong--and pretty stout--female line. The dam scored in listed company in France before coming to the U.S., where she captured the GII Long Island H. The granddam Petroleuse is a dual listed winner in England and is a half-sister to Pawneese, Horse of the Year in Europe at three after a season in which she annexed both the English and French Oaks before going on to defeat older males in the King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S.

The success of Pleasant Colony with mares by Northfields has been nothing short of phenomenal. From the six foals out of Northfields mares which we can trace, Pleasant Colony has sired four stakes-winners, including the brothers St. Jovite and Lac Ouimet and the \$500,000 earner Stellarina. The cross has extended another generation in the GII Black Helen H. winner Powder Bowl (m, 5, Pleasant Colony--Snowbowl, by Northiet), whose broodmare sire is a son of Northfields. We should be careful about giving all the credit to the Northfields cross in this instance, as there is an interesting cross on the bottom of the pedigree too. Pleasant Colony's dam is by a son of Nasrullah out of a mare by a son of Double Jay. Powder Bowl's granddam, the Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Queen Empress, is by a son of Nasrullah out of a mare by Double Jay.

One of the most consistently successful crosses around is that of Sadler's Wells with mares carrying

Never Bend (a combination which gives a double of the mare Lalun, dam of both Never Bend and Sadler's Wells's maternal grandsire Bold Reason), with such as Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe victor Carnegie, Breeders' Cup Turf Classic winner In the Wings, and classic winner Moonshell. The latest off the line is Casey Tibbs (Ire) (c, 3, Sadler's Wells--Fleur Royale {Ire}, by Mill Reef), who won the Ballysax S., an Irish Derby trial, on Saturday.

Reversing a proven affinity can often pay dividends. Take for example this weekend's G2 Italian 1000 Guineas winner Nicole Pharly (GB) (f, 3, Pharly {Fr}--Debbie Harry, by Alleged). One of the best runners sired by the Alleged stallion Law Society was Approach the Bench, who was out of a mare by Pharly. So, when searching for a mate for Law Society's three-parts sister Debbie Harry, what could be more logical than to send her to Pharly?
