BLUSHING K.D. KO'S KENTUCKY OAKS

FIELD Looking for her fifth straight win since suffering her lone career defeat in a six-furlong Fair Grounds allowance back on January 19, **Blushing K. D.** (Blushing John) stormed down the stretch under stormy skies at Churchill Downs to take yesterday's GI \$584,700 Kentucky Oaks by 2 1/2 lengths. The crowd's 5-2 second choice, who ran her two-turn record to a perfect five-for-five with the score, sat just off the moderate fractions of **Sharp Cat** (Storm Cat) through six furlongs in 1:11 4/5, but powered to the lead on the far turn and strode away from her rivals to easily hold the late-closing **Tomisue's Delight** (A.P. Indy) safe. "I was a little worried when she went after Sharp Cat so early," said winning trainer Sam David Jr. "But once she got ahead, I knew she'd be tough to run down. She's got a huge heart. I've thought and said all along that she was one of the best fillies in the country, but I guess we had to come here to prove it. This is the biggest win of my career." Sharp Cat, who crossed the finish line third after setting the pace, made a right turn under a left-handed whip near midstretch, bumping **Majestical Moment** (Magesterial) (placed fourth) into the 7-5 favorite **Glitter Woman** (Glitterman); she was disqualified and placed eighth. "I think with all that was going on there--the lightning and stuff--she got a little excited," said her rider, Corey Nakatani. "I think she displaced her palate, too, because at the half-mile pole I had a ton of horse and then she made a big noise and that was it." The crowd's choice after sparkling in four successive stakes scores including the GI Ashland S. last out, **Glitter Woman** was off slowly, moved into contention on the far turn, but had little left for the drive and ended up eighth after being bumped near the final furlong; she was placed seventh. "We had too much to do after getting left like we did," said jockey Mike Smith. "We spotted the field 10 lengths; she's such a competitive filly, she tried to make up the 10 lengths with every jump. You can't do that." (*Kentucky Oaks chart, p2*)

*Sharp Cat finished 3rd but was DQ'ed and placed 8th. Blushing K.D. hails from humble beginnings, breaking her maiden at Louisiana Downs last August and getting her first stakes win over that track in the Princess Futurity in her only other start at two in September. Beaten into fifth by colts in a six-furlong Fair Grounds allowance in her return to action January 19, the Foxfield-bred filly then stretched out to two turns and has been flawless since, reeling off a 20-length romp over the boys in a restricted Fair Grounds stakes and three straight over fillies, most recently galloping home by six lengths in the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn April 6. Stepping up to the highest level here, the chestnut miss left the others red in the face, sweeping to the front a quarter-mile from home and drawing away to a decisive score. "I wasn't surprised; she's been great right from the start," said winning jockey Lonnie Meche, aboard for every one of this filly's starts. Tomisue's Delight, already second to "K.D." twice this year, had to settle for the runner-up spot once again, making up a ton of ground after trailing early to outfinish pacesetter Sharp Cat for the place.

Outsider **Crimson Classic** (Sky Classic) blew out for the race yesterday morning, going three-eighths in 37 3/5...**Hello (Ire)** (Lycius) stretched his legs a quarter-mile Friday with new rider Mike Smith in the irons for the first time. "I was glad Mike was here to get up on him," said trainer Ron McAnally. "He was able to get a little familiar with him."...**Phantom On Tour** (Tour d'Or) came back from Thursday's breeze in good order and is right on schedule for the Derby. "He looked good this morning and he is not showing me any negative signs," said trainer Lynn Whiting, who took the '92 Derby with Lil E. Tee.

Revoque (Ire), champion European juvenile last year, was beaten by Yalaletanee (GB) in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury on his only previous start this year when needing the run. He should improve; the bookmakers definitely think he will. Co-favorite Entrepreneur (GB) won only a maiden race last season and has not started this year, but is reported to be working well for his return. Godolphin's Shamikh (GB), in from Dubai, has also only won a maiden and makes his first start this year, but is said to be training better than Godolphin's 1996 2000 Guineas winner Mark Of Esteem (GB). All runners carry 126 pounds.

Halo America won the Mar. 23 Gill Oaklawn Park Breeders' Cup H. and the Apr. 11 GI Apple Blossom H., both at Oaklawn and both by four lengths; she made it three consecutive graded stakes victories here. The favorite set the pace under a clear lead and then opened up the margin in the stretch. "She left a little tardy, but that didn't hurt her because there wasn't much speed in the field," said winning jockey Calvin Borel. "She was tons the best. She'll go as far as she can as fast as she can, and she could have won by more." Added trainer Bobby Barnett, "When she was three in front, she was real pretty, wasn't she? Mr. Franks always asks how she comes back, and as long as she comes back in fine shape, she'll stay in training." The veteran racemare could make her next start in the Gill Pimlico Distaff May 17. GSW Escena, the 3-1 second choice, broke slowly, swung out wide at the top of the stretch to challenge but couldn't make up ground on the winner in the stretch while clearly second best.
